The Depository and the Office of the CHURCH SOCIETY OF THE DIOCESE OF TORONTO is at No. 8 Wellington Buildings, King-street, Toronto.

Benefactions from any persons, whether members or not, towards the Society's general objects, or to any particular branch of them, and all payments on the Society's account, will be received by remittances, or by payment at the Society's office, or by the Secretary or Treasurer of any of the District Branches.

It is requested that the Annual Accounts of District Branches, and a list of all members in their respective Districts, may be transmitted by or before the last day of March in each year.

Forms of Conveyance for securing the title of lands to the Bishop, the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, or the Incumbent or Rector of any particular living, may be obtained at the Society's house.

A general meeting of the incorporated members is held at three o'clock p.m. on the second Wednesday in every month, August and September excepted.

The stated monthly meetings of the Standing Committee are held at three o'clock p. m. on the first Wednesday in each month, August and September excepted. During Lent these meetings are held on the Thursday subsequent.

The quarterly collections to be made in the several churches, chapels, and stations will be applied to the following objects: General Purpose Fund, or any special object the Society may determine on, in the month of January; Students' Fund, in April; Mission Fund, in July; Widows and Orphans' Fund, in October.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto ;

INCORPORATED BY THE STATUTE OF CANADA, 7 VICTORIA, CAP. 68,
FOR PROMOTING THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS:

FIRST—For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Toronto, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.

SECONDLY—For the encouragement of Education, and for the support of Day-schools and Sunday-schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.

THIRDLY—For granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church, within the said Diocese.

FOURTHLY—For circulating in the said Diocese the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the Central Board or Managing Committee of the said Association.

FIFTHLY—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment, and maintenance of Churches, according to the establishment of the said Church, in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage-houses; the setting apart of Burial-grounds and Church-yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowment.

I.

That before the Society shall enter upon business at any of its meetings, the following prayers be said:—

“PRESENT us, O Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.”

"O GOD, from Whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign Queen VICTORIA, and so rule her heart, that she may in all things seek Thy honour and glory. Prosper with thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in this Province, and the labours of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in foreign parts. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory, and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

"O MERCIFUL GOD, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but rather that he should be converted and live: have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, Infidels, and heretics, and also upon all those heathen nations upon whom the light of Thy glorious Gospel hath not yet shone; especially the Indians of this continent. Bless the means used for their civilization and conversion, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word: and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

"OUR FATHER, which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil; for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*"

AND WHEN BUSINESS IS ENDED:

"ALMIGHTY GOD, Father of all mercies, we thine unworthy servants do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness and loving-kindness to us and to all men: more particularly for the providential support by which this Society hath been enabled to spread abroad the knowledge of Thy sacred truth. But above all, for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy blessed Son; for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory, which Thou hast given us, in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ: to Whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost be all honour and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

"The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. *Amen.*"

II.

That all those who are now, or who shall hereafter become Members of the Association, and who shall subscribe Ten Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute as much as Five Pounds in one sum, shall be Associated Members of the Society, and shall be eligible to be Members of the Corporation.

III.

That every Incorporated Member subscribe not less than One Pound Five Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute not less than Twelve Pounds Ten Shillings in one sum, or land to the value of Twenty-five Pounds; and that the Standing Committee be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation as Life Members, who shall have contributed through any of the Parochial Associations in connexion with the Society, in money, the sum of Twenty Pounds, or in land to the value of Thirty Pounds, for any of the following special purposes:—To be invested or held in trust for the Widows and Orphans' Fund; to

be invested or held in trust for the endowment of a Church-school, and that it shall be the duty of the Secretary at the Meeting in the month of October in each and every year to make a return of those who have not paid up the 2s. for the year ending the 31st day of March previous, and that he shall propose that such names be erased from the list of Incorporated Members.

IV.

That the Corporation shall consist of the Bishop of Toronto for the time being, of the members appointed by the Charter, and of so many of the other Associated Members of the Society as shall be elected by ballot Members of the Corporation, at the meetings to be from time to time holden on the days and at the place appointed by the By-laws of the Corporation for its stated meetings. Provided always that the whole number of Members of the said Corporation, in addition to those who are made Members by the Statute, shall at no time exceed three hundred, and that the whole number of Members of the Corporation shall never be less than one hundred.

V.

