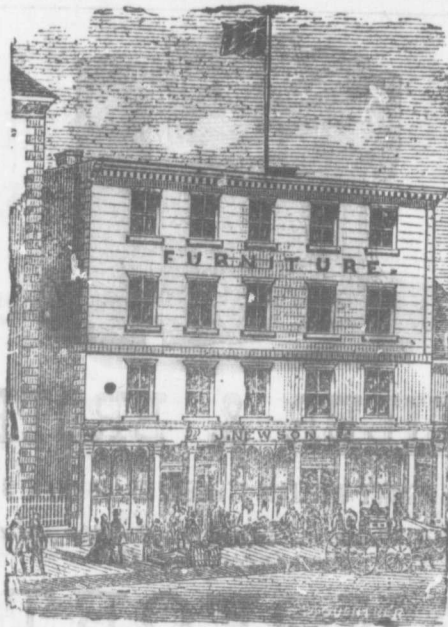

Explanations and Principal Articles of the Calendar for 1875.

EXPLANATIONS.

All the calculations are reduced to local mean time for Char-
lottetown, with the exception of the Sun's right ascension and
declination, and the equation of time, which are given for the
instant of apparent noon.

The various phenomena of the Moon's motions and the Tides,
are given to the nearest minute. The bearings—true, not com-
pass—of the moon at the time of its changes, are given for the
purpose of assisting or testing the truth of weather forecasts.
The days of expected atmospheric disturbance are those on
which the Moon, in its orbit crosses the equinoctial line, or at-
tains its greatest North or South declination. When these days
fall on or close upon—within two days—the time of the moon's
change or Perigee, or both combined, the disturbing influence
on the atmospheric tides is proportionally increased. These
cases are marked ** or *** according as two or three of these
influences are combined, and the more closely these times agree,
the stronger and more certain is the disturbance likely to be.

In addition to the general local disturbance on these days,
it sometimes happens that the effect of a storm generated within
the tropics, may be propagated so as to arrive within two or
three days, it having been ascertained that the average rate at
which the centre of such storms travel is about sixteen miles
an hour.

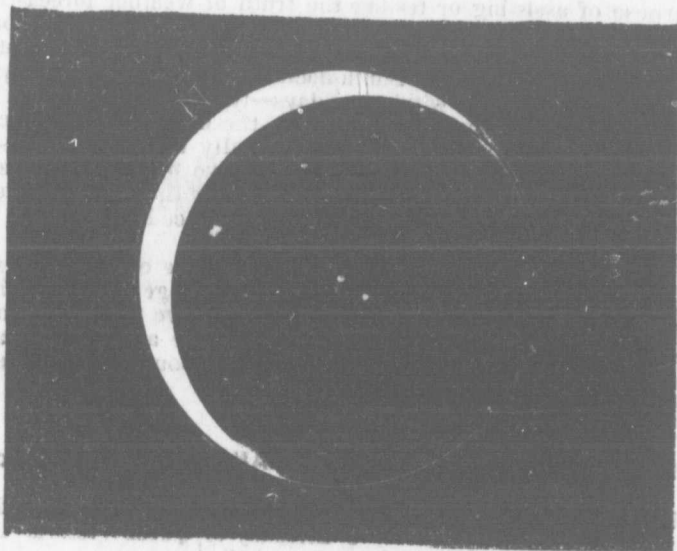

ECLIPSES.

There will be two Eclipses during the year: both of the Sun, of which one will be visible in Charlottetown.

I. A total Eclipse on April 5, Greenwich meantime of conjunction, 18h. 29m. 58.5s., only visible to South Africa, India, and China.

