They seemed disposed to continue the concert all night, so it became necessary to disperse them, for sleeping in their neighbourhood was impossible. A torch of that most in dispensable and useful substance in the woods, birch bark, was lighted and placed on a long pole, with which the Indian marched out among the choristers; and one of my friends, en chemise et sans culottes, his toes thrust in a pair of moccasins, followed with his gun. By dint of thrusting the torch in the wondering faces of some, and firing at others, they were, after a time, but very reluctiantly, dispersed, and we slept quietly for the rest of the night.

So ended the first of several pleasant days in the woods, and the Indians have always since designated that night's resting place—The Camp of the Owfs.
