



DURABILITY OF WOODS. Which of the species of woods is the most durable? To answer this question some interesting experi-ments have been made, and the following results were obtained : Birch howing results were obtained : birch and aspen decayed in three years, willow and horse-chestnut in four years, maple and red beech in five years, elm and ash in seven years; oak, Scottish fir, and Weymouth plue decayed to the depth of half an inch in seven years; larch and juniper were uninjured at the expiration of the seven years in situations so free from moisture that they may be ended practically dry, the dura-bility of timber is almost unlimited. 