II. An annular Eclipse, September 29; Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 0h. 42m. 24.1s; visible to the Eastern side of North America, Greenland, England, France, Spain, Italy, Africa, and Arabia. The line of centrality passes from near Boston, across Cape Verde, Cape Coast, South Africa to Madagascar. Visible as a partial Eclipse at Charlottetown, commencing half an hour before Sunrise. Middle of Eclipse and phase of greatest obscuration, 32 minutes past 6. Portion of disc covered, 10.5 digits of Sun's diameter. End of Eclipse, 38 minutes past 7.

being an evening star while to the eastward, and a morning star while to the westward of the Sun. He will be in superior conjunction with the Sun, January 5, August 24, and December 15; and in inferior conjunction May 1, July 6, and October 29.

VENUS. Motion direct throughout the year. A morning star till her superior conjunction with the Sun on the 23d September, after which she will re-appear as an evening star.

MARS. Motion retrograde from May 19 till July 25; direct during the remainder of the year; in opposition to the sun, June 19: coming to the meridian at midnight, after which he will be a morning star till the end of the year.

JUPITER. Will be retrograde from February 15, till June 19; and direct during the remainder parts of the year. In opposition to the Sun on April 16; in conjunction November 4. His range of motion will be about 31° in the constellation Virgo and Libra.

SATURN. Will be retrograde from June 6, to October 24; direct during the remainder of the year. In conjunction with the Sun, February 5; in opposition, August 15. His range of motion 13 degrees in the eastern part of the constellation Capricornus.

URANUS. Motion direct from April 19, to November 25. In opposition to the Sun, February 1. In conjunction, April 8. His range of motion about 90° between Cancer and Leo.

NEPTUNE. Motion direct between January 9 and August 5; in conjunction with the Sun, April 20; in opposition, October 24. Range of motion about 5° at the commencement of the constellation Aries.

Of occultations of the Planets by the Moon: there will be one of Venus on May 2; three of Mars, June 18, July 15; and August 11; and one of Mercury, October 1; but none of these will be favorable for observing in these latitudes.

Matrimony Tart.—Pare and core about a dozen nice-sized apples; put them into a sauce-pan with a little water to keep them from burning; boil them until you can pulp them, (but do not forget to frequently stir them,) then add a quarter of a pound of currants, two ounces of candied peel, and enough sugar to sweeten it nicely; if liked, also a little grated nutmeg. Pour this mixture into a large tart-lin or dish that has previously been lined with a thin paste. Then roll out another piece the same size and thickness, which place over the top; press the edges together all round, make a hole in the centre, the same as for mince-pies, and bake.

Brawn.—Take a pig's head and feet, and about one and a half pounds of shin of beef; boil together for about two hours and a half. Take out of the water, and remove all the bones, chop fine, mix about a teaspoonful of white pepper, a handful of salt, a little Cayenne, and a teaspoonful of mixed spice; mix all thoroughly together, and put into a mould, that has been previously wetted with cold water; place something heavy on the top to press it. This is a very economical dish, as the liquor in which it is boiled makes excellent pea-soup.

Dough-Nut.—Take two pounds of flour, half a pound of sugar, two eggs, one teaspoonful of carbonate of soda; mix with buttermilk. Have a pan (a three legged pot, if you can get it) of boiling lard, into which drop pieces of the dough, being rolled out and cut with a coffee-cup. They will rise like a nut, then turn, and take them out when they are brown.

Lemon Cheesecake.—Pare two lemons very thin, put the rind in soak in half a pint of cold water. Put in a nicely-tinned sauce-pan one pound of loaf-sugar, six ounces of fresh butter, six eggs, the yolks and whites a little beaten, and the water in which the rind has been soaked. Keep this mixture well stirred until it becomes about as thick as ordinary honey. Pour it into a jar, and it will keep good for several weeks. Line dishes or patty pans with nice puff-paste, and put in the cheesecake. It should not be browned in the oven, but should be made a nice, bright-eyed color.

To "Devi" Turkey.—Mix a little salt, black pepper, and cayenne, and sprinkle the mixture over the gizzard, rump, and drumstick, of a dressed turkey; boil them, and serve very hot with this sauce; mix with some of the gravy out of the dish, a little made mustard, some butter and flour, a spoonful of lemon juice, and the same of soy; boil up the whole.

