RAILWAY.—A rumour has been current for a few days past, that the Messrs. Bylles & Co., Engineers, now engaged on a survey of the first section of a Trunk Line of Rail Road from this City to New Brunswick, and who have lately finished a survey of a line from Windsor to Victoria Beach—have made some very favorable offers for constructing the N. Scotia Railway. We have in reliable authority, that on the day previous to that of the departure of Mr. Howland to Antwerp, in all 200 miles of the line, Messrs. Bylles & Co. have offered to construct the same, with interest payable half-yearly, and to an amount, which with the Provincial subscription for stock, shall not in the aggregate exceed £2,000,000 sterling per mile of the principal line, its branches and extensions, such line to be advanced from time to time, as the construction of the railway progresses, and under such restrictions as the Governor in Council may impose, to secure its proper application, and such loan, and the interest accruing thereon, to be secured by a promissory Mortgage, or other charge on land of the Province, upon the principal railway, its branches and extensions, stations and station houses, rolling stock, and property of every description, to be attached immediately on the advance of each portion of the loan, upon all property owned by the company, whether the railway, its branches, &c., be completed or in course of construction. The certificate of the President and Treasurer, under seal of the company, is in sufficient evidence of such primary mortgage.

Clause 7th, Provides the revenues of the Province to the holders of debentures.
Clause 8th, Authorizes the Governor in Council to appoint a Consulting Engineer on behalf of the Province.
Clause 9th, Is the suspending clause.
