Daily Hints For the Cook

Mix an ounce of ginger, 1 of mustard, 1 of pepper, 3 of coriander seed, the same quantity of turmeric, 1-4 of an ounce of cayenne pepper, 1-2 an ounce of cardamoms and the same of cummin seed and cinnamon. Pound the whole fine, sift and kep in a bottle.

Put 8 1-2 pints boiling water into a saucepan, add I pound ceeoa, let stand about five minutes to moisten the cocoa and then stir thoroughly. Add 8 1-2 pints more of water and cook for one hour, stirring occasionally. Add 5 pounds of granulated sugar and stir until dissolved, then cook about half an hour. Remove from the fire and when cold strain through thouble thickness of cheese cloth. Add two ounces of vanilla extract and store in bottles. This may be poured over ice cream or used in making chocolate to be served as a beverage. For the latter use take 1-8 cup to 3-4 cup of hot milk.





WEAKENING UNDER STRAIN OF TRIAL

The trial of Violet Reid, charged with the murder of her infant son, was begun yesterday in the circuit court before Judge White. During the proceedings in the afternoon session the prisoner broke down several times as she sat in the dock, and appeared to be greatly worried over her position. Many in the court room sympathised with her deeply in her predicament. There were five witnesses examined in the afternoon and three in the morning. The case was adjourned about 6.18 p. m. until this morning at 10. Five witnesses are yet to be produced by the prosecution, and it is expected that the crown case will close this morning. Attorney-General Grimmer and B. L. Gerow conducted the case for the crown and P. A. Guthrie appeared for the defence. The first witness called in the afternoon was David Duplisses, of Fredericton Junction. Examined by Mr. Gerow, he said he had accompanied Violet Reid for some distance up the track from Fredericton Junction station, where he had met her.
