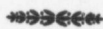

ELDERS' DISTRICTS.

The Congregation is divided into sixteen districts, and each Elder has a district assigned to him for visitation.

The limits of the districts are arranged to run from centre to centre of streets named.

District No. 1.—Mr. F. P. Bronson : Hintonburgh, Bayswater, Wellington Street west of Pooley's Bridge, Le Breton Flats, Victoria Island and Hull.

District No. 2.—Mr. Gemmill : From Sparks Street Northward to the Ottawa River, and from Pooley's Bridge Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 3.—Hon. E. H. Bronson : From Concession Street Westward to Hintonburgh (not inclusive), and from Richmond Road and Wellington Street (not inclusive) Southward to the Experimental Farm (inclusive).

District No. 4.—Mr. Wyld : From Concession Street Eastward to Bay Street, and from Sparks Street Southward to Isabella Street.

District No. 5.—Mr. May : From Bay Street Eastward to Bank Street, and from Sparks Street Southward to Maria Street.

District No. 6.—Mr. Allan : From Maria Street Southward to McLaren Street, and from Bay Street Eastward to Bank Street.

District No. 7.—Prof. Macoun : From McLaren Street Southward to Isabella Street, and from Bay Street Eastward to Bank Street.

District No. 8.—Mr. Gibson : From Sparks Street Southward to Slater Street, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 9.—Dr. Gibson : From Slater Street Southward to Nepean Street, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 10.—Mr. Alexander : From Nepean Street Southward to Cooper, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 11.—Mr. Orme : From Cooper Street Southward to McLaren Street, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 12.—Mr. Chrysler : From McLaren Street Southward to McLeod Street, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 13.—Mr. Hamilton : From McLeod Street Southward to Billings' Bridge, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 14.—Mr. Larmonth : From Rideau Street Southward to Stewart Street, and from Canal Eastward to Janeville.

District No. 15.—Prof. Robertson : From Stewart Street Southward to Ann Street, and from the Canal Eastward to the Rideau River.

District No. 16.—Lt. - Col. MacPherson : From McKenzie Avenue Eastward to Cummings' Bridge, and from Rideau Street Northward to Rideau Hall and Sussex Street North.

PASTORAL LETTER.

To the Members and Adherents of St. Andrew's Church :

MY DEAR FRIENDS :—

At the close of another year, I desire to acknowledge the loyal support which you have given to the work of this Congregation. It is not possible to measure the exact results of Christian effort. But if any of you have been guided or cheered, if you have been fitted for a nobler discharge of life's duties, and for more effective service in the Church, to God be all the praise.

While a pastor cannot transfer his duties to others, it is hardly possible to overestimate the value of sympathetic aid on the part of his people. I have always been thankful for this, and I am thankful still.

The various Societies of the Church have maintained a good degree of vigour throughout the year, though there is room for further increase in their membership.

Your attendance at the Sunday morning services leaves little to be desired. It would encourage me if more of you were present at our Sunday evening service. While we welcome the large number of strangers who join our worship, it is natural to look, first of all, to the support of members of our own Congregation. May I hope for some improvement in this regard?

The Congregation is to be congratulated on the gradual extinction of the Church debt without any effort on its part. It would be a misfortune, however, if we allowed the Glebe property to make us careless in meeting our own needs and the needs of the Church in general. On the contrary, I am persuaded that the exceptionally easy circumstances in which we are placed will stimulate liberality in both directions.

The Glebe Church continues to grow under the able ministry of the Rev. Mr. Milne. The grant which we give it is lessened year by year, and at no very distant time, it is bound to become self-sustaining.

Having made several allusions from the pulpit to the stirring movements which are going on around us, it is not necessary that I should say much about them now. I believe that out of the sacrifice and sorrow of the war in South Africa, Canada will rise into a nobler life, feeling more strongly her own individuality, and at the same time being knit in closer bonds to the whole Empire.

The Century Fund which our Church has inaugurated must be looked upon as an epoch-making event in her history. The future of Presbyterianism in this Dominion depends, to some extent, upon the success of this great enterprise. It cannot but enlist our sympathies, and make us ready for self-denial in order to do our share in helping it forward. While we look to those who have wealth for substantial gifts, it is my earnest desire that every member of this Congregation shall be represented in some way in this monumental work.

