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The American Shipping Bill.

WASHINGTON, June 26.—The President

signed the Shipping Bill today.

It takes effect on Tuesday. The Treasury

is preparing a bill to amend the

bill and instructions, which will

be sent to the collectors of customs by

Saturday. The bill contains a collection

of the proposed changes of customs and

six cents per ton on each cargo on vessels

from foreign ports in lieu of the rate.
