The Household.

Noble Motives.

It seems strange that any mother who loves her child should ever fault in his mind anything but the noblest motives for conduct. Children readily appreciate high motives, and learn to despise unworthy ones.

It is a great mistake to ask a child to be good because some one is looking at it, or for some party reward or from fear of punishment. The motive from which a child acts should be more carefully considered than its action.

Conscientious children are often guilty of grievous blunders. The child in such a case needs only instruction, and never condemnation. So long as the motive was sincere the action is of trivial consideration, because it does not affect the formation of character.

On the other hand, a most worthy action may sometimes be clouded by a contemptible motive. Where it is clearly shown that a child acts merely from love of praise the matter is one for the serious consideration of the mother.

Not that character is more easily acquired by a child and soon more disintegrable or difficult to overcome than that of the infantile prig. Self-sufficiency is a common fault of petted children, and one that is particularly annoying.

Until taught by motives of fear or greed to be cunning and underhanded a child is naturally frank, and is easily susceptible to the noblest motives. The mother should regard the child as a noble being, and not as a creature to be manipulated.

It is not to be wondered at, if it may develop in adult life into an unhappy habit of exaggeration. The child should be questioned and taught to distinguish between the narrow world of its fancy and the real world in which it lives.

The habit of exact and truthful statement cannot be formed too early. All the instructions of the child should be made to make him methodical in thought. A bright child soon recognizes inferior motives, and estimates accordingly those who advance them.

If you expect to retain the respect of your children do not give them a motive for action that you yourself would despise. Teach them to understand and live up to the highest standard.
