Regulations, Rules, and Mutions governing Sittings in the North Baptist Church.

The following were considered and adopted at the regular business meeting held March 5th, 1901, and ordered to be printed in the "Church Calendar."

GEO, A. McDONALD, Church Clerk.

1st. - Resolved, That the seats shall be under the control of a Pew Committee, consisting of three members of the Church.

2nd Seats shall be alloted, not rented.

3rd. Persons to whom pews or sittings are alloted shall have same, on condition that they contribute to the current expense by envelope regularly, and also occupy the sitting unless prevented by some good reason.

4th. In case of failure on the part of any pewholder to comply with the conditions of Rule 3, the seat will be regarded as having been vacated.

5th. All strangers and persons who, are not regular attendants will

be cordially welcomed, and seated by the ushers.