A Sweetmeat Pudding.—Cover a dish with a thin puff-paste, and lay in it freshly candied orange, lemon, and citron, one ounce each, sliced thin; beat the yolks of eight and the whites of two eggs, and mix with eight ounces of butter, warmed, but not oiled, and eight ounces of white sugar; pour the mixture on the sweetmeats, and bake an hour in a moderate oven.

Calf's Liver and Bacon.—This is commonly tossed in butter. The liver, sliced moderately thin, is first dressed, and the rashers of bacon afterward; serve garnished with the latter. Calf's liver may also be fried; dip the slices into seasoned beaten eggs and olive oil, and fry quickly. In France, similarly shaped pieces of liver and bacon are skewered together, then dipped into oil, and subsequently sprinkled with bread-crumbs, and boiled; season and serve. When tossed without bacon, a glass of wine may be poured into the pan, and served in the dish, with the liver arranged around.

Hodge-Podge.—(An excellent way of warming cold mutton.)—Mince your mutton, (it is better rather underdone,) and cut up one or two leituces and two or three onions into slices. Put these into a stew-pan, with about two ounces of butter, pepper and salt to taste, and half a cup of water; simmer for three-quarters of an hour, keeping it well stirred; boil some peas separately, mix them with the mutton, and serve very hot.

Charlotte de Pommes.—Cut from a household loaf a number of slices of uniform thickness (one quarter to three-eighths of an inch thick;) butter a plain mould and all the slices of bread; shape one of them round to fit the bottom of the mould, and another one for the top; cut the rest in pieces an inch wide, and the height of the mould in length; lay one of the round pieces at the bottom of the mould, and line the sides with the small pieces, carefully snearing the edges with white of egg, so as to make them hold well together. Stew a quantity of apples with plenty of brown sugar, a little water, the juice and the thin rind of a lemon, and a piece of cinnamon; when thoroughly done, pass them through a hair-sieve; fill the mould with this puree, put on the round slice of bread for the cover, and set on a quick oven for about an hour and a half.

Calf's Feet Fricassee.—Soak them three hours, simmer them in equal proportions of milk and water, until they are sufficiently tender to remove the meat from the bones, in good-sized pieces. Dip them in yolk of eggs, cover with fine bread-crumbs; pepper and salt them; fry a beautiful brown, and serve in white sauce.

Cherry Compost.—Boil some sugar in the smallest possible quantity of water, add the cherries, and simmer them until they become soft, and have absorbed all the syrup. Should there be more syrup than the fruit can absorb, boil it down, and pour it over the cherries.

Plum Marmalade.—Simmer the plums in water until they become soft, and then strain them and pass the pulp through a sieve. Put in a pan over a slow fire, together with an equal quantity of powdered loaf-sugar; mix the whole well together, and let it simmer for some time until it becomes of the proper consistence. Then pour it into jelly-pots, and cover the surface with powdered loaf-sugar.

To Keep Damsons.—Put them in small stone jars, or wide-mouth glass bottles, and set them up to their necks in a kettle of cold water; set it over the fire to become boiling hot, then take it off, and let the bottles remain until the water is cold; the next day fill the bottles with cold water, and cork and seal them. These may be used the same as fresh fruit. Green gages may be done in this way.

The Governor in Council may authorise the admission, free of duty, of any machinery to be used in any Canadian manufactory, on satisfactory evidence that like machinery is not then manufactured in Canada.

TABLE OF PROHIBITIONS.

The following articles shall be prohibited to be imported under a penalty of two hundred dollars together with a forfeiture of the parcel or package of goods in which the same may be found, viz.:

Books, Drawings, Paintings, Prints, and Photographs of an immoral or indecent character.
Coin, base and counterfeit.