That the Standing Committee of the Society, to be appointed as provided in one of the following By-laws, be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation, without reference to the limitation of numbers.

VI.

That the Lord Bishop of Toronto for the time being shall be President of the Society, and the Venerable the Archdeacons within the Diocese shall be Vice-Presidents.

VII.

That the Society shall, at their Meeting on the second Wednesday in June in each year, choose one or more Vice-President or Vice-Presidents in addition to the Archdeacons; one or more Treasurer or Treasurers; two or more Auditors; one Secretary; and such other officers, ministers, and servants, as shall be thought convenient, to serve in the said offices for the year ensuing. Provided always, that no person not a member of the Society be eligible to any office.

VIII.

That the paid officers of the Society to be appointed by the foregoing rule, shall be a Secretary, and a subordinate officer to be selected by himself; that the former shall be in Holy Orders, uncharged with Parochial cure, and that he shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the Solicitor to the amount of £1000, himself in £500, and two sureties in £250 each. Also the Auditors.

IX.

That the Standing Committee shall propose to the Board at the General Meeting in October a list of seven Members of the Society, to form the Tract and Book Committee for the year ensuing; that at that meeting any member be at liberty to propose another list of seven members of the Society, instead of that proposed by the Standing Committee; and that the election of the Tract and Book Committee take place at the General Meeting in October.

X.

That if it shall happen that any of the persons at any time chosen into any of the said offices shall die, or on any account be removed from such office at any time during the period for which he was elected or appointed to serve, in such case the President, or any one of the Vice-Presidents, shall convene a meeting, to be held at the usual place of meeting of the Society, at such time as shall be specified in the notice of such meeting; and that such Members of the Corporation as shall be present at the meeting, or a majority of them, shall and may choose an officer or officers in

the room or place of such person or persons so dead or removed, as to them shall seem meet. Provided, that it shall not be necessary for any such Meeting to be called for supplying a vacancy in the office of Vice-President: but the President may do so in his discretion.

XI.

That the Society shall and may, on the second Wednesday in every month, excepting the months of August and September, hereafter, and oftener if occasion requires, meet at the place heretofore used for the transaction of the business of the said Society, or such other place as may be hereafter appointed for that purpose; and that the President or Standing Committee have power to call a Special Meeting of the said Society at any time. In Lent the meetings to be holden on Thursday instead of Wednesday.

XII.

That no act done in any meeting of the said Society shall be valid and effectual, unless the President, or some one of the Vice-Presidents, shall be present at such Meeting.

XIII.

And with regard to all meetings of the Society, and to the making, altering or repealing any By-laws, Rules or Regulations, at such Meetings, it is to be specially noticed, that by the Act of the Legislature incorporating this Society (7 Vic. ch. 68), it is enacted that no act done in such Assembly or meeting of the Corporation shall be valid or effectual, unless six persons of the Corporation, at the least, shall be present, and the major part of them consenting thereto.

And further, that no Constitution, By-law, Rule or Regulation of the Society, nor any abrogation, repeal, change or alteration of the same, shall be passed, except notice of such intention shall have been given at the previous monthly meeting, and then it shall not be of any force or effect until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, or administering, the Diocese for the time being, by writing under his hand.

XIV.

That there shall be a Standing Committee (three of whom shall be a quorum), to prepare the business for the Monthly Meetings of the Society.

That the President, Vice-Presidents, Rural Deans and Secretary, be *ex officio* members of the Standing Committee.

That the other members of the Standing Committee, not exceeding twenty in number, shall be elected by the Society out of its Incorporated Members residing in the City of Toronto and its vicinity, also of a Clerical and Lay Member from each of the several District Branch Associations in connection with the Parent Society, to be elected annually by such Branch Association.

That of the non-official Members of the Standing Committee residing in the City of Toronto and its vicinity, the four who having been on the Standing Committee for one entire year, have attended the fewest meetings of the Standing Committee during the twelve months ending on the first Wednesday in March, shall go out at the Annual Meeting in June; and if any doubt shall arise under this rule, which Member of those who have attended the fewest meetings is to retire, then the one who has served the shortest time on the Committee shall be considered to have vacated his seat.

That the Standing Committee shall recommend to the Society at its Meeting in March in each year four Members to be elected in the place of the four retiring Members, who shall not be eligible for the ensuing year.

