Y., published in January, 1800, containing an account of the Death in December, 1799, and his burial in the same month, of General George Washington, aged 68, with Addresses to the President, John Adams, on the subject, and Replies thereto, with copies of the letters of his medical attendants, and other items of interest.

2 RARE ORIGINAL LETTERS AND MANUSCRIPT DOCUMENTS.

L.—Rare Original Letters and other Manuscript Documents Relating to the Thirteen British Colonies in North America, and also to Canada and Newfoundland, 1729-1839.*

- 1 **Placentia Ordnance Stores.** A General Acc't of the Ordnance & Stores in His Maj'ty's Garrison in Placentia, Newfoundland, by order of Lient. John Hollingworth, Commander-in-Chief. This acc't taken by Edward Hopley, Storekeeper, Feby 1729-30. 16 pages. 1729
- 2 **Transport Stores to Boston.** Agreement of Franc's Hammerden with the Officer of Ordnance, to transport to Boston, Corn-powder, Cased Paper, Cartridges, Matches, Fine Paper, Oyle, Needles, Tbread, Twine, Sloopkins, and one Fire Engine. Also two Carpenters, with their Chests of Tools, and Vitual in their passage for £21. Dated April 24th, 1729. Witnessed by Henry Allen. 1729. This agreement has three Imperial sixpenny stamps of 1729 embossed on it, the Rose of England in the centre and surmounted with the Crown. The words *Honi Soit, etc.*, encircle it.
- 3 **Placentia Fort and Garrison.** The present state and condition of His Majesty's Garrison at Placentia, Newfoundland. Report: The Parrapitt of the Ridout and Chimneys, Storehouses, Pallasses, very much decayed. The Rowhall Wall without side. The Garrison is very much damaged by the Sea. September 5th 1780. Edward Hopley. 1780
- 4 **Placentia Fort and Garrison.** Letter of Hen. Osborne, of the ship *Squirrel*, sending inventory of Stores in the Garrison at Placentia; also, "Report on the State of that Fort and Garrison, Dated ye 9th Decemb'r, 1780." 1780
- 5 **Letter from Boston to Ordnance Office,** dated April 30th, 1744 (but no name attached), to the Lient'nt-Gen'l, and the principal officers of His Maj's Ordnance, reporting draft on them for £1,600; also in regard to the Ordnance Schooner built there for Annapolis, the purchase of Ten Swivel Guns, etc. 1744
- 6 **Nova Anglia.** Certificate of Benjamin Pollard, Notary and Tabellion Publick, Dwelling and Practising in Boston, in New England, dated the 3rd of May, 1744, in favour of John Ewing and Thomas Perkins, Merchants, as "persons worthy of good credit in regard to their Report on Cordage and Cables as Merchantable"; also in regard to a similar Report from Wm. Vellacott and Joseph Grandy, Riggers. 1744
The Notary's signature and seals are in good preservation.
- 7 **The Same,** dated the same day, and in favour of William Palfrey, of Boston, Sailmaker. Witnessed by R. Jennys and W. Morte. 1744
Signature and "Notarial Firm and Seal" in good preservation.
- 8 **The Same,** dated on the same day, in favour of Francis Borland, Thomas Perkins, William Downs, and Henry Dering, as "persons worthy of good credit," and as having signed a certificate in regard to a new Schooner of 91 tons burthen, owned by Thomas Donnal, that it is "so fitted and provided as to be worth £250, New England currency." The certificate is given at the request of Henry Bastide, of His Majesty's Ordnance. 1744
The Signature and "Notarial Firm and Seal" are in good preservation.
- 9 **Pitt to Abercromby** "Extract of a letter from Mr. Secretary Pitt to Major-General Abercromby, dated Whiteball, December 30th, 1757, directing that Gen. Abercromby appoint Colonel Forbes (as Brigadier-General) to the command such forces as he may leave in the Southern Provinces, and that he proceed at once to Pennsylvania," etc. 1757
- 10 **Abercromby to Pitt.** "Extract of a letter from Major-General Abercromby to Mr. Secretary Pitt, dated New York, April 28th, 1758," reporting the appointment of Brigadier-General Forbes, as directed, and that he had desired the Governors in the Southern Provinces "to correspond with him, as he was to have the supreme command and direction of their troops"; also that General Forbes send to "the King's Ministers . . . a full and clear account of his proceedings," etc. 1758
- 11 **Forbes to Pitt.** Extract of a letter from Brigadier-General Forbes to Mr. Secretary Pitt, dated Philadelphia, 1st of May, 1758, reporting that "Province of Maryland have been extremely dilatory in their Proceedings . . . also granting supplies. At the end of last year they voted their (300) troops should be disbanded, by which Fort Cumberland and that back country must have fallen into the enemy's hands. But the Earl of Londoun gave assurances to Governor Sharpe . . . that he would make good the expenses of keeping them up", etc. 1758
- 12 **Forbes to Pitt.** "Extract of a letter from Brigadier-General Forbes to Mr. Secretary Pitt, dated Fort London, September 6th, 1758," reporting that the Governor of Maryland had acted with the greatest zeal. . . . in sending 50 volunteers, all good woodsmen, to join him, . . . and marching 200 of his militia to Fort Cumberland," etc. 1758
- 13 **Hartwell to Ordnance Office.** Original letter from Thomas Hartwell to the Ordnance Office, dated 6th Feb., 1759, recommending John Stewart "to assist George Mackie in viewing Gun-Barrels, Bayonets, and Sword-Blades," at Birmingham. "Approved W. R. E." (or "W. R. L."), 9th Feb., 1759
- 14 **Leeward Charibee Islands.** Original Commission signed by "George Thomas, Cap-

