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But they do not profess to be able to predict what the history of Imperial relations would be if preferential trade were defeated in England. There they must consider, not what they desire, but what is likely to happen. The commercial policy of the United States has helped the cause of Imperialism in Canada.

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like people who mean business. The members of the Joint High Commission "must be impressed with the conviction that the commission must make a treaty," then members of Congress must be pressed to support it. "A great market is growing up north of the great lakes and the St. Lawrence, and we should go after it."

This is the point to be considered. It is not a question of Canadians or other colonies resenting the defeat of preferential trade, but a question whether, if it is defeated, their energy and ambition may gradually be turned in other directions. The World thinks it may fairly claim to know something of this danger, for it was the vigorous opponent of reciprocity with the United States in the fight that ended in 1891. We perceive a new danger in the fact that the American advocates of reciprocity have learned wisdom; and if the Chamberlain proposals are defeated the battle may have to be fought again.

## DISCUSSING THE UNFORTUNATES.

The sixth Canadian conference on charities and correction, to be held at Ottawa on Sept. 29 and two following days, will be an important meeting. The discussion will include the cases of all those who become a charge on the public by reason of crime, affliction or misfortune of any kind.

The subject of the poor, the saving of neglected and dependent children, treatment and reformation of juvenile offenders, prison reform and its related subjects, detention and cure of inebriates, charity organization, rescue work amongst women and girls, care and treatment of the feeble-minded, prevention and cure of tuberculosis.

Sir Louis Davies of the Supreme Court will preside over the meeting. Among those present will be Mr. E. T. Devine of New York, general secretary of the Charity Organization Society of that city, and a gentleman of continental reputation; Judge McDonald of Brockville, a former president, and Mr. J. J. Kelso, superintendent of the Department of Dependent and Neglected Children.

## BRITISH BY-ELECTIONS.

The defeat of the Conservative candidate in St. Andrew's Burghs by a majority of 36 will not appear as a remarkable result. It is remembered that the Conservative majority has been declining since 1886. In that year Sir Thomas Brassey, the Liberal candidate, was defeated by 416. In 1892 it was 190, and in 1900 only 54.

There is nothing surprising, however, in the free traders winning victories in this stage of the war. Mr. Chamberlain admits that the country is free trade at present; and he leaves the cabinet with the purpose of being free to carry on a campaign of education. The resignation of free traders from the ministry is another indication that there is a stiff fight ahead of the protectionists. Only those who allowed their hopes to run away with their judgment could expect anything else.

## CHAMBERLAIN'S MOVE.

Whatever may be the immediate result of Mr. Chamberlain's propaganda, it cannot fail of ultimate importance. It will have an effect on the value of the pound. More especially it will effectively remove the fetter of free trade from the list of unquestionable and exclusive political duties. For a generation and more it has held the field as an ark of national safety which no unhalloved hand might touch under pain of immediate and complete extinction.