That any Member of the Society wishing to propose other candidates for election on the Standing Committee, be required to give in the names of such candidates to be proposed by him, at or before the Monthly Meeting in March.

XV.

That Minutes of all the proceedings of the Society be taken, and that at each meeting of the Society the Minutes of the preceding meeting be read by the Secretary, and signed by the Chairman.

XVI.

That the accounts of the Society be closed on the thirtieth day of April in each year; and that the same be audited within one month from that date.

XVII.

That the Secretary conduct the correspondence of the Society, take Minutes of the proceedings of the General Meetings and Committees, prepare the Annual Report of the Society, attend meetings of the Branches throughout the Diocese under the direction of the President, and take the general superintendence of the affairs and accounts of the Society in all its departments.

XVIII.

In connection and correspondence with the Society, District Associations shall be established, comprising one or more Districts (as shall be approved by the President), the same to be composed of the Clergy resident within the bounds of the same, and all other Members of the Church who shall contribute in aid of the Society's Funds; the Archdeacon, or Senior Clergyman resident within its bounds, shall *ex officio* be Chairman of such District Branch Associations, with whom shall be associated, as composing a Committee of Management, the Clergy of the several Parishes or Missions within the bounds of such District, and one or more Laymen from each of the same, and a Secretary and Treasurer.

A General Meeting of each Branch District Association shall be held in each year, at any time and place which may be agreed upon at a previous Quarterly Meeting of the Committee of Management; and Quarterly Meetings of the Committee of Management—not less than five to form a quorum—shall be held for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Branch Association.

In order the more fully to carry out the objects of the Society, each parish, in the person of its Clergyman and Churchwardens, shall be a Sub-Association, in correspondence, through its Chairman (the Clergyman) with the District Branch Association, and may be denominated, *The Parochial Committee of the Church Society*. The Committee shall meet so often, and at such periods, as they shall themselves decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the Parishioners in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour by every means in their power to augment the resources of the Society. All monies raised to be transmitted to the Treasurer of the District Association.

The Treasurer of each District Association shall transmit annually the full sum of £1 5s. for each duly recognized Clergyman, and also for each incorporated member within his district, and in case of life membership the full sum of £12 10s., together with one-fourth of all the monies paid into his hands, to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto, to be at the disposal of the Central Board, and the remaining three-fourths of such collections shall, when required, be expended within the Parish or District in which they have been made, for such objects only as are specified in the Constitution of the Society—the allotment to be made at the Quarterly Meetings of the District Branch Association. All monies not required to be expended for local purposes, and remaining unappropriated at the General Annual Meeting of the District Associations, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto.

The District Associations, through their respective Secretaries, shall communicate to the Secretary of the Parent Society at Toronto a minute statement of all receipts and expenditures within the sphere of their operations, embodied in the form of a Report, one in each year, so soon as convenient after the General Annual Meeting of such District Branch Associations.

XIX.

That four Sermons be preached annually in the several Churches, Chapels, and Stations in this Diocese, in aid of the funds of the Society, at such times as the Lord Bishop shall appoint; that of these collections the proceeds of one shall be for the benefit of the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen deceased; of another, for the

maintenance of Travelling or Resident Missionaries in this Diocese; of another, to aid Theological Students; and that the proceeds of the fourth shall be appropriated to any other objects embraced within its Constitution, as the Society may from time to time direct.

XX.

That no application for a grant, loan, or other assistance, be entertained from any Rectory, Incumbency or Mission, in which there shall not have been established a "Parochial Committee" of this Society under the provisions of the article of the Constitution thereof, reporting to and in communication with the Parent Society, and in which all the requirements of said Constitution shall not have been complied with, unless upon the omission of such requirement a special written dispensation shall have been obtained within three months of the date thereof; and further, that accompanying such application there be a distinct accurate description of the object towards which aid is sought, together with a detailed account of the sum of money collected in the locality or elsewhere towards the same object, and how applied: Provided nevertheless, that it shall be at all times competent for the President to recommend to the Standing Committee any case which in his Lordship's opinion may require special consideration; and should the Standing Committee report favourably thereon, that the Society may in such case grant the assistance so sought, or any portion thereof; and further, that no application be entertained from the Widow or Orphan or the guardian of the Orphan of any deceased Clergyman of this Diocese who shall not have conformed to the provisions and requirements of a certain By-law entitled a "By-law for the due administration and improving the Widows and Orphans' Fund of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto," and also of any amendments to the said By-law, which may be enacted from time to time according to the provisions of the Constitution of the said Society, unless upon the omission of any of the said requirements a special written dispensation had been granted by his Lordship the President, and forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months after the date thereof. Provided, nevertheless, that it shall be at all times competent for the President to recommend to the Standing Committee any case which in his Lordship's opinion may require special consideration, and should the Standing Committee report favourably thereon, that then the Society may grant such proportion of any annuity as to said Society may seem fit; and that it be the duty of the Secretary, after each Annual Meeting of the Society, to notify to each Clergyman whether he have or have not complied with the requests which would entitle his Widow and Orphans to the pension.

