**MARKET REPORT.**

**VICTORIA, V. I., 14th Nov., 1863.**  
During the past ten days the jobbers have been doing a fair amount of business, but the importers complain of slackness in most articles, especially liquors. A considerable demand for English dry goods has sprung up lately for the San Francisco market. By last steamer about \$15,000 worth was shipped, and several sales have been effected since that time for the same account. A large amount of miscellaneous goods has been disposed of at the different auction rooms in the city during the past two weeks, which may in some measure account for the lightness of the general demand. Quotations remain without any material alteration.

**REGULATIONS.**

*Concerning Delivery of Merchandise, Payment of Freight, &c.*

When no express stipulation exists for Bill of Lading, goods are to be considered as deliverable on shore.  
 Freight on all goods to be paid, or secured to the satisfaction of the captain or consignee of the vessel prior to the delivery of the goods.  
 After delivery to the purchaser of goods sold, no claims for damage, deficiency or other cause, shall be admissible unless made within three days, and no such claims shall be admissible after goods sold and delivered have once left the city.  
 When foreign Bills of Lading expressly stipulate that the freight shall be paid in a specific coin, then the same must be procured if required, or its equivalent given, the rate to be determined by the current value at the time at the Banks.
