ought women to vote? A LONG DISCUSSION IN THE OTTAWA HOUSE.

Mr. John Macdonald the Ladies' Friend.—The Decision Left to Members.—Mr. Charlton Thinks the Party Lack in Order.

OTTAWA, April 27.—Mr. Gray, the new member for Levis, was introduced by Messrs. Blake and Langelier. Some private bills advanced a stage, after which the house went into committee on the franchise bill.

Mr. Tolson moved to strike out the female franchise clause. Sir John Macdonald said he was strongly in favor of the principle of granting suffrage to females, both married and unmarried, but as laws were enacted for the protection of their property, he had thought it wise to commence by enfranchising those only who held property that would not otherwise be represented. He had hoped Canada would be the first nation to adopt this measure of justice to women, and thus lead the way in the case of emancipation of women. The government were anxious to have this bill become law this session, and as many members would not make this a party question but allow each one to vote as he deemed best, he thought it did not necessarily follow that because women were made electors they should also have the right to hold office. The strongest argument used against the female franchise was that in the case of the husband and wife being of different political faiths it might create family discord, but it had been found that a difference of religion had existed and still harmony was not disturbed. He thought it wise to advance slowly. If it is found that granting the franchise to unmarried females is a success they could extend it to the married class. If it were not a success, it would be a block to any further extension in that direction.

Mr. Cameron said the well represented wishes of the people of Quebec were against female suffrage. Mr. Charlton favored giving the franchise to all females and thought if any class were to be left out it should be the married class who had assumed duties and responsibilities far in excess of those which remained single. Mr. Royal opposed the franchise to unmarried females. Mr. Shakespear strongly supported female franchise. Mr. Mills thought the proposition a most important one, and should be discussed by every member who was due in the country. It should be fully discussed before being either adopted or rejected. He thought the doctors should be allowed to stand in the way of the franchise to women on the lines laid down in the bill. "DOZ TERRIBLE 'BLUFF'"

The Poker Mania in Washington—It breaks the Diplomatic Corps all up. What a fascination the great American game of poker has for the foreigner. The chief, and about the only, business of the American secretaries in Washington is to teach them poker and play with them. Turks, Franks, Spaniards, Indians, Ethiopians, Dutch, Italians, Muscovites, Mongolians, all yield to the fascinations of the American game, and the poker-playing among the foreign legations is high and fast and furious. They are made to pay pretty dearly for their experience, and some of the smart American officials pluck the gentle foreigners most unmercifully. The head of a government bureau showed me a big roll of bills the other night, and said, "There's \$200 I win to-night from So-and-so," naming a moon-faced Mongolian minister, who goes about the city in a flowing robe of peacock blue and royal purple. The terrible thing about this soul-destroying game for the unsophisticated foreigners is the "bluff."