XXI.

That the Charter and these By-laws do together form the Constitution of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, and that nothing which is contained in the Constitution of the Society established on the 28th day of April, 1842, or in any By-law, Rule, or Regulation, amending or altering the same, shall apply to or be in force in respect to, the Incorporated Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, except such provisions thereof as are above continued in force.

PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING AT TORONTO, HELD ON
WEDNESDAY, JUNE 11TH, 1856.

In presenting this, their Fourteenth Annual Report, your committee hasten to congratulate the Diocese at large on the numerous attendance of clergy and laity at the meeting of the Synod lately held in this city. The Church in this province is now no tender plant; but, thanks to Him in whom and by whom the Church universal lives and grows, it has taken deep root and is spreading wide its arms over the length and breadth of our land. Churchmen are now too numerous and too influential for their righteous demand of freedom of Synodical action to be long denied them. The jealousy of some may attempt to withhold it, but that love of justice which marks the British character must eventually influence even those who would not only concede no favor to the Church, but would gladly see her depressed. Your committee, therefore, feel that they are not over sanguine in looking forward to the constitutional attainment of this most desirable object, before this Society's annual meeting again returns.

Your committee see in the periodical assembly of clergy and laity in Synod, and the more frequent interchanges of opinions, and more perfect blending of interests which must follow, the happiest results as regards the special objects for which this society has been formed. They hope that by this and other means, new energies will be infused; new elements incorporated; new plans of action promulgated, and the general usefulness of this society widely extended.

Another subject to which your committee look forward with great interest, and in which also they see a hopeful future for the various purposes of this society, is the establishment of new

bishoprics. The Parent Society may indeed at first suffer a diminution of its funds by the division of the present Diocese; but, where each of the new Dioceses has its own Church Society, it is but reasonable to hope that from so many centres of vitality an increased aggregate amount of energetic action will result, and that the portions of the province now remote from the centre of motion, will feel the beneficial influence.

There is yet one other cause to which your Committee look with good hope for the future in connection with the interests of this Society, and that is, the establishment of Parochial Schools wherever practicable; and where circumstances will not admit of this, the adaptation by the clergy of the present system of common school education to the wants of the Church. Your committee feel that where the distinctive principles of the Church are faithfully inculcated in youth, there then will generally be in after life a true love of the Church, an intelligent appreciation of her ordinances, &c., zealous liberality in maintaining her efficiency and increasing her power to do good. Convinced as your committee are that the making missionary objects a more prominent feature of the Society's working than they are at present would interest many who, from having grown up in the lack of sound church principles, are now lukewarm in the cause, they regard more strenuous efforts to take hold of and secure the affections and sympathies of the young, as that means on which the best interests of this Society, and of the Church mainly, under God, depend. The missionary spirit is a direct consequence of a heartfelt conviction of the privileges of Churchmen: implant a knowledge of the latter, as our duty is, and trust God's grace to do the rest. Were there more of an earnest appreciation of our own privileges, there would be greater desire to impart them to others; and this disinterested christian spirit widely manifested, could not but be productive of good to those who are separated from our communion by no difference of doctrine, and to win whom back to the Church of their Fathers, is now so earnestly sought by many in the mother country. But, with all their hopeful expectations for the future, your committee cannot look with entire complacency on the results of the Society's work during the year which has just closed. Much indeed has been done, and the income of the Society on which its efficient working depends, has exceeded that of former years: but when your committee know how bountifully the Giver of all good has blessed the province, how wonderfully its resources are being developed, and its productive industry multiplied, they cannot but feel that there has been nothing like a commensurate increase in the Society's income. If, when wheat is from 8s. to 10s. per bushel, the farmer gives no more to the support of the objects of this Society than when he received only from 4s. to 5s., so far as the individual is concerned this is a going back—a result to be as much deplored as if his covetousness withheld one half of his former offering. The rise in the value of property has

