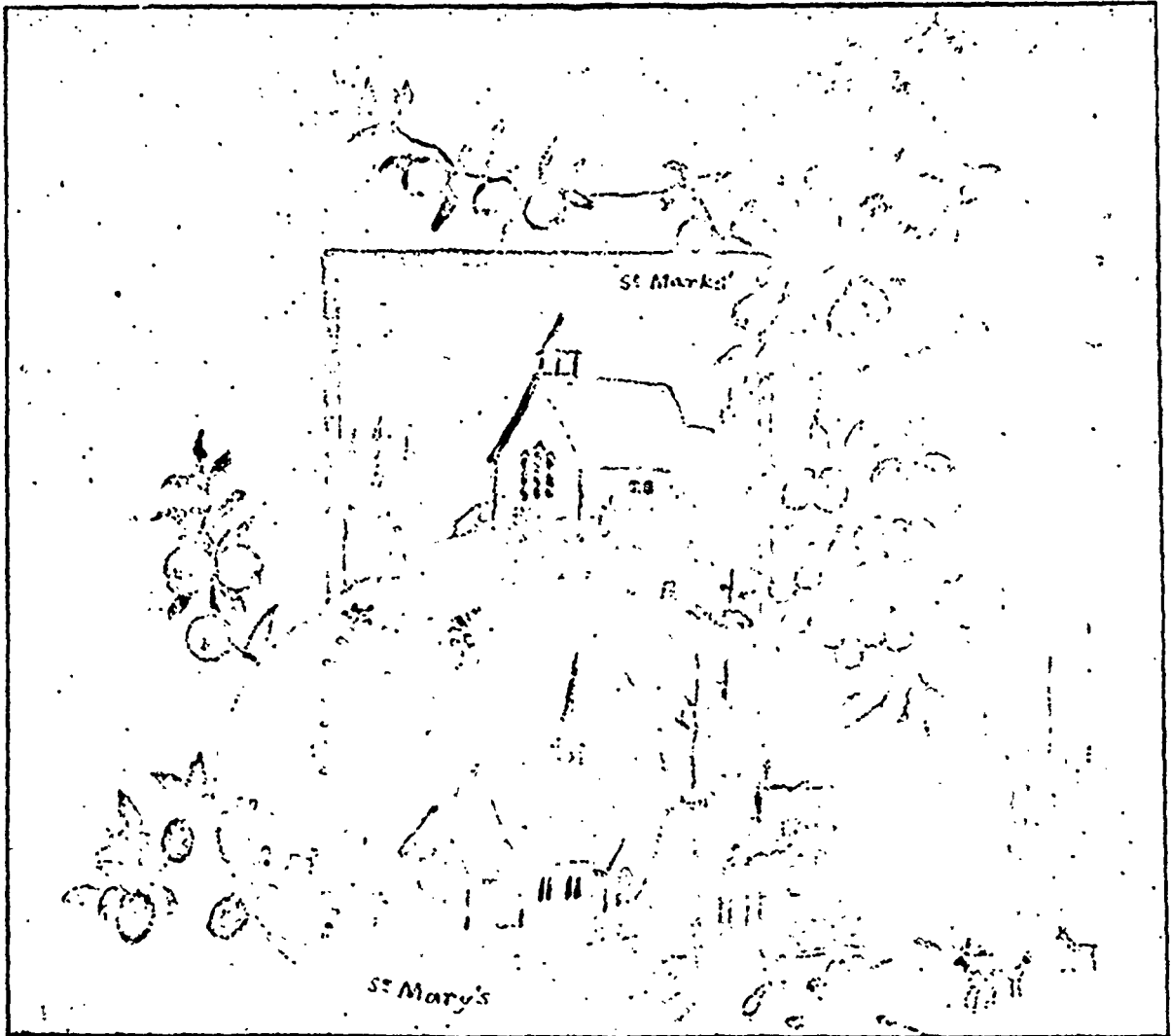

CHURCH SERVICES:

St. Mark's Church, Vancouver—Morning service 11 a.m., and Holy Communion the first Sunday in each month. Afternoon service 3.30 p.m. On all other Sundays, except when a fifth Sunday in the month occurs—evening service 7.30 p.m. Choir practice, St. Mark's, every Saturday evening.