Let us enter upon another year with new enthusiasm. We have many privileges, and many responsibilities. The voice of God calls us to more earnest Christian character, to wider usefulness, to stronger faith in Him, and to a more fervent charity towards all men. If we obey His call, our Church will become a growing power for good, and the Divine blessing will rest upon us.

“Now unto Him who is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen.”

KIRK SESSION REPORT.

The Kirk-Session submit the following statements touching the life and work of the Congregation during the past year.

The Session have pleasure in reporting that the attendance at the public services on the Lord's Day has been quite up to its usual high average, indicating that these attractive services are generally appreciated. The presence of so many at these stated times of public worship is the most encouraging feature in our Church life, and awakens the hope that, through the blessing of the Divine Spirit, the attendance on these means of grace may be followed with the best results, affording indications of increased spiritual life in our membership; manifesting its presence by Christ-like character, willing co-operation in Christian service, and in the uplifting to a higher plane of congregational life and privilege, the comparatively large number of our adherents who are not yet in full communion with the Church, but show their interest in its work by contributing, more or less generously to its funds, or participating in certain spheres of its operations, many of whom have such faith in our Lord Jesus Christ that they think and speak of Him with reverence, and regulate their conduct in life by His just and benign precepts, yet do not venture to participate, as they might, in the fuller fellowship of the Church, as well as in congregational work. These results are looked for with expectancy as the appropriate fruitage of a flourishing branch of the Christian Church, and the most satisfying test of its vitality.

The Sacrament of Baptism was administered to 11 infants and 1 adult in the past year.

The ordinance of the Lord's Supper was dispensed to the Congregation four times during the year. The average attendance at these communions was 236, being 30 less than that of the previous year. This decrease may be due to the unfavourable weather on two of these occasions; but, considering the number of our membership, and making due allowance for necessary absence, the average attendance should seldom fall under three hundred, and frequently reach the higher figure of three hundred and fifty.

Since last Annual Report the strength of the Congregation has been increased by the addition of several families, and the Session have welcomed to Church fellowship 36 new members, of these 17 were admitted on profession of faith, and 19 were received by certificate from other congregations. During the same time 24 were removed from the Communion Roll—8 by certificate, 7 by death, and 9 by action of the Session. The present membership numbers 581, being a net increase of 12 members in the past year. The names of the members are given in the closing pages of the Church Report. In looking over the list, the older members of the Congregation will miss the names of persons who had for many years hitherto appeared on the Roll, some of whom have been removed by certificate to join congregations nearer to their places of residence in the city, or with those in other parts of the Dominion, where they may still enjoy the fellowship of the Church, and, if so disposed, engage in its work. Others, having finished their earthly course, have been called away to the higher fellowship of the Church above. The Session would now extend to the bereaved relatives their sincere sympathy and prayerful solicitude for their spiritual comfort and consolation.

By reference to the Financial Statement of the Treasurer of the Session Fund it will be seen that the plate collections at the Sunday services of the past year were rather more than those of the previous year, the amount of the ordinary being \$2,243.43, and the special \$478.91.

The contributions through the medium of the Church schedules as per Treasurer's Statement, amount to the sum of \$3,386 76, out of which, and the balance over from the previous year, the following allocations have been made to the several objects named in the Schedule, viz. :—

The total amount thus allocated is \$335.00 less than was allocated to the same objects in the previous year. This decrease is probably due to the unusual number of calls that have, recently, been made on members of the Congregation for contributions to other worthy objects outside of the Schemes of the Church.

The above statement of contributions does not include the sums raised by the Home and Foreign Mission Societies of the Congregation. The results of their efforts on behalf of these objects appear in their respective reports. The Session have noticed with much satisfaction the enthusiastic manner in which the women of the Congregation have carried on these important branches of Church work.

The Session appreciate the assistance which the District Visitors have rendered; not only in the collection of contributions to the Schemes of the Church, but also by their good offices in visiting the families of the Congregation and reporting to the Pastor when cases of sickness, or other affliction, exist in their districts and require pastoral visitation.