brought with it a general taste for speculation, and it is to be feared that many of those who in times of less prosperity had means to devote to religious purposes, now find that tempting investments leave them little or nothing for the cause of God. These things ought not so to be! The happy return of peace, which ensured the progress of railway enterprise and other improvements in the province, and the cheering prospect of an abundant harvest, should stir us up to greater zeal in religion, and greater liberality, in gratitude for our temporal mercies. And does not the Church require a little more liberality in her children, a little more self-denial, if need be? Undoubtedly she does. Your committee have ascertained that the commutation fund, though invested in the most favorable ways consistent with prudence, can hardly be expected to meet the stipends of even the present clergy, without touching on the capital. Hence is demonstrated the necessity of a Sustentation Fund, to provide for the increasing demand for new labourers in the Lord's vineyard; but your committee see in this no real difficulty, no cause of apprehension; they only see the necessity of urging strongly upon their fellow churchmen the course of duty. Let but the offerings of churchmen now bear but the same proportion to their present incomes as they did to their incomes four or five years ago, and the difficulty will be fully met. In nine cases out of ten it may be fairly said that the farmer who in 1850 gave five dollars to aid the objects of the Society is now better able to give five pounds, and if so, he cannot escape the charge of the robbery of God, if he withhold what he can so well afford. Will a man rob God? Yet, ye have robbed me; but ye say, wherein have we robbed Thee? In tithes and offerings—Mal. iii. 8.

INCOME.

Your committee now submit a brief statement of the Society's general income, and of the income and expenditure on account of its several objects, a more detailed account of which will be furnished in the appendix to the printed Report.

The income of the Parent Society for the year ending 30th April last, exclusive of the monies received for special trusts, the sum of £187 4s. 11d. belonging to the previous year's income, acknowledged in the appendix to the last report to have been received after the books were closed and audited, and also the sum of £140 which was on account of returned investments,

When your committee take into consideration that reports have yet to be received from associations which usually contribute liberally, that the Parochial Associations in the Midland district, with the exception of St. George's, Kingston, in consequence of the inclemency of the winter determined to postpone their operations on behalf of the Society until the summer, when they might calculate on receiving assistance at their meetings from their distant brethren; and also that many more collections on account of the General Purpose Fund, and Students' Fund, appointed to be taken up in January and April, will yet be received, they feel that they have good grounds for congratulating the Society on the success which has attended its operations during the past year, and for calling upon its members gratefully to acknowledge their indebtedness to the Bountiful Disposer of events, by whose grace alone the hearts of men are inclined earnestly to engage in works of piety and charity.

Though the statement of the Society's affairs now submitted may, on the whole, be considered highly satisfactory; nevertheless your committee are persuaded that if greater pains were taken in some parishes to set forth the importance of the various objects embraced in the constitution of the Society the subscriptions would be more liberal, and the subscribers far more numerous. Your committee would urge upon the clergy and the officers of associations the great necessity for punctuality in taking up and transmitting the collections to the Parent Society, as the course at present in many instances adopted not only causes errors and creates confusion in the statements from time to time published, but also prevents the society from reporting at the close of its financial year an exact statement of the receipts on account of each of its funds.

The previous year the amount reported at the time of reading the Report was £1316 9s. 7d., from 725 stations, over £100 was subsequently received; and as collections from many stations on account of two funds have not yet been received, your committee trust the above sum, given as the proceeds of the Quarterly sermons for the past year, will be much augmented before the appendix to the report is printed.

MISSION FUND.

