ANOTHER POWERFUL THRUST ON SOMME COMPLETE CAPTURE OF GINCHY VILLAGE

Attacking Along Front of 6,000 Yards from High Wood to Leuze Wood Take Whole Village of Ginchy and Advance Three Hundred Yards on Front of 500 East of High Wood.

ANOTHER GAIN OF 600 YARDS 2ND CANADIAN NORTHWEST OF POZIERES

London, Sept. 10.-In an attack along a front of about Athree and a half miles the British succeeded in occupying the whole of Ginchy and the territory between that village and Leuze Wood, according to the announcement from general headquarters last night, several other gains are also recorded. The text of the statement reads:

"We attacked this afternoon on a front of 6,000 yards, extending from High Wood to Leuze Wood. As a result the whole of Ginchy village is now in our hands, after severe fighting, and the ground between it and Leuze Wood was captured.

"East of High Wood we advanced three hundred yards on a front of five hundred yards. Numerous prisoners were taken and the enemy's casualtes were very heavy.

'Northeast of Pozieres we gained a further six hundred yards of German trenches and captured sixty prisoners, inflicting heavy casualties on the enemy who was caught by our artillery fire while massing for a counter-attack.

'Our artillery bombarded the enemy's trenches on Vimy Ridge, opposite Souchez. There was reciprocal artillery activity in the neighborhood of Calonne and Cinchy and between La Bassee Canal and Neuve Chappele.



Last year a book entitled Child ng, by V. M. Hillyer was published in the United States. Various reviews of this book have found their way into Canadian papers and maga-zines, but it is a book which should



may into Canadian papers and magasines, but it is a book which should be even more widely known.

The author is the head master of the Caivert School, a school which sends out courses of study to teach children in the home, if for some reason they cannot attend school.

The book has for its sub-title, "A system of education for the child under school age." Its key is common sense. Unlike so many books on child training, this volume regards the child as a reasonable human being, not as a sort of material to experiment upon.

The introduction says "The most important feature of this system is the formation of habits, physical mental and moral; the cultivation of desirable qualities and the development of powers by direct drill.

For instance there is an obedience drill, which the mother or teacher should give systematically until the child gets the habit of instant obedience. It is the obedience of solders and in obeying simple commands the pupils form invaluable habits.

The chapter on social training is splendid, and if properly followed would result in courteous children, such as it would be a delight to meet.

There are programmes given for a day with one child or children in the same family, which include physical training, social training, information, manual training, rhythmic arts, story-




