On motion of J. S. Howard, Esq., seconded by Hon. W. B. Robinson, the Hon. J. Hillyard Cameron was called to the chair.

The circular convening the meeting, dated 14th July, was read.

Circular dated 17th June, containing resolutions passed at Special General Meeting of 14th June last: and circular of same date, notifying call on shareholders, and proposed mode of payment: also, circular of 8th July, notifying that those

shareholders who did not express their dissent from the continuance of the business, would be considered as having decided to abide by the views of the majority, were read.

The Chairman then read the Statements of Receipts and Disbursements, and Liabilities and Assets, 30th June, 1859.

Similar Statements in the Mutual Branch of the Company's business were also submitted.

The Auditors' Report was then read.

The Directors' Tenth Annual Report, dated 22nd August, 1859, was also read.

It was then moved by E. C. Jones, Esq., seconded by A. McLean, Esq., and

*Resolved* unanimously,—That the Report now read be received and adopted.

The resolution of the Special General Meeting of 14th June last, respecting the continuance of the Company, having been read, and the chairman having—after examination of the various agreements sent in by the shareholders, expressive of their desire to continue with or withdraw from the Company, on the terms of the resolution above referred to—announced that the total number of shareholders who had determined to withdraw under the resolution passed at last meeting was seventy, holding 4,461 shares; that the total number of shares held was 24,826, so that holders of upwards of 20,000 shares had either expressed their determination to remain, or had abided by the decision of the majority, it was

Moved by Alexander McLean, Esq., seconded by A. Todd, Esq., and

*Resolved* unanimously,—That as only seventy shareholders, holding 4,461 shares, out of 24,826—the whole capital stock of the Company—have expressed their intention of withdrawal under the terms of the resolution passed at the Special General Meeting of the 14th June last, the Directors to be elected this day do take vigorous measures to carry on the business of the Company.



It was moved by C. P. P. Hutchinson, Esq., seconded by E. C. Jones, Esq., and

*Resolved* unanimously,—That it is the duty and interest of the shareholders who have now elected to continue the operations of the Company, to do everything in their power to advance the interests of the Company, and to bring all the business they can to the different agencies of the Institution; and that all the stockholders of the Company hereby pledge themselves to insure in the Company.

Read section of Act 22 Vic., cap. 68, amending Act incorporating the Company, relative to the election of Directors.

Moved by E. C. Jones, Esq., seconded by C. P. P. Hutchinson, Esq., and

*Resolved* unanimously,—That Alfred Todd, Esq., and Hugh Miller, Esq., be appointed Scrutineers at the ballot for election of Directors for the ensuing year, and that such ballot do close at three o'clock P. M.

The meeting adjourned.

A three o'clock, the shareholders having again assembled, the Report of the Scrutineers, as follows, was read and adopted.

THE TENTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE  
DIRECTORS OF THE  
PROVINCIAL INSURANCE COMPANY  
OF CANADA.

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In submitting the balance-sheet for the financial year, ending 30th June, 1859, your Directors regret to observe that a very serious diminution has taken place in the Receipts for Premiums, both on Fire and Marine Policies, as compared with the previous year. While this decrease may be partly attributed to the prevailing scarcity of money, and to that depression which, for some time past, has continued to affect all commercial transactions, your Directors regret to add that it is also owing to an indifference evinced by many of the stockholders of the Company to the furtherance of their own interests, and even to the adverse action of a few: but it is by the effect of the prejudicial and erroneous statements so industriously circulated respecting the Company, and which the want of unanimity amongst the shareholders has been instrumental in promoting, that the income of the Company has been mainly impaired. This is the more to be regretted as your Directors conceive that by a more accurate knowledge of the present position of the Company, and its past transactions, this indifference and want of unanimity would have been prevented.

In referring to the Expenditure, your Directors have great pleasure in stating that they have lately effected a very considerable annual reduction.

The Liabilities and Assets of the Company, as compared with the past year, exhibit a more cheering aspect. In 1858, the balance against the Company, less the capital stock, was

\$81,707.69. That balance has now been reduced to \$18,134.10. This reduction, however, is owing chiefly to the amount of the fifth call on stock, valued at about \$74,478; so that taking into consideration the unfavourable circumstances before referred to, the business of the Company does not appear to have been impaired to the extent that might have been anticipated. In compliance with a resolution of the Special General Meeting of the Shareholders, on the 14th June last, a further call of five per cent. was made, "to enable the Company to meet its liabilities with promptness and certainty." This call becomes payable on the 1st October next, and will place a considerable balance beyond the liabilities to the credit of the Company.

The readiness and unanimity with which this further call was voted, fully manifest the desire of the stockholders to satisfy all just claims, whilst the large amount of uncalled capital affords the most ample guarantee to policy-holders of the ability of the Company to meet all its engagements.

Your Directors beg to notify that, in compliance with a further resolution of that meeting, the Agency of the Company in California has been discontinued.

The Shareholders of the Provincial Insurance Company of Canada having so lately as on the 14th June last, met specially with reference to the position of the Company, and a financial statement of its affairs having then been placed before them, and fully investigated, your Directors conceive that it is unnecessary to make any further remarks on the statements now submitted.

The important subject connected with the resolution of the last meeting of the shareholders, and on which this meeting has been specially convened to decide, involves in its consideration the progress and affairs of the Company from its commencement to the present time; and has reference, therefore, to transactions over which your present Board had no control. By the regulation of the Act 22 Vic., cap. 62, amending the

Act incorporating this Company, the whole of your present Directors now retire from office. Under these circumstances your Board consider that it would be advisable for them to abstain from giving any collective opinion that could in any way tend to bias your decision on a matter so important to your interests.
