PIONEER SETTLERS FOR SECTION BETWEEN COCHRANE AND QUEBEC

Ottawa, May 12—The national transcontinental has entered upon on hase of its work as a colonizing line opening up the great land of Ontario and Quebec. A report was received today by the immigration department announcing the arrival at Hurricanaw, Que, fourteen miles east of Cochrane, and 434 miles west of Quebec City, of a train of thirty-sight cars, containing 220 settlers and their effects. The train came straight—through from Quebec. Between Cochrane and Hurricanaw the national transcontinental has been for some time in operation by the contractors under arrangement with the N. T. R. commission.

The new settlers are the pioneers of a big influx which will, during the next few years, open up the millions of acres of good city land between Cochrane and Quebec.
