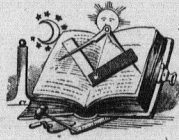

GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

The Most Worshipful Grand Master delivered the following address :

BRETHREN,—

Another year has swiftly passed since our last Communication, and we are again assembled at this the Thirteenth Annual Meeting of our Grand Lodge to devise and consider such measures as may be deemed necessary for the good government of the Craft within this jurisdiction.

It is our duty, humbly and reverently, to acknowledge the loving care and mercy of the Supreme Being for the manifold blessings which we individually have enjoyed, as

well as for the success which has attended our beloved Order.

During the past year I visited officially St. Johns Lodge, No. 1, and Victoria Lodge, No. 2, in Charlotte-town, and was much pleased with the work done by these Lodges.

I also had the pleasure, in company with R. W. Deputy Grand Master Neil McKelvie, of visiting Zetland Lodge, No. 7, Alberton, in January last. Bro. McKelvie examined their records and will include any remarks necessary in his report.

I appointed R. W. Bro. G. W. Wakeford to visit Orient Lodge, No. 11, in Souris, and I am glad to be able to report that chiefly through his efforts the Brethren of that Lodge determined to resume work. In consequence of the serious loss sustained by this Lodge in having the hall, with the furniture, clothing, books and property of every description owned by it, destroyed by fire, no work had been done for some time. On the application of P. M. Bro. Brownell, in January last I issued a dispensation authorizing the election and installation of officers. In April, in company with R. W. Bro. Wakeford and a number of Brethren from St. Johns and Victoria Lodges, I visited Orient Lodge. There was a large attendance, and I was much pleased to find that within so short a time the members of Orient Lodge had furnished a suitable Lodge room, and shewed every evidence of their intention to make progress and proficiency, and to make Orient Lodge hold its proper position notwithstanding its previous reverses.

I have issued commissions to the following Brethren as representatives of this Grand Lodge:—

Bro. H. G. McNeill near the Grand Lodge of Iowa, in place of Bro. McClanahan who has resigned owing to ill health.

I have recommended the following Brethren for appointment as representatives near this Grand Lodge:—

R. W. Bro. Ewen Stewart as representative of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in place of Bro. A. H. B. Macgowan, who has left this Province.

Bro. A. H. McPherson for re-appointment as the representative of the Grand Lodge of Michigan, that Grand Lodge having adopted the triennial system of representation.

Bro. John Grady as the representative of the Grand Lodge of South Carolina in place of Bro. T. H. Pope, who has removed from this jurisdiction.

I ask your approval of these appointments and recommendations.

I have granted two dispensations to confer the third degree at shorter intervals than required by our constitution as the brethren were unexpectedly obliged to leave the Province. I refused to grant two other dispensations for a similar purpose as no sufficient reasons accompanied the application.

I also granted a dispensation to the members of St. Johns and Victoria Lodges to attend, in Masonic clothing, a social meeting held by them in Masonic Hall, Charlottetown. I had the pleasure of being present with the officers of Grand Lodge on that occasion. The entertainment was a most successful one, and I feel sure, afforded an enjoyable and pleasant evening to the large number of persons who attended.

I have not been called upon for any decision during the year, which is, I think, good evidence that the Masters and officers of the Subordinate Lodges are well informed on the Constitution and Ancient land-marks of Masonry.

You will be glad to know that there has been an increase

in the membership of our Lodges during the past year, but will regret very much to find suspension for non-payment of dues still goes on.

Death has dealt lightly with us since our last annual meeting—only two members of Subordinate Lodges having, during that time, “gone to that bourne from which no traveller ere returns.” How thankful we ought to be to the Divine Creator for having dealt so mercifully with us, and for the healthy and bountiful season which we have enjoyed.

Before closing this account of my official acts during the past Masonic year I must again thank you for your continued confidence in retaining me in the high position I occupy. At all times, and upon all occasions I have received the most kindly courtesy and brotherly treatment from every member of the Fraternity I have met. I am under special obligations to the R. W. Bro. Higgs our efficient Grand Secretary, and to R. W. Bro. G. W. Wakeford for kind assistance repeatedly given.