The Ladies' Aid Society has also shown its usual zeal in promoting the welfare of the Congregation, as well as in ministering to the needs of the poor and supporting the benevolent institutions of the city. The details of its reported work in the past year gives evidence of its "continuance in well doing." The Session would also notice with approval the prompt and thoughtful action of the Society in taking the initiative in calling the Congregation together to congratulate the pastor on his having had the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity conferred on him by the Presbyterian College of Montreal, at which meeting the members of Session were present and gladly availed themselves of the opportunity which it afforded them of taking part in the congratulations extended to the Rev. Dr. Herridge, and in the presentation of the Pulpit Gown and Hood, which the Society had provided for the occasion.

The members of the Congregation will be pleased to learn that the Glebe Presbyterian Church, under the care of the Rev. Mr. Milne, has increased in membership and financial strength so that its office-bearers were enabled to intimate that they will only require from this Church a grant of \$300 toward the payment of

their minister's stipend for the current year, this being \$100 less than the grant of the past year. The Session on behalf of the Congregation have therefore promised to contribute the sum of \$300 toward the Rev. Mr. Milne's stipend for the year beginning 1st January, 1900.

The Session may state in regard to the Century Fund, which is now being raised by the Presbyterian Church in Canada, the claims of which have already been presented to the Congregation by the General Assembly's Agent of the Fund, the Rev. Dr. Campbell, who has also conferred with the Session and Temporal Committee, and arranged that the work of canvassing the members of the Congregation for subscriptions to the fund will be carried out by a Committee, of which the Hon. E. H. Bronson is Chairman, and Mr. Geo. L. Orme, Secretary. Some progress has already been made in securing subscriptions, and shortly the Congregation will be thoroughly canvassed, and it is confidently expected that liberal responses will be made to the solicitations of the Committee for further contributions to the Fund, and that all our members will give thereto as God has prospered them.

In view of the foregoing statements, and the expected favourable reports of the other office-bearers of the Church, the Session conclude that, on the whole, the life and work of the Congregation have been well sustained throughout the year, and especially marked by those evidences of prosperity and efficiency which, through the Divine favour, it has hitherto maintained as an auxiliary in the widely extended missionary and benevolent work in which the Presbyterian Church in Canada is so actively engaged.

ANNUAL MEETING.

Pursuant to notice read from the pulpit on the two preceding Sundays, the Annual General Meeting of the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church was held in the Sunday School Hall, this Monday evening, the 5th day of March, 1900, at 8 o'clock.

The meeting was opened with devotional exercises by Mr. Jas. Gibson.

On motion, Mr. L. Crannell was requested to act as Chairman, and Mr. J. W. McRae to act as Secretary, in the absence of Mr. G. S. May.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting held on the 6th March, 1899, were read and confirmed.

By-law No. 35 of the Temporal Committee was read by the Secretary.

By-Law No. 35.

A By-law of the Temporal Committee of St. Andrew's Church, in the City of Ottawa, in connection with the Church of Scotland :

NOW, THEREFORE, the said Temporal Committee of St. Andrew's Church, in the City of Ottawa, in connection with the Church of Scotland, doth hereby enact and ordain as follows :

THAT the Glebe Trustees of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa, be required, and they are hereby required and directed to pay to the said Temporal Committee of St. Andrew's Church, in the City of Ottawa, the sum of two thousand dollars, to be paid on the mortgage on the Manse, 293 Somerset Street, Ottawa.

AND that this By-law shall be sufficient authority to the said Glebe Trustees for payment of the said sum of money as aforesaid.

By-law No. 36 of the Temporal Committee was read by the Secretary.

By-Law No. 36.

A By-law of the Temporal Committee of St. Andrew's Church, in the City of Ottawa, in connection with the Church of Scotland :

NOW, THEREFORE, the said Temporal Committee of St. Andrew's Church, in the City of Ottawa, in connection with the Church of Scotland, doth hereby enact and ordain as follows :

THAT the Glebe Trustees of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa, be required, and they are hereby required and directed to pay to the said Temporal Committee of St. Andrew's Church, in the City of Ottawa, the sum of thirteen hundred dollars, to be applied for the payment on interest on the Church and expenses in connection with the Mission Church on the Glebe.