Last year your committee were enabled to announce an increase in the amount collected for the Mission Fund, which they accounted for by the fact that collections had been taken up at 45 more stations; this year collections have been received from 9 new stations, and in consequence, the increase over the previous year is £41 2s. 4d.—viz., £386 8s. 4d., in lieu of £345 6s. 0d.—£15 1s. 4d. of which have been received since the 30th of April. The only interest received on investments on this account, was that derived from the stock in the Bank of Upper Canada. The parties on whose property the Society holds a mortgage of £1000, the bequest of the late Dr. Burnside, promise to pay up in a short time both principal and interest; and offer to give a site for a church at Port Perry, a rising village which they have at a large outlay built upon the lot. The inhabitants of the township of Warwick, having refused to assume the debt incurred by the late rector, in erecting a good substantial brick parsonage towards which only £1 was subscribed in the parish; the Society, in consideration of the exertions made by the Rev. Mr. Mockridge in collecting the money required for the building, and his having shortly afterwards left the mission, determined not to exact the payment of the bond given by him and four others, who never resided in the parish; £100 will therefore be transferred for investment on account of this fund from the General Purpose Fund. The disbursements and liabilities assumed by the Society on this account during the past year amount to £601 19s. 2d., of which sum £406 12s. 9d. were for our Indian missions—viz:

The Tecumseth and West Gwillimbury associations devote the whole of the three-fourths at the disposal of their district to the Missionary cause. The Missionary at Nottawasaga is partly supported by them, and they are prepared to assist liberally towards the support of another clergyman when the mission is divided. Two Missionaries are paid by the Gore and Wellington district branch; one in the county Grey, and the other in the county of Wellington, at an outlay of £300; and the same branch pays £60 towards the income of the Missionary resident at Owen Sound.

This fund, at the disposal of the Parent Society, being now pledged to the amount of £437 6s., it must be evident to all that great exertions to augment its resources must be made, in order to enable the Society to meet its present engagements; but, in addition, there are many new Missions prepared to contribute liberally towards the support of a clergyman who shall reside in their midst, but they rely upon the society to help them. After the next ordination, your committee hope that men will be found to supply some of these missions; they therefore earnestly entreat the members of our church to come to their aid, and not oblige the Society to plead want of funds in answer to the numerous applications. Your committee gratefully acknowledge a donation to this fund of £65 from the Hon. J. H. Cameron, to whom the Church is already so largely indebted.

WIDOWS AND ORPHANS' FUND.

Collections have been made for this object at 212 stations, whereas last year they were taken up at only 191 stations. The amount collected, £484 15s. 3d., is a little in excess of the previous year.

The interest on investments and instalments on loans and annual subscriptions received during the year amounted to £552 15s. 8d., making the total receipts £1153 15s. 5d. £280 have been paid on account of pensions to widows and orphans, and £271 4s. 7d. instalments and taxes on lands held for this trust, and £750 added to the investments.

Your committee have to deplore the removal by death of two of the clergy who were ever zealous supporters of this Society, and regularly advocated all its objects. Honourable mention both of the Rev. W. Greig, and the Rev. J. R. Tooke, was made by our beloved Diocesan in his late charge, and we have every reason to hope that what is our loss is their eternal gain. Two widows and five orphans have been thereby added to the number of claimants on this fund.

GENERAL PURPOSES FUND.

Up to the 30th of April, only 164 collections had been received on this account, amounting to £302 12s. 11d.; a further sum of

£13 4s. 1d. has since been received—collected at twelve stations. Add to this sum monies received from parochial associations and annual subscriptions and donations, and the sum belonging to this fund received on account of the past year amounted to £1466 0s. 6d. Grants were made from this fund to the amount of £101 9s. 9d., viz., in books and tracts £66 9s. 9d.; to parsonage, Port Burwell, £12 10s.; Belleville Church £12 10s.; Mrs. Graham, £100, and several other grants have been promised so soon as the funds will admit of their being paid. As office expenses, rent, printing, and the general management of all the affairs of the Society have to be deducted from the above sum; the balance to the credit of this fund is at present totally inadequate to the pressing demands upon it.

STUDENTS' FUND.

When it is admitted by all, that there is very great difficulty in inducing young men to devote themselves to the sacred work of the ministry, it might reasonably be expected that every exertion would be made on the part of the clergy, at least, to sustain the fund which is raised for the purpose of encouraging and assisting young men seeking to obtain such an education as might, with God's blessing, fit them to undertake the office with credit to themselves and benefit to the church. Such expectations, however, have not been realized—fewer collections have been taken up for this object than for any other. When the books were placed in the auditors' hands only 75 collections had been reported, amounting to £125 3s. 2d.; since that time £69 7d. has been received from 29 stations; and, as the collection is appointed to be taken up in the last month of the society's financial year, a further sum may be expected. But your committee are aware that in some quarters there is a misconception as to the condition on which divinity scholarships are tenable at Trinity College; they think it well therefore to state, that any person offering himself as a candidate for such a scholarship is considered by that act to avow a deliberate purpose of devoting himself to the ministry of the church; and if, at any subsequent period, circumstances should compel an abandonment of this purpose, he is held to be bound in honor to tender forthwith his resignation of the scholarship, and to refund any sums he may have received in respect of it. Eight young men have received assistance in their theological studies from this fund.