THE FOLLOWING

Under Regulations and Restrictions to be prescribed by the Minister of Customs.

Carriages of travellers, and carriages laden with merchandize, and not to include circus troops and hawkers.

Locomotive and Railway passenger baggage and freight cars, running upon any line of road crossing the frontier, so long as Canadian locomotives and cars are admitted free under similar circumstances in the United States.

Menageries, horses, cattle, carriages, and harnesses of Travellers' baggage.

THE FOLLOWING GOODS.

When the product and growth of any of the B. N. A. Provinces, may be imported free of duty, subject to alteration or regulation, by proclamation, of the Governor in Council, viz.:-

Animals of all kinds; Fresh, Smoked and Salted Meats; Green and Dried Fruits; Fish of all kinds; Products of Fish, and of all other creatures living in the water; Poultry, Butter, Cheese, Lard, Tallow; Timber and lumber of all kinds, round, hewed, but not otherwise manufactured in whole or in part; Fish Oil; Gypsum, ground or unground; Hay, Straw, Seeds of all kinds; Vegetables (including potatoes and other roots); Plants, Trees and Shrubs.

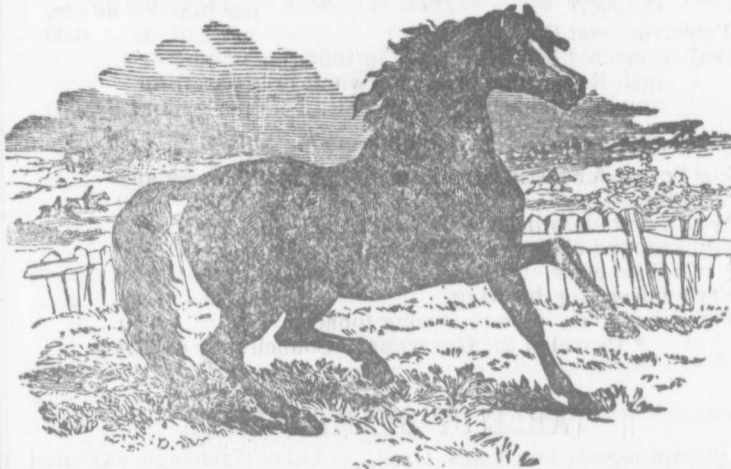

MAYOR'S COURT—This Court, established for the purpose of adjudicating in cases of Small Debts, is composed of His Worship the Mayor, with two Councillors; or, in the Mayor's absence, three Councillors. Its sittings are held in the City Hall, on the first Wednesday in each month, with power to adjourn to the following day. The last day of issuing summonses for the monthly sittings, is the Monday week previous to the first said Wednesday. The Act gives jurisdiction to the extent of £20 in cases of debt and trover, and to £5 in slander, detinue and replevin.

STATISTICS, &c., RELATING TO P. E. ISLAND.

Prince Edward Island contains an area of about 1,250,000 acres, nearly all of which is fit for cultivation. It is divided into three Counties, 67 Townships, and 15 Electoral Districts. The population, by the census of 1871, is 94,021, of whom about 42,651 are in Queen's County. The population of Prince County is 28,022; and of King's County, 23,068. Charlottetown, the Capital of the Island, is in Queen's County, and contains about 8807 inhabitants; Georgetown and Royalty, 1056; and Summerside and Township No. 17, 3,562. The House of Assembly is composed of 30 members, and the Legislative Council of 13, all of whom are elected by the people. The Executive Council is limited to nine members. Responsible Government was granted in 1851. The number of Schools now in operation is 362, attended by about 15,000 children. In 1852, when the present Free Education Act was passed, the number was 160. There are besides the Prince of Wales College (public,) and St. Dunstan's College (Roman Catholic,) the Wesleyan Academy (Denominational), a County Grammar School in Georgetown and Summerside, and thirteen similar Schools throughout other parts of the Island. The whole cost of public instruction, which is under the control of a Board of Education, consisting of nine Members and two Examiners, is defrayed out of the general revenue. There is a School Visitor for each County, who reports to the Board, and the latter to the Government. In 1871 an Act passed the Legislature, authorizing the Government to construct a line of Railway from Alberton to Georgetown, with branch lines to Souris and Tignish. This Road—measuring 167 miles—was completed and handed over to the General Government of Canada, in December 1874. On the first day of July, 1873, the Island entered the Union, and became part of the Dominion of Canada.

