JUMPED 150 FEET TO DEATH

C. S. ROGERS OF ST. PAUL COMMITTED SUICIDE.

St. Paul, Minn., May 19.—C. S. Rogers, President of the Northwestern Cordage Company, one of the largest concerns of this city, late this afternoon jumped from the high bridge into the river 125 feet below.

So far as learned by way of identification Mr. Charles S. Rogers, President of the Northwestern Cordage Company, committed suicide this afternoon shortly after 2 o'clock by jumping off the high bridge.

A boy named J. N. K. was crossing the high bridge, when a man drove up and stopped him.

"I want you to take this horse and buggy home for me," he said quietly.

The man handed him a paper on which was written "C. S. Rogers, 410 Grove Street." He also handed him a letter addressed to Charles S. Rogers, president of the Northwestern Cordage Company.

The man then got out of the buggy, and without a moment's warning stepped to railing and jumped into the river, descending to the water in a matter of distance of about 150 feet.

There was no trace of the remains has been found, though a large number of men are now on the river in boats searching for him.

It is not thought that Mr. Rogers has been involved in any financial difficulties, and it is believed a fit of temporary insanity caused him to commit suicide.

Mr. Rogers was one of the leading business men of the city and was well-to-do financially. He was a son-in-law of Mr. E. F. Drake, one of the wealthiest men of the city.

The boy says that the suicide told him his name was C. S. Rogers.

SCOTCH-IRISH CONGRESS.

Notes of Interest to Canadian Members of the Society, The fifth congress of the Scotch-Irish Society of America closed its meeting with an address on Sabbath May 14.