tain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Leeward Charibee Islands in America, and Chancellor of the same," directing "James George Douglass, Fernando John Paris, John Baker, and Thurstan Blackman" to take the answer of Ralph Payne to "a Bill of Complaint" before him in the Court of Chancery of the Island of St. Christopher, exhibited by John St. Leger Douglass . . . and Drewry Ottley . . . against Lieut.-General Gilbert Fleming and Ralph Payne. Dated at Antigua, 29th August, 1758, and signed and sealed by Geo. Thomas, "Governor, and "W. Smith, Dep. Secretary." 1759

NOTE.—These signatures are genuine.

15 **Cape Charles, St. Lawrence Grant.** for four years from James Murray, Governor of Quebec, to William Brymer, merchant of Cape Charles, opposite the mouth of the straits of Belleisle, for the purpose of seal fishing. Given under the Hand and Seal of Governor Murray on the 26th of April, 1763, and signed by H. T. Graham (who was then President of Quebec in, 1770-73). Note on grant: "This paper writing was shown to John Gray." 1763

16 **Governor Hugh Palliser.** Proclamation by Hugh Palliser, Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Newfoundland, granting permission "to all the King's British Subjects, in preference to all others," for fishing and trade under "Rules, orders and regulations to be observed on the Coast of Labrador, the Islands of Anticosti and Magdalines," and "ordained by that Excellent Act of the 10th and 11th of William the Third . . . for the encouragement of the Trade and Fisheries." Given under my hand this 8th April, 1765. S'gnd Hugh Palliser. This paper writing was shown to John J. Y. 1765

17 **Sales of the Sloop 'Esquimaux.'** With all her Tackling Apparel, fit for sea, with all her provisions and stores, and other necessaries, fit for fishery at Cape Charles, on the Coast of Labrador; Sold this day at Public Vendue—Quebec, 26th Oct'r, 1765—Sam'l Morin, Auctioneer. This paper writing was shown to John Gray." 1765

18, 19 **Original Letter to Sir Hugh Palliser,** from Adderly and Jenkins of London, dated "New Inn, 1st Dec., 1766," stating that they had sent out a writ for damages sustained at Cape Charles, Labrador, by Bayne and Brymer, and asking Hugh Palliser the Governor, to name an Attorney to whom a copy of the v it may be sent. 1766

A copy of Governor Palliser's reply is appended.

20 **Original Letter of Sir Hugh Palliser** "to Mr. Sharp," stating that every step he took and every order issued by him while Governor of Newfoundland were "strictly conformable to the statute for regulating the Fisheries." 1768

Mr. Sharp apparently represented the Board of Trade.

21 **Original Letter of Charles O'Mara** to John Boddington, of the Board of Ordnance,

dated Fort Lewis, March 11th, 1775, making certain recommendation to the ordnance in favor of Mr. Stanion and J. P. Collin for promotion in the garrison of Fort Lewis. 1775

22 **Thomas Gamble's Memorial to Lord Harrington.** His Majesty's Secretary at War, dated Boston, 7th April, 1775, praying that he may be allowed "the purchase of a company in one of the Regiments serving in America." He complains that "a junior officer from another corps was put over his head." He describes himself as Captain serving as "Assistant Quartermaster General," and "Lieut. in the 16th Regt. of Foot." (The memorial is unsigned.) 1775

23 **Original Letter of Captain Gamble,** addressed to "Ant. Chamber" of the War Office, dated "Head Quarters," Boston, May 10th, 1775, in which he is thankful to be assured "that the Secretary at War has not forgot his "application, and encloses the counterpart of a Memorial that Gen. Page has desired me to give in," etc. He then goes on to state that he was made a Lieut. in 1755, and then he recounts his varied service in the army. 1775