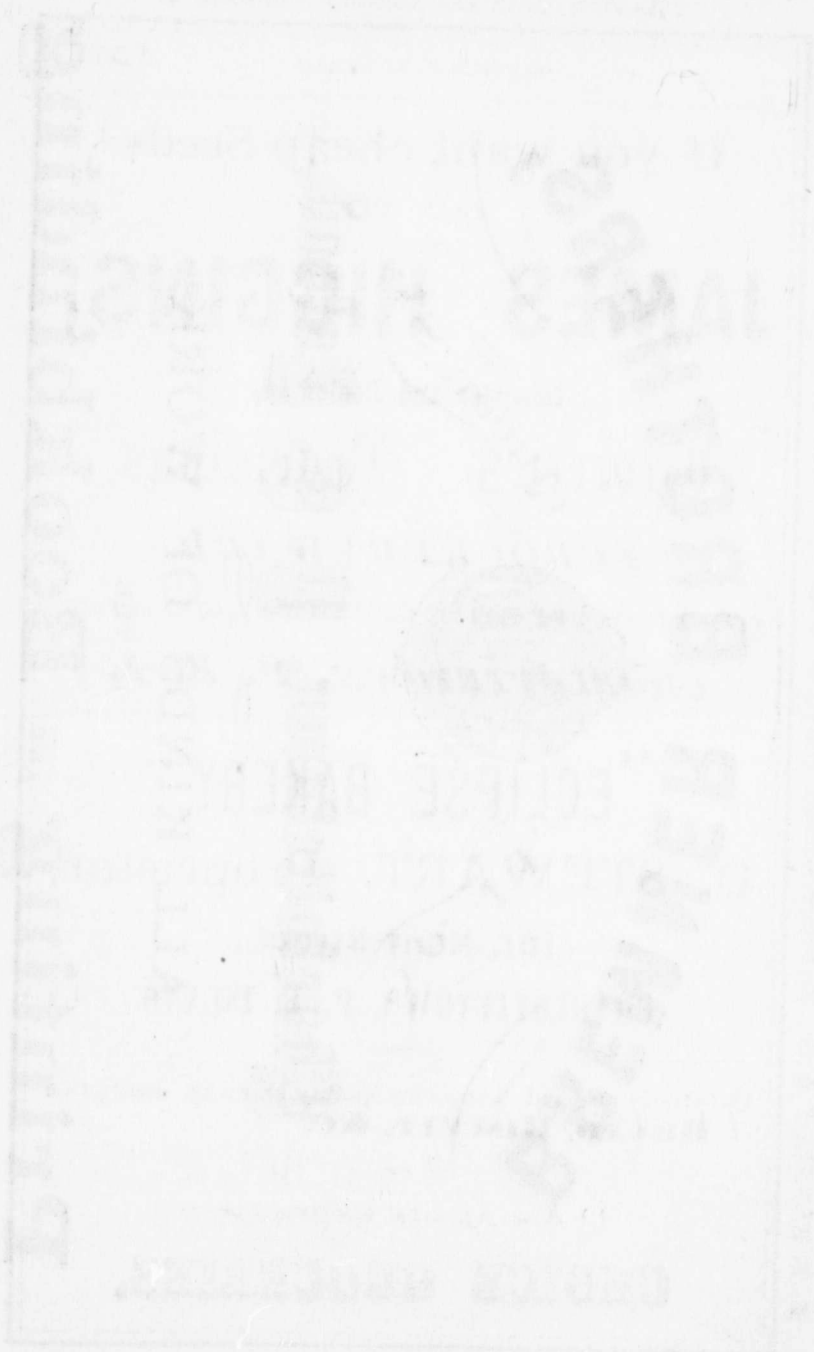

Hon. Mr. OWEN noticed that in New Brunswick a financial statement was annually made by the Auditor General. If our Auditors would undertake to prepare a similar statement, it would be much more satisfactory than the present state of matters. Two Messages from the Council by Mr. Ball, their Clerk:

FIRST MESSAGE.

“LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER,
Charlottetown. P. E. Island,
25th April, 1874

“MR. SPEAKER:

“The Legislative Council have passed the following Bills:

“1. ‘An Act to amend the Absent Debtor Act, 1873.

“2. ‘An Act to amend an Act for the better government of rising towns and villages in this Island.’”

SECOND MESSAGE.

“LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER,
Charlottetown. P. E. Island,
April 27th 1874.

“MR. SPEAKER:

“The Legislative Council desire a Free Conference with the House of Assembly on the Bill intituled the ‘Land Purchase Act, 1874,’ and have appointed the same Committee who managed the former Conference thereon, a Committee to manage this further Conference, to meet in the Conference Chamber instanter.”

And then he withdrew.

Resolved, That this House doth

Ordered, That the Hon. Mr. Haviland do go to the Council, and desire the said Conference.

Ordered, That the Hons. Messrs. Haviland, Yeo, Brecken; Messrs. L. H. Davies and Welsh, be a Committee to manage the said Conference.

And the names of the Managers being called over, they went to the Conference.

And being returned,—

The Hon. Mr. HAVILAND reported that the Managers had been at the Conference, and he stated the substance thereof to the House.

Hon. B. DAVIES would submit a resolution providing that those districts which did not enjoy the direct advantages from the Railway, owing to their being at a distance from it, should receive some compensation for the sums contributed by them in the shape of taxes for the construction of the Railway. One or two new bridges were required in his district, and several new roads were absolutely necessary. The latter had been laid down upon the map, with the intention of having them made or opened up; but the work was never performed. He moved the following:—

