BILL.

An Act respecting Public Exhibitions in Lower Canada.

WHEREAS one of the objects to which, in and by the Lower Preamble. Canada Consolidated Municipal Act, the powers of each Local Council extend, is the prohibition of any public exhibition tending to endanger morality; and whereas it is expedient to declare and define what exhibitions, among others, have that tendency: Therefore, Her Majesty, &c., declares and enacts as follows:

1. All Public Exhibitions of Monsters, Idiots, or other Imbecile or Deformed persons, tend to endanger morality, and may accordingly be prohibited by Local Councils in Lower Canada. Exhibitions which tend to endanger morality.