AND this By-law shall be sufficient authority to the said Glebe Trustees for payment of the said sum of money as aforesaid.

DONE and passed at the City of Ottawa, this first day of March, 1900.

At this stage of the Meeting Rev. Dr. Herridge entered, and took the Chair.

REPORTS.

Reports were received from Kirk Session, Schedule Fund, Temporal Committee, Glebe Trustees, Home Missionary, Foreign Missionary, Ladies' Aid Society, Poor Relief, Sunday School, and Ready Circle of King's Daughters with Financial Statements of each.

Moved by P. Larmonth, seconded by L. Crannell, That the reports read, including Financial Statements, be received and adopted—Carried.

Moved by Hon. E. H. Bronson, seconded by F. H. Chrysler, That the Temporal Committee be requested to furnish the Printing Committee with a statement, showing the details of their expenditure of the \$88,000 handed to them by order of the Congregation, by the Glebe Trustees, for publication in the Annual Report, as an appendix to the report of the Temporal Committee—Carried.

Moved by L. Crannell, seconded by G. Allen, That in view of the statement made to this meeting, that the Committee for the work of soliciting contributions for the Century Fund throughout the Congregation will probably consist of the Kirk Session, this meeting approve of the suggestion and will do whatever it may be able, in order to facilitate that important movement—Carried.

Moved by Hon. E. H. Bronson, seconded by Lt.-Col. MacPherson, That the Glebe Trustees be empowered to set apart such portions of the Glebe property under their control as in their judgment they may think proper for the use of the Associated Charities during the coming season—Carried.

Moved by F. H. Chrysler, seconded by F. P. Bronson, That Messrs. L. Crannell and C. C. Ray be nominated for the vacancies on the Temporal Committee, and Mr. Geo. Stockand for the vacancy on the Glebe Trustee Board, and, suspending all rules to the contrary, the Secretary be requested to cast a ballot for the election of the above-named—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Col. McPherson, seconded by L. Report of Glebe Trustees.

To the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa :

The Glebe Trustees of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa, beg to present the following report for the year ending 1st March, 1900 :

During the year payments have been regularly made upon the lots sold by the Trustees, and the total amount collected is the sum of \$8,146.05, of which \$6,851.50 have been paid on account of the principal arising from sales of property. Sixteen lots have been sold during the year, ten in Spenceville and six in the City of Ottawa, for the price of \$4,075. Lots in Spenceville have nearly all been sold. Sales in the City of Ottawa have not been numerous, as the delay in the construction of a system of drainage for the property has restricted the demand. With the progress now being made in the construction of drainage for the southern part of the City it is confidently expected that sales will be made in future to much better advantage.

The balance due on sales and mortgages is \$17,612.31, being about \$3,000 less than the amount at this date last year. \$5,000 has been paid to the Temporal Committee to reduce the balance due upon the mortgage upon the Church.

The Treasurer has compiled a statement of the amounts paid since the incorporation of the Glebe Trustees, for congregational purposes upon the requisition of the Temporal Committee, showing a total of such payments of \$88,016.42.

The number of lots remaining unsold in Spenceville is six, and in the city about 534. A statement of receipts and expenditure is submitted.

In submitting this, the twenty-seventh Annual Report of the Ladies' Aid Society, the Executive have to express both pleasure and regret, pleasure that the attendance at the meetings has been somewhat larger than that of last year, and regret that owing to a slowly decreasing revenue they have not been able to accomplish all they had planned to do at the beginning of this winter's session.

Nine regular and two special meetings have been held, with an average attendance of fourteen, being an increase of two over that of last year.

In October, Miss Gibson felt obliged to retire from the office of Secretary and Treasurer of the Poor Relief Committee, and Mrs. Geo. May was appointed to that office.

During the year, Mrs. Perkins, one of the oldest members of the Society, was removed by death. Her loss is deeply regretted, for she was one who always took an active interest in the welfare of the Society.

The amount received from the envelopes and other donations has been \$218.60.

The Society has made another payment of \$25.00 to the Perley Home for Incurables, and has also given \$25.00 to the Orphan's Home for the purchase of white quilts.

