FIFTEENTH YEAR
SHOT DOWN IN HIS TRACKS

A CENTRAL PRISON CONFLICT STOPPED BY A BULLET.

He Had Bravely Beaten a Guard and Was Attempting to Kill Him With a Knife When the Latter Opened Fire Upon Him With a Revolver. The Bullet in His Back.

Arthur Herbert, a colored convict, was shot down by Guard Hartley to the broom shop of the Central Prison on Saturday morning. The convict after a struggle with the guard was struck at him with a huge knife, and was rushed in his tracks. Herbert is 24 years old, and was sent from Hamilton in June, 1898, to serve a sentence of 20 months for burglary.

During his 15 months' stay at the prison he has been the sides of the officials. He has always been looking for trouble, and on Saturday found it in a form which will make him a model prisoner for some time at least.

Returned to Work.
Saturday morning when the prison guard was paraded for work the negro complained of a sore shin. There was a slight abrasion, and he was taken from his cell and given a job where he could sit down and nurse his wounded limb. Still Herbert complained of a sore shin, and the warden sent him to his cell to rest.

The 80 convicts in the shop looked up from their tasks, but said no word. Guard Hartley walked over to the prisoner and told him that if he did not go to work he would be reported and another punishment added to his record by way of reprimand. Herbert, the heavy, three-legged stool, on which he had been seated, at the guard's head. The guard caught the flying stool and it dropped to the floor.

Attacked the Guard.
Then the colored man leaped wildly at the guard, striking him in the face with his clenched fist. The other convicts ceased work, but the guard, looking calmly on at the struggle, Guard Clancy ran up and the two officials tried to hold the irate negro. Herbert is a large and powerful man, and the two guards had more than they could do to handle him. They were unable to hold him still, but when they endeavored to take him from the shop they failed. The negro kicked and kicked, and Hartley down. Seeing that they could not remove him without clubbing him, the guard called for help. Deputy-Warden Logan, and Hartley mounted the guard's stand.

But the devil in the man was roused and knew no cringing. Scarcely had Hartley got into the stand when the negro dashed to the broom machine and seized one of the large knives used to cut the corn. Grasping the guard with his hands, he rushed at the guard with his brutal face and savage bitterness, his eyes blaring with insane ferocity. The guard beat and crouching like that of a tiger ready to spring.

Shot Down in His Tracks.
Hartley drew his pistol and the negro did not stop. With a rush the maddened convict came at the guard. When the three feet away the pistol cracked. Herbert gave one leap in the air and dropped to the floor, a knife fell clanging from his grasp to the floor. The convict sprang from the floor, and the guard fired, and helped to carry Herbert to the hospital. There it was found that the bullet had entered about four inches above the right hip and proceeded downwards, lodging between the wall of the chest cavity and the outer skin. The bullet has not yet been removed. He Herbert will recover.

During the excitement not one of the convicts moved from his work, showing the perfect discipline that is maintained. The Prison Inmate.
Herbert is the "bad man" of the prison. He is easily identifiable, and has been continually in hot water, his blind ferocity keeping him in perpetual trouble. Frequently he has been punished for insubordination, and in fact, has been regarded as the prison trouble-maker. He is a fit subject for the penitentiary, no flat refusal to perform his work, room talk, again a refusal to accept a simple order, and still again a savage attack upon a fellow-prisoner. Only a few months ago he attempted to carry a prisoner with a knife.

Only the one conviction at Hamilton for a fight with a fellow-prisoner. He is believed to be an old-timer. An attempt was made by Deputy-Warden Logan, and he replied, "I tell you what you after, but you can't get it."

GREAT INFUX OF PRISONERS.
100 More Convicts in Central Prison Than Usual at This Time.
No fewer than 394 convicts are at the present time in the Central Prison, representing their past misdeeds, while they board at the prison, and the number of convicts, as compared with the winter season, is an increase of over 100 convicts.

The increase is in all probability due to the fact that instead of the weary wanderers to jail for short terms, as in former years, the convicts in the various counties are sending them to terms in the Central Prison.