And now my Brethren, I must ask you to relieve me from a position which many amongst you can fill much more ably than I have done. I feel sure a change will be beneficial to the Craft in this jurisdiction. From the nature of my private business, it has been in the past, and would be even more so in future, impossible to give the time which the good of the Order requires should be given by the Grand Master.

I trust my successor in office may receive the same generous treatment which you have invariably accorded to me.

Trusting that our present meeting may be characterized by that good feeling which has always existed amongst us, and that our deliberations may be governed by an anxious desire to keep unsullied the principles of our ancient and honored institution.

GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the M. W. Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island:

I have the honor to submit my Annual Account and Report for the year past.

Immediately after the closing of the last Annual Communication, I prepared the Minutes and had them printed and distributed as usual.

By order of the M. W. Grand Master, I have issued Commissions to the following Brethren appointing them Representatives of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island near Sister Grand Lodges:

Bro. E. T. C. Becker, near the Grand Lodge of Illinois.

Bro. H. G. McNeill, near the Grand Lodge of Iowa.

I have received a Commission appointing Bro. A. H. McPherson as the Representative of the Grand Lodge of Michigan, near the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island.

The following Dispensations have been issued by order of the M. W. Grand Master:

To Victoria and True Brothers Lodges to confer the third degree at a shorter interval than required by the Constitution.

Also, to St. Johns and Victoria Lodges to attend a Social in Regalia.

On the 24th of April I wrote to Bro. Alexander Hay of Edinburgh, to send me 100 Diplomas, as my supply was nearly exhausted, and on looking over the Grand Lodge proceedings of Scotland I was sorry to notice the death of Bro. Hay in March. On the formation of our Grand Lodge, Bro. Hay kindly offered to superintend the engraving of the plate for our Diplomas, and to hold the same and furnish Diplomas required. I have been expecting that his representative would receive my letter and answer it, but two months have now expired and I have heard nothing. It will be necessary to make arrangements with another party to take charge of the plate and forward our Diplomas. The Brethren who require Diplomas will have to wait until some arrangements are made.

I annex an Abstract of Returns from the Subordinate Lodges. Also, a Statement of moneys received, of which amount \$292.60 has been paid to the Grand Treasurer, leaving a balance in my hands of \$2.30.

I am glad to report an increase in numbers during the past year,—
35 Brethren have been raised, 24 admitted, 3 reinstated, making in all,
63 new members. Thirteen members have been suspended for N.P.D.,
11 demitted, 2 died. Four of these demitted affiliated again with
Lodges nearer their home. The actual number on the roll is 495.

R. W. Bro. Neil McKelvie, presented the following Report:

DEPUTY GRAND MASTER'S REPORT.

To the Most Worshipful the Grand Master and Officers of the Grand Lodge of F. & A. M. of P. E. Island.

On the 2nd of November, with Past Master Bro. D. Schurman, I visited Prince Edward Lodge, No. 14, Stanley Bridge, and had the opportunity of seeing the Fellow Craft Degree conferred. I was agreeably surprised to find such proficiency, situated as the Lodge is, in a country district. Great praise is due our to our R. W. Bro. Past Master McNeill for the way he has interested himself in introducing Masonry into this district.

On the 1st day of January in company with the M. W. Grand Master and Past Masters Ellis and Ramsay, I visited Zetland Lodge, No. 7, F. & A. M. The E. A. Degree was exemplified, and a candidate initiated. They have a fairly comfortable Hall, largely owned by themselves. I would strongly urge the necessity of having the Grand Lecturer or well informed Brethren visit the Lodge as often as possible, and assist them in acquiring a better knowledge of the work, and encourage them by frequent rehearsals.

On several occasions I have visited King Hiram Lodge, No. 3, Summerside. This Lodge has lately taken a fresh start. The present officers are young men, intelligent and full of vigor and zeal. The officers perform their duties now with an accuracy seldom met in this country. Books are carefully kept and Minutes intelligently written, and their funds invested with the care of a Banker.