24 **Original Letter from Col. Robert Prescott,** who became a Major-General in 1758, and in 1793 succeeded Gen. Lord Dorchester, as Governor-in-Chief of Lower Canada. This letter is addressed to the "Rt. Hon. Sir Jeffery (afterwards Lord) Amherst," and is dated "Portsmouth, Feb'y 2nd, 1776." He details the particulars of an effort of Brooklyn, an emissary of the "Rebels in America," to take out ordnance stores on board the *Hope Transport*, and gives the particulars of Gen. Montgomery's abortive attack upon Quebec, in which Montgomery, his Secretary, and about 80 men were killed, and 300 were wounded and taken prisoners. 1776

The signature of "Robert Prescott" is genuine.

25 **Original Letter of G. Curtis,** Master of the Ship *Nottingham*, dated Halifax, Sept. 6th, 1779, reporting his arrival at Halifax, and discharge of his cargo of gunpowder, etc. He says that "Geo. Collier has made havoc among the Rebel Fleet at 'Ponobeticut.'" 1779

26 **Original Letter of N. Laban,** Superintendent of the ship *Nottingham*, to Mr. Boddington of the Board of Ordnance, dated the 9th of September, 1779, reporting the safe arrival of the ship at Halifax, after many privations, etc. 1779

27 **Original Letter of G. Curtis,** Master of the ship *Nottingham*, dated "Downs, Nov. 12th, 1779," reporting his arrival there, after a 25-days' passage from Halifax. He said: "Nothing particular happened, saving a few shot put into a sloopdrill privateer . . . on leaving the Harbour." 1779

28 **Original Letter of N. Laban,** dated 12th Nov., reporting to Mr. Boddington of the Board of Ordnance the arrival of the ship

