OTTAWA, July 14.—The Hudson Bay Railway scheme has been under discussion all day. The House went into committee immediately after meeting to consider the bill enacting in order to extend the charter of the Hudson Bay Railway Company to construct so much of their railway as reaches from the shore of Lake Winnipeg to the shore of Lake Ontario, the Governor-in-Council may enter into a contract with such company for the construction of a railway, to be completed in not more than 30 years at the rate of \$100,000 per annum, to be paid by the Government in 10 equal instalments.