Mount Lebanon Lodge, No. 6, F. & A. M., Summerside. This Lodge is keeping up to the times. The W. Master and officers are painstaking and zealous men. In the past year they have done no work, yet her funds are in a healthy condition. Books carefully kept, Hall rented, furniture kept insured.

On the 12th of June I had the pleasure, in company with P. Grand Lecturer Bro. Schurman, of visiting True Brothers Lodge, No. 8, F. & A. M., Tryon, but owing to the busy season, did not meet with a large number. The W. Master, Bro. Strang, is an ardent Mason, and appears to understand his work very well. Several of his officers appear well qualified. Their Books are well kept; moneys regularly paid over to Treasurer who places them in the Savings Bank. They have a very comfortable Lodge Room, well furnished.

Mount Zion Lodge, No. 12, Kensington. This Lodge continues in its usual flourishing condition. Officers well informed; books neatly and carefully kept; cash paid over promptly to the Treasurer, and deposited in the Savings Bank.

I would say, in closing, that I am sorry to find in all our Lodges a larger number of arrearages of dues than should exist, and would recommend greater care and diligence on the executive officers of our Lodges, which I think would obviate, in a great manner, the present state of things.

Bro. G. W. Wakeford presented the following Report :

HON. JOHN YEO, Grand Master of Masons in Prince Edward Island :

Dear Sir and Brother,—

Acting under your warrant of authority, dated the 20th January, 1888, I visited Orient Lodge, No. 11, at Souris, on Monday, the 6th of February, and installed the officers elect, they having received a dispensation for that purpose.

At that Communication thirteen members were present, and it affords me much pleasure to inform you that they, one and all, evince a determination to place the Lodge in an equal, if not a superior condition to what it was before they lost their all by fire.

The manner in which they performed the opening and closing ceremonies was most creditable after so long an interval of labor, and as the officers are composed, with two exceptions, of members who were petitioners for a charter in 1877, I am of opinion that Orient Lodge will prove a source of strength to the Grand Lodge, and of great benefit to the brethren in that section of the Province.

The Grand Lecturer, as such, cannot visit the Lodges except when requested, as his expenses, by our Laws, must be borne by the Constituent Lodges requesting his services, and as a flying visit is not of permanent benefit to the Lodge, I would suggest that the actual amount of travelling and other expenses incurred by him in his official capacity be borne by the Grand Lodge.

It is impossible for the Grand Lecturer to do much with any lodge unless he spends two or more days with the members, as it is not only the rendering of our ritual, as approved by Grand Lodge, that is necessary, but to bring forth its beauties frequent exercise is required to enable the officers to "speak the speech, I pray you, as I pronounced it to you, trippingly on the tongue; but if you mouth it, as many of your players do, I had as lief the town crier spoke my lines. Nor do not saw the air too much with your hands, thus, but use all gently; for in the very torrent, tempest, and, as I may say, the whirlwind of passion, you must acquire and beget a temperance that may give it smoothness."

PHYSICAL QUALIFICATION.—There is nothing in the constitution or landmarks for disqualifying a hunchback from being initiated into Masonry, provided he could comply with all the ceremonies of the intiated in the several degrees.—(Proceedings, May 1877.)

LODGE BUSINESS.—It is not competent for a Subordinate Lodge at an emergent meeting to enter on any other business than that specified on the summons.—(Proceedings, 1887.)

RESTORATION.—A brother who has been indefinitely suspended, can be restored to membership by a majority vote of the Lodge at any regular communication, notice having been given at a previous regular communication that a motion to that effect would be made.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

MASONIC BURIAL.—The friends of a brother who died while under suspension for non-payment of dues, cannot by paying his dues, entitle him to Masonic burial.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

MOTIONS.—A brother who gives notice of motion to amend the Constitution cannot delegate another brother to move in the matter in his absence.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

Demits cannot be granted to entered apprentices and Fellow crafts, 1885.
