


Gallant Act of Her Husband, New Brunswick Soldier, Recalled - Another Mersereau in the Day's News





Austria New York, June 5—Take Jonesco, the former Roumanian minister of state, in-terviewed by a correspondent of the Cor-ricre della Sera, of Milan, on May 22, the day after lialy declared war on Aus-tria, said that two things, and only two, prevented Rumania, Bulgaria and Greece from joining in the conflict on the side of the Entente powers—these were the lack of ammunition and the fact that Greece still held off from granting cer-tain territory to Bulgaria. He said: "Greece and Bulgaria would probably come to an agreement if only the other balkan states have placed huge orders for ammunition abroad, particularly in America, but Russia, France and Eng-land appear to have contracted for everything in sight.