On the 7th of April last, the Society had the pleasure of presenting the Rev. Dr. Herridge with a pulpit gown and cassock on the occasion of his receiving the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity. Towards the expense of this gown the Society received donations from ladies not connected with the Society, to whom they would extend sincere thanks.

Twelfth Annual Report of the Home Missionary Society of St. Andrew's Church.

It becomes again our pleasing duty to give our hearers a condensed report of the year's work, and in doing so we gratefully acknowledge God's mercies to us during the year as individuals and as a Society, and we feel that the year has been a most successful one. The interest in the meetings here has assuredly grown, and never before has our Mission work been represented to us in such an interesting manner.

The meetings have been held regularly on the first Friday of the month, and have been well attended. After the usual business, the Missionary's letter is read, followed by the reading of papers, original or extracts, by a lady appointed for each month, and in some cases these have been so interesting that they were repeated.

The Thank-offering Meeting was held in April, and the sum of \$119.00 contributed.

At Christmas, two boxes of useful presents were sent out by the Society, and contained useful gifts of clothing, books and toys for the children, also a contribution of mitts and dressed dolls from "The Ready Circle of King's Daughters." These boxes were taken free of charge by an old friend of the Society, and were very gratefully acknowledged and had helped to gladden many hearts.

In January, a special effort was made to augment the funds of the Society, in the form of a Tea, at the residence of Mrs. W. G. Bronson, at which over sixty ladies were present, and the sum of \$51.00 raised. Papers were read by Mrs. Gullett and Mrs. L. McDougall, a song by Mrs. Gilbert Allan and a pianoforte solo by Mrs. C. Ross, refreshments were partaken of, a considerable balance of which was sent to the Orphans' Home.

In February, the sum of \$60.00 was sent to Dr. Robertson, and again in June, the sum of \$150.00 towards paying the Missionary's salary.

Looking back upon the work at Swan River, we find that the Rev. Mr. Johnson, who began work there in June, 1898, had con-

tinued until October, 1899, when he was obliged to resign, on account of ill health, and he is now taking a much needed rest in his old home in Nova Scotia, but hopes to resume his work in the spring, and on his return thither he has promised to remain over in Ottawa for the purpose of addressing this Society. His place has been filled by Mr. Kirkpatrick, a Student of Manitoba College, who had assisted Mr. Johnson during the summer, and thus was well acquainted with his work, and from whom monthly letters have been received.

The growth of the Swan River settlement had been quite phenomenal, the few tents of a year ago had given place to a large village, but the district is so extensive that it is difficult to organize Church work. As yet they had no church building, and services were held in an immigrant shed, but the railway was now running across the valley, and steps were being taken to secure a suitable church site. Mr. Johnson had opened up eight different centres for Church work, and owing to the wide distance apart, it had been necessary to divide the district into two, and Mr. Kirkpatrick had charge of the Thunder Hill portion. Mr. Johnson gave some graphic accounts of the difficulties experienced in reaching some of these preaching stations, fording rivers on very frail crafts, which gave way, and were rudely tied together with willow withes, and having to continue the journey utterly drenched. Such experiences had undermined his health, and would have tried the most rugged.

One sad accident had occurred to a family who had almost reached their destination. In fording the last stream, when the oxen were almost across, the wagon-box became detached and the oxen drifted down the stream, and the only daughter was drowned and her body recovered after three days' search, and buried near the door of the new home.

These and similar anecdotes shew us what hardships have to be undergone in opening up a new country, and should inspire us with renewed zeal to more diligent work in this corner of the Master's vineyard.

With the exception of July and August the meetings have been held regularly on the second Tuesday of each month, at four o'clock.

We have a membership of 30, seven of whom are life-members, with an average attendance of a little over 13. It is encouraging to be able to report a slight improvement in the attendance at these meetings.

Our work has gone on very quietly and uneventfully during the year, but the interest still keeps up, which is shown in a practical manner by our contributions.

The teaching staff at present consists of 19 ladies and 5 gentlemen. Two or three more teachers are urgently needed. Are there only five men in St. Andrew's Church who are willing to take a Sunday School class ?