LANDS.

The following deeds of sites for churches, burial grounds and trust to the society: Samuel Thompson, Esq., to C. S. D. T., part of lot No. 34, con. 2 from the Bay, township of York; lots 11 & 12, east side of King street, village of Carlton—for a church, and *no other purpose.*

W. M. Westmacott, Esq. and Uxor, to C. S. D. T., lot No. 10, east side of Cathcart Street, and north side of St. Vincent street, town of Sydenham, county of Grey, for the Mission Fund, half an acre.

DISTRICT AND PAROCHIAL BRANCHES.

St. James's Parochial Branch, Toronto.

The Collector's return for the year shows the sum of £120 subscribed, the whole of which has not yet been collected; and it is a matter of much regret that in a time of general prosperity there should be a falling off in place of an increase in the amount.

The Committee recommend that after the usual proportion to the Parent Society is paid, the balance may be distributed to aid the Parochial and Sunday Schools, and the Library.

Church of the Holy Trinity, Toronto.

In their last year's Report the Committee informed the congregation that a lot of land near the Church had been purchased, with the intention of building Parochial Day and Sunday Schools; but they found that the instalments to be paid were larger than the means at their disposal enabled them to liquidate, and after mature consideration, they determined to dispose of it, and succeeded in doing so at a profit of nearly £90. Most anxious to establish Schools under the supervision of the Clergy, they authorized the Rev. Mr. Darling to rent a house and engage the services of a master and mistress, which he did, but unfortunately the landlord, on finding that it was intended for a school, refused to complete the agreement, and as no other suitable house could be procured, it had to be given up. They then turned their attention to other plans to accomplish the same object; and Mr. Hay having gratuitously prepared plans, they were laid before the Incumbent and his Lordship the Bishop, who have approved of them and promised their assistance. The estimated cost is £1000, to accommodate two hundred children, of which £430 has been already subscribed; and when the congregation remember that by carrying out this very important plan they will secure for the young the blessings of a sound religious education in accordance with the teaching of the Church, they cannot for one moment doubt the success of their endeavors. They are aware that to found these Schools will entail an additional expense upon the congregation, owing to their having to pay taxes to support the present Common Schools; but the Committee trust they value the privilege of being Churchmen too highly to hesitate to make the pecuniary sacrifice when such important results are at stake.

Etobicoke.

The Parochial Branch of St. George's Church, reports its collections as £20 16s. 11d., of which the sum of £15 14s. 3d. has been paid into the Parent Society, and £5 2s. 8d. has been retained for parochial purposes.

From the Mimico Church is reported the sum of £5 2s. 6d., of which £3 has been paid into the Parent Society, and £2 2s. 6d. retained for Parochial purposes.

Total in Etobicoke £25 19s. 5d., being an increase of £6 19s. 8d. over the preceding year.

Weston.

Though this parish receives no assistance towards the support of its minister, the amount collected annually for the Church Society will compare favorably with any parish in the Diocese. this branch collected this year the sum of £19 17s. 4d., and remitted the whole to the Parent Society, on the understanding that any sums required for the purchase of books for the use of their Sunday School or Parochial library, not exceeding three-fourths of the amount paid in (independent of the incorporate members' subscriptions), would be granted by the Society: during the two previous years only £2 10s. was annually applied for by this branch.

Scarborough

Reports—The Church Society—if it does not meet with any extraordinary success in this mission—can at least boast of making steady progress; and the yearly increasing subscription list, amid frequent local calls, testifies to our appreciation of the usefulness of the Society, and our desire through it to extend the ministrations of the Church to those who are yet destitute of them.

Thornhill and Vaughan Parochial Association.

The Committee entrusted with the management of the affairs of these united associations, in laying their Annual Statement before the subscribers, beg leave to report:

1st. That the income from subscriptions for the past year amounted to £38 4s. 10d., being a slight increase over that of the preceding year from the same source.