- Nottingham (of which he is Superintendent), in the Downs at that date, having left Halifax on the 18th October, 1770. 1770
- 29 Sir Guy Carleton's Return of Officers. This is a complete "List of Garrison Officers in America: Sent from the War Office Returned with Remarks by Sir Guy Carleton, dated New York, 20th October, 1782." The Return bears the autograph signature of Mr. "Guy Carleton." The list includes the officers at St. Augustine, Florida, and in South Carolina, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, Cape Breton, St. John's Island, Province and Bermuda. 1782
- Sir Guy Carleton, born in 1722, served with Wolfe at Quebec; became Governor-General in 1774. In 1772 he succeeded Sir H. Clinton as Commander-in-Chief in North America, and in 1782 was made Lord Dorchester. He was in Canada 20 years. His signature is genuine.
- 30 Original Letter of Capt. G. A. Byron to the Board of Ordnance, dated 10th Aug't, 1784, asking that an armourer be appointed to the *Druid*, which he commands. The request was complied with by Sir Guy Carleton, who signed the order of appointment, on the 31st August, 1784, with his own initials, "G. C." 1784
- 31 Original Letter of Capt. G. A. Byron to the Board of Ordnance, dated 5th of Oct., 1784, stating that as the armourer appointed in August failed to join the ship, Thomas Atkins be appointed in his place. Ordered by Sir Guy Carleton on the 15th Oct., 1784, by signing his own initials, "G. C." as before. 1784
- 32 "Lord Kepell's Paper relative to Lord Albemarle's Irish Concerns." The endorsement states that it is "touching several matters that he desires Mr. Bradfield would enquire into," etc. With Mr. Sharpe's remarks. The document is dated in July, 1786. 1786
Lord Kepell was guardian to Lord Albemarle.
- 33 Lord Dorchester's Original Signed Warrant for £500 6s. 8d. Dated "Quebec, 9th July, 1787." 1787
- 34 Lord Dorchester's Original Signed Warrant for £514 8s. 8d. Dated "Quebec, 19th Nov., 1787." 1787
- 35 Lord Dorchester's Original Signed Warrant for £623 16s. Dated "Quebec, 22nd Nov., 1787." 1787
- 36 Lord Dorchester's Original Signed Warrant for £696 15s. 8d. Dated "Quebec, 24th December, 1787." 1787
- 37 Original Memorial of Capt. Mc. Ginnis to Sir George Yonge, Secretary at War, dated Totaham, 20th June, 1790, praying that for his services (being also wounded and a prisoner at Ticonderoga) he be appointed Captain of "Invalides, or to other service." 1790
Yonge Street Toronto, and a township in the Province were named by Gov. Simcoe after his friend, Sir G. Yonge.
- 38 Original Memorial of Captain Burns to Sir George Yonge, dated "Pall Mall, August 3rd, 1790," praying that for raising the Royal Fencible Regiment and for his 20 years' service (being only on half pay) he be granted, as Captain, "a Company of Invalides, or Governor of the Garrison at Placentia," etc. 1790
- 39 Original Memorial to the King of Captain McOrae, dated "Nester Castle, 10th Oct., 1790," praying that for his long service, his privations, and many wounds, he be made Governor of Plymouth, or Captain of Orvex Castle. 1790
- 40 Original Memorial to the King of Colonel Peter Craig, dated London, Dec. 1st, 1790, praying that being the only officer remaining of the service of the Siege of Gibraltar, he receive "some mark of the King's favor," etc. 1790
- 41 Memorial to Sir George Yonge of Lieut. Fredk. Phillips Robinson, of the 28th Regiment (without date) praying for some additional appointment, he having served "14 years as a subaltern, and almost during the whole War in America, and was 18 months a prisoner with the Americans." 1791
This Memorial was that of Lieutenant (afterwards Sir) Frederick Phillips Robinson, Lieut.-Governor of Upper Canada in 1811-12. In his "History of the Loyalists of America," Rev. Dr. Ryerson, on page 199 of the second volume, recounts the services of Lieut.-General Sir F. P. Robinson. He served in the war of 1812, and remained in Upper Canada afterwards as Governor. He was the son of Colonel Beverley Robinson, formerly of Virginia, and was a relative of Sir John Beverley Robinson, Chief Justice of Upper Canada.
- 42 Letter to the Secretary at War of John Cole Bowen, dated the 3rd of Feby., 1791, and requesting an answer to a memorial which he had sent to the War Office, praying for an appointment as Lieut., in room of one of the officers that had got a company. 1791
- 43 Proxies of Members of the House of Lords. Proxy in Latin, of Lord Fortescue to Lord Graham, to act for him, as his true, certain and undoubted Agent, Attorney, etc. . . . with full power and authority to act for him and his name, in all things, business, etc., to be considered and decided in Parliament, to give advice, counsel, even to sign his name with such power as he himself might have, etc. 1792
Autograph signature of Lord "Fortescue."
- 44 The Same Form filled up by the Duke of Bedford in favour of Lord de Thanel to act for him as proxy. 1810
Autograph signature of the Duke of "Bedford."
- 45 The Same Form filled up by Lord Conyngham, authorizing Lord Keith to act for him as proxy. 1811
Autograph signature of Lord "Conyngham."
- 46 The Same Form filled up by Lord Hillsborough in favour of the Duke of Sussex to act as his proxy. 1815
Autograph signature of Lord "Hillsborough."
- 47 The Same Form filled up by Lord Charlemont in favour of Lord Holland as his proxy. 1819
Autograph signature of Lord "Charlemont."

53 Form of Canadian Rebel Commission. This blank form is signed in autograph by "John Montgomery, President"; "Robert Robertson, Secretary"; "H. S. Handy, Commander-in-Chief," etc.; "E. Roberts, Adjutant-General," etc. Two seals attached. 1839
On the margin an American eagle has seized the British Lion and holds him aloft in midair.

II.—Proclamations as Originally Printed in old style, and also other Official Documents issued by the Royal Governors of Upper and Lower Canada, 1792-1801.*

54 A Proclamation by John Graves Simcoe: To such as are desirous to settle on the Lands of the Crown in the Province of Upper Canada: By His Excellency John Graves Simcoe, Esquire. Dated at Quebec, 7th of February, 1792, and attested by Thos. Talbot, Acting Secretary. 1792

This Proclamation specifies the conditions, on which lots of 200 acres, and not more than 1,000 acres will be granted to persons who are "in a condition to cultivate and improve the same, and shall besides taking the usual oath, subscribe a Declaration . . . of the Tenor of the words following: I, do declare and declare that I will maintain and defend, to the utmost of my power, the Authority of the King in His Parliament, as the Supreme Legislature of this Province."

Thomas Talbot, the Acting Secretary, became the Hon. Thomas Talbot, founder of the Talbot Settlement in the County of Elgin.

