### GOOD WILL SHOWN ALL ROUND

All the Ministers Will Continue in Office, for the present at All Events.

Washington, Sept. 20 .- After a suspension of three days as a mark of respect the dead President, the business of the overnment at Washington was resumed at 9 a.m. to-day. The train bearing President Roosevelt and the members of his cabinet arrived at the Pennsylvania Station at 9.20 o'clock, and fifteen minutes later the President entered the White House, and going at once to the elevator proceeded to the cabinet room, where Pres dent McKinley was wont to do the greater part of his work. When the new chief executive reached the White House he walked briskly to the big front door, which swung wide open to receive him. He spoke places of the wastchmen and other em-ployes of the wastchmen and other em-ployes of the mansion, and, reaching his office, was joined almost immediately by Secretary Long. Soon afterward Senator fullom called to pay his respects, and following him came Senator Proctor, one of the President's close personal friends. Secretary Long informed the President as to the condition of affairs in his office, and was asked as to the work of the Schey. Court of Inquiry. With Senator Cullom President Roose-wit exchanged pleasant greetings and re-ceived the assurance of the hearty support of the Hillnois Senator.
