THE WORST METHOD.

The Prohibitionist Witness, one of our most clear headed contemporaries, is commenting on the liquor question thus:—

"Among Temperance reformers of the very highest standing and of the widest view the conviction is that the most effectual way of dealing with the liquor traffic is letting it altogether alone. Prohibit as far as you can; move on steadily toward the goal of total and absolute prohibition."

The Witness also quotes with approval the following:—

"We believe then, first of all, in absolute prohibition, and when and where it is not practicable, owing to the state of public sentiment, we believe in the strictest license system combined with 'local option.'"

This is our wisdom as the best way of dealing with the liquor question, so far as legal measures are concerned. All of these measures are intended to be remedial, and all of them are in a certain sense, they differ in degree, but not in kind or purpose.

The following note from a recent judgment of the Supreme Court of Canada in the Boothwell election case imparts information of importance to certain ballot papers were objected to as having been improperly marked with a cross, or with more than one cross, or with an inverted V, or because such marks were not correctly opposite the name of the candidate, there being only two names on the ballot paper, and a line dividing the paper in the middle.

Per Ritchie, C. J.—Whenever the mark evidences an attempt or intention to make a cross, though the cross may be in some respects imperfect, it should be counted, unless, from the peculiarity of the mark made, it can be reasonably inferred that there was not an honest design simply to make a cross, but there was also an intention to mark the paper, that it could be identified, in which case the ballot should be rejected.