55 This Proclamation was afterwards reprinted, as stated on it, by G. Tiffany, at Newark (Niagara), in 1795. 1792

56 A Proclamation by J. Graves Simcoe, dated at Kingston, on the 9th day of July, 1792, and printed by Fleury Mesplet, Montreal, is attested by Wm. Jarvis, Secretary. It is to the effect, that, under the Constitutional Act of 1791, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council is authorized to declare that the Judges, Justices and other Civil Officers of Upper Canada shall continue in office under the said Act, and that this Proclamation contained them accordingly. 1792

57 Order-in-Council, passed by His Excellency John Graves Simcoe in council, on the 6th of November, 1794, and attested by "John Small, Clerk of the Council." 1794

This Order-in-Council prescribes additional Regulations in the granting of Crown Lands "to the Loyalists and Reduced Troops," through the existing local Land Boards. It enjoins that "due care" be taken that none be admitted as settlers, "but those whose loyalty, industry and morals shall appear to entitle them to the benefits of His Majesty's Bounty and render them useful inhabitants of this Province." All persons professing the Christian Religion, and being capable of manual labor, who can produce satisfactory vouchers of their having paid obedience to the laws, and led a life of industrious manners in the Country in which they last resided, shall in future be considered as qualified to be admitted to the possession of lands within this Province, after having taken the oaths of Allegiance and Settlement prescribed by Act of Parliament." The fees prescribed including the Deed were 2s 6d. 1d.

59 Proclamation Regarding the U. E. Loyalist's Land Grants, dated the 21st day of August, 1795, and attested by "Wm. Jarvis, Secretary," directs that all Loyalists who had "received tickets, or certificates of occupation, or location," of Lands and all His Majesty's other subjects residing in the Western Midland, and Eastern Districts, "shall return these papers to the Clerk of the Peace, to be transmitted to Attorney General, so that the Grants authorised may be made. 1795

60 Proclamation Regarding the U. E. Loyalists. This important Proclamation by Governor Simcoe, is dated at York, on the 6th day of April, 1796, and is attested by E. B. Littlehales. It recites the minutes of the Council of Lord Dorchester, dated Quebec, 9th of November, 1793, in which the Governor-General desires to put a mark of honour upon the families who had adhered to the "Unity of the Empire," and joined the Royal Standard in America before the Treaty of Separation in 1793. The Proclamation then reiterates the orders of the Governor-General-in-Council to the effect that the several Land Boards should take course for preserving "Registry of the names of all persons falling under the description above mentioned to the end that their posterity might be discriminated from future settlers in the Parish Registers and Rolls of the Militia of their respective districts, and other public remembrances of the Province, as proper objects, by their preserving in the fidelity and conduct so honorable to their Ancestors for distinguished benefits and privileges."

But as the Proclamation states, "such registry has not been generally made; and, as it is still necessary to ascertain the persons, and families who may have distinguished themselves, as above mentioned, as well for the causes set forth, as for the purpose of fulfilling His Majesty's gracious intentions of setting such persons and families upon lands now about to be confirmed to them . . . Now know ye that I have thought proper . . . to direct . . . all persons claiming to be confirmed in their several possessions, who adhered to the 'Unity of the Empire' and joined the Royal Standard in

"America . . . to ascertain the same upon oath . . . in such manner and form as the Magistrates are directed to receive the same." 1796

62 Proclamation Respecting Forfeited Grants. This Proclamation, issued by Governor Simcoe, is dated at Government House, Navy Hall, Newark (Niagara), on the 25th day of May, 1796, to the effect that as it is a matter of public notoriety that many of the persons who made application for portions of the Ungranted Lands of the Province, in terms of the Proclamation bearing date on the 7th of Feb'y, 1792, "Have failed in the performance of the conditions required of them . . . by publicly and openly offering for sale such lands . . . and by many other sinister and illegal transactions, in manifest violation of the principles and conditions of the Proclamation aforesaid : Be it, therefore, known to all concerned that all such persons . . . have forfeited these lands ; that the Townships of Osgoode, Wolford, Montague, Russell, Kitley, Loughborough, Huntingdon, Rawdon, Murray, Clarke, Whitby, and Windham, are, and they are hereby declared to be vacant, and free for the admission of such persons as shall be desirous of occupying and settling the same agreeably to the terms and conditions of the Proclamation aforesaid." Attested by "John Small, C.C." (Clerk of the Council).

1796
63 Proclamation Imposing Charge for Surveys. This Proclamation dated at York, the 1st of July, 1796, and attested by J. Small, C.M.O., imposes a charge for surveys by Governor Simcoe, in addition to the fees already payable by Order-in-Council of the 6th of November, 1794. 1796

64 Proclamation Calling Parliament Together. This Proclamation was issued

at York by Governor Simcoe, on the 20th of July, 1796, directing that Election be held, and that Parliament do meet at York on the 16th of August, 1796. 1796

65 Surveyor - General's Notice to Land Claimants. This notice, dated the 29th of July, 1796, states that all recommendations for land must be presented before the 20th of August, "or they cannot be attended to." Signed by "D. W. Smith, Acting Surveyor-General." 1796