Whereas, The construction of the Railway and its branches through this Island has involved a large addition to the taxation of the people: *And whereas*, certain portions of this Island, although compelled to bear their portion of such taxation, cannot, owing to their distances from such Railroad, participate in any of the advantages which may flow from its construction and working:

Therefore Resolved That in the

King's County, and such other Districts as are not traversed by the Railroad or its Branches, shall receive for their Roads, and Bridges, and Wharfs, and other public works, out of the moneys voted for expenditure by the Board of Works for the ensuing year, such sum shall bear a fair equivalent to the yearly taxes the people of those Districts will be required to pay as their share of the cost of such Railway.

Mr. ROWE seconded the Resolution, and said that he claimed the attention of the House, for a few moments, while he rapidly reviewed some of the special wants of the district which he had the honor to represent. The hon. junior member for Belfast had been very persistent, through the whole Session, in pressing upon the attention of the House, the claims of his district; in fact, he had done so in season and out of season, losing no opportunity. He (Mr. Welsh) had appealed to the Government in the name of justice, honor and fair play, to do something for the wharfs, roads, bridges, and also for the poor and distressed of his district; but with what success it was hard to say. He (Mr. Rowe) had followed a different course in reference to his district, but was just as earnest in seeking justice for his constituents. He had been endeavoring to follow in the wake of the hon. member for Fort Augustus, who, it was said, obtained more money for his district than was secured by any other member of the House. In endeavoring to coquette with the hon. Chairman of the Board of Works, he had found him as skittish as a two year old colt, when money was asked for the Murray Harbor District; but quite calm when money was to be paid him. He hoped his honor would note the particulars in reference to his district
