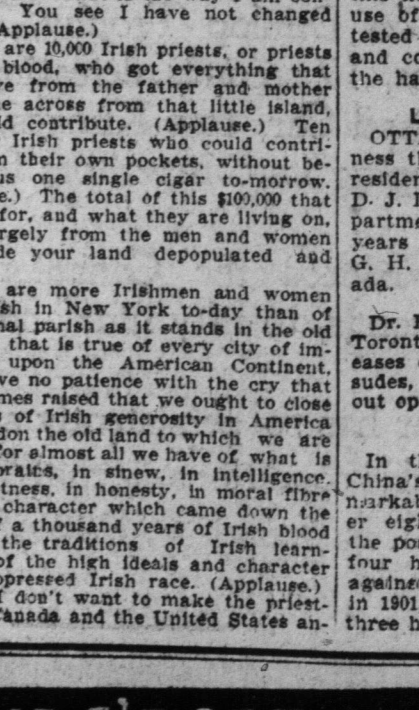
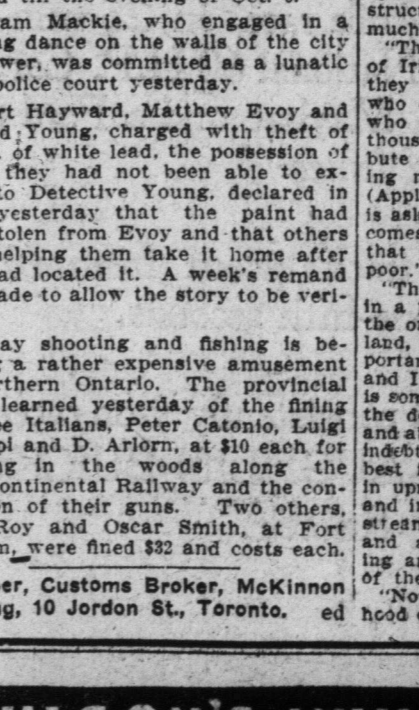

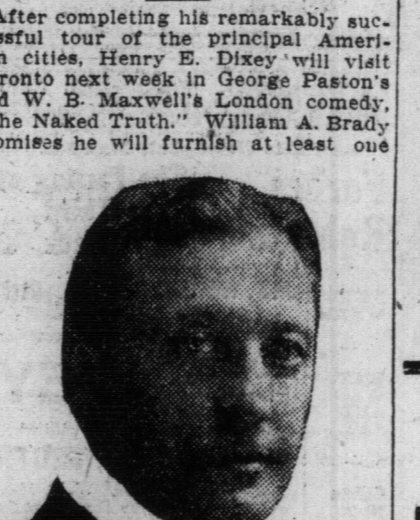
ADVISES THE FRENCH TO BOYCOTT ENGLISH BANKS

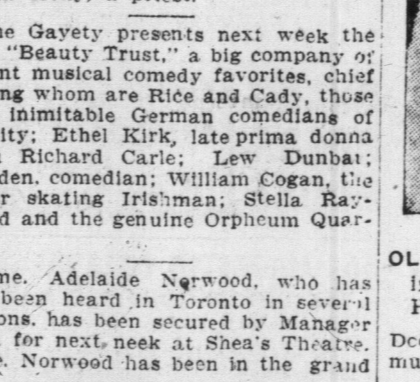
