STICTION'S BRUTAL INDICTMENT. SENATOR BERNIER DEFENDS THE MANITOBA MINORITY. The Former Superintendent of Catholic Schools in Manitoba Denies the Charges of Inefficiency and Opposes the Proposal for a Commission—National Only

New York, June 25.—Senator Bernier, former Superintendent of Catholic Schools in Manitoba, spoke for over three hours to-day to show that the charges of inefficiency of the Separate schools were not correct.

When I got to Cuba, and with a corps of competent engineers, began operations on the Spanish forts and cities. I need make no secret of this matter. The resources at our command are so ample that we know pretty well what we can do.
