On both sides of the Ancre river in France the British forces con-tinue to make prograss. North of the stream the important village of Gommecourt and the village of Pulsieux-Ai-Monts and trench systems are them have been captured, while south of the river the forces which previously had takes Ligny pushed eastward and occupied Thilloy, about a mile southwest of Bapaume, and a trench at Sailly-Sailliel. The capture of Gommecourt was followed by the driving of the Bri-tish line a thousand yards northeast of that place. Whether the Ger-mans offered resistance on any of these sectors is not stated by the British efficial communication.