North End School—Service 11 a.m. the third Sunday in each month.

Beaver Point School—Service 11 a.m. the fifth Sunday in the month, whenever there are five Sundays.

St. Mary's Church, Falford—Morning service 10.30 a.m. second and fourth Sundays in each month. Holy Communion on the fourth Sunday of every second month. Evening service the first Sunday of the month 7.30 p.m.

Home Sunday School—Children prepare Sunday School lessons in their own homes. Bible questions are given in Parish and Home. Instruction and examinations at their homes every two months.

Ladies' Church Guild—Meets once a month.

✓ Mr. Trage, of Beaver Point, expects to put up about 2,000 boxes of apples this season

○ Joel Broadwell is giving 30 cents cash for fresh eggs. His store business is on the increase.

At the confirmation at St. Mark's Church, August 26th, Miss Jenkins, Miss Beddis, Miss McFadden, George Booth and Lionel Beddis were confirmed.

The present school teachers are Mr. Page at the Central, Miss Brethour at North End, Miss Shrapnell at the Divide, Miss Furness at Burgoyne, Mr. Morrison at Beaver Point.

Weather Report for August—Kuper Island: Mean temperature, 60.3; maximum, 80.0 (on 19th); minimum, 39.0 (on 26th); mean proportion of bright sunshine, .40; maximum, .80 (on 3rd); days completely clouded, 1; rainfall, 1.07 inches.

Note—For intelligent answers, giving chapter and verse, 5 marks are given for each question in the first class, 4 in the second, 3 in the third. Also extra marks, each examination, for good spelling and tidiness. To a question last April, "Were the sons of Eli good or bad?" one child answered "Bad"; another, more intelligently,—"I. Samuel, 2, 12. Now the sons of Eli were sons of Belial; they knew not the Lord." That is the best way to answer.

HOME SUNDAY SCHOOL.—*First Class*—Out of 880 marks, Arthur Walter, 831; Mary Walter, 814, May Richards, 724; Rose Whims, 601; Mary McFadden, 522; two others less. Catechism—May Richards, full marks. *Second Class*—Out of 370 marks, Martha Whims, 287; Chester Samson, 222; Edwin McFadden, 158, nine others less. Catechism—Elsie Norton, 39 out of 40. *Third Class*—Out of 207 marks, Carrie McFadden, 133; Charlie Samson, 129; Bella Nightingale, 103; T. Mansell, 69; twelve others less. Catechism—Bella Nightingale, 60 out of 75. First and second prizes will be given in each class, and an extra one for catechism.

○ The Caterpillars did \$1,287 damage north of the Divide, \$357 south of the Divide.

○ According to statistics recently gathered, there are at present about 130 horses, 550 cattle, 2,400 sheep, and 480 pigs on Salt Spring Island.

○ Of 45,440 acres, the entire area of the Island, only about 3,700 acres is as yet "slashed"; and of that, not more than 1,700 acres are actually under cultivation.

Harvest Thanksgiving services have been deferred until October 11th and 12th, when the Ven. Archdeacon Scriven will be present to speak about the Diocesan debt and the means proposed for its removal.

At the garden party and ladies' sale of work which took place at Mr. Wilson's house on Monday, August 27th, and to which the Bishop kindly remained after the confirmation, the sum of \$31.50 was realized. The Guild will resume its work Friday, October 5th.

(15) Tell about the lion and the bear. *Third Class*—(16) How high was Goliath? (17) Why was David not afraid? (18) How did David kill the giant? (19) What did he do with his head? (20) Who was David's father?