2nd. That the Quarterly Collections in aid of this Society's funds were made during the past year in all the Churches within the mission at the time and in the manner prescribed by the Society's by-law, and the proceeds, amounting to £15 4s. 6d., remitted to the Parent Society in full, to be placed to the credit of the undermentioned special funds, in the following proportions:—Widows and Orphans' Fund, £5 4s. 5d.; Mission Fund, £2 12s. 3d.; Theological Students' Fund, £2 5s. 10d.; General Purpose Fund, £2 2s. 2d.

3rd. That £16 17s. 3d., the due proportion of the Annual Subscription Fund, was remitted to the Society; making, with the Quarterly Collections, a sum total of £32 1s. 9d. contributed by these associations to the Parent Society from all sources during the past year.

4th. That the residue of the year's income was paid proportionally to the proper officers, to be expended under the supervision of the local committee, upon objects embraced within the constitution.

5th. That from the foregoing statement it will appear that the total income of these branches for the past year amounted to £53 9s. 4d., shewing, as contrasted with £51, the income of the preceding year, an excess of £2 9s. 4d., a sum which, however—insignificant in itself, and falling far short of what might reasonably have been anticipated from a community so wealthy, still affords gratifying proof that the year's income has at least not fallen short of the average. Your committee are of opinion that this favorable result is mainly attributable to the active zeal of those devoted members of the Church who voluntarily undertook the duty of collecting—a duty which they have for a number of years, amid many discouragements, continued zealously to discharge, at no small personal inconvenience to themselves, and in a spirit of Christian devotedness rarely equalled.

6th. That while our humble and devout thanksgivings are justly due to the Author of all good for this and similar instances of his favor; your committee, nevertheless, feel that we must not stand still nor suffer ourselves to rest satisfied for the future merely with the measure of liberality and success which may have distinguished the past, if we would worthily perform our part towards enabling the Church to extend her ministrations so as to keep pace with the growing wants of the population. We must practically evince the reality of the interest we take in the accomplishment of this truly Christian object, by beneficence somewhat in correspondence with the importance of the objects we have in view, and our debt of gratitude to a gracious Providence for the unexampled prosperity that has of late marked the progress of our country in all its material interests, if we would have the consolation of reflecting that we "have done what we could."

There are in the present circumstances of our country many things well calculated to awaken gratitude and call for the display of an enlarged spirit of Christian benevolence. While our fellow subjects in the British Isles are involved in the vast expense and unspeakable horrors of a bloody and desolating war the people of this favoured province have enjoyed uninterrupted peace,—no hostile force has threatened their borders—they have tilled their fields in peace, and reaped immense advantage from a vast pecuniary outlay without themselves incurring additional burthens. For such signal blessings, no one surely, at all imbued with the

sincere spirit of gratitude, can be unthankful ; or refuse to mark his sense of obligation, by making suitable offerings to the cause of God and his Church, out of the abundance wherewith he has thus been blessed.

For the manifestation and exercise of this commendable spirit of gratitude and liberality, there is within this Diocese, at the present moment, the most urgent need not only to supply the religious wants of a growing population, as before remarked, but also to mitigate the injury inflicted on the Church by the recent act of spoliation.

After the passage of that act it was open to the clergy either to demand the payment of their guaranteed stipends in full during their lives or incumbences, or to commute their life-interests for a capital sum. They resolved upon the latter course ; and thus a fund has been secured which will, it is estimated, produce in colonial investments an annual interest of £12, 244 cy. But the actual amount required to maintain the Church, even in her present state of efficiency, is £18,643 per annum, thus leaving a deficiency of £6,399 per annum. This deficiency must be made good, or the church's efficiency become most fatally impaired. That the laity of this Diocese will at once appreciate the difficulty of the Church's position and cheerfully respond to the appeal for contributions to a sustentation fund which our venerable diocesan will shortly make, your committee will not allow themselves for a moment to doubt. They are strongly of opinion, that if the clergy, by the sacrifice of their own temporary interests to the permanent welfare of the Church, have secured her a permanent endowment of over £12,000 per annum ; the laity, when aware of the fact, will not hesitate a moment in undertaking to contribute £6,000 per annum, or one half the previous amount, to secure for themselves the regular administration of religious ordinances ; and when it is considered that an amount much larger than the sum required to supply the existing deficiency might be contributed for the relief of the Church without trenching to the amount of a single farthing upon the present resources of several individuals, the plea of inability to contribute, so often advanced is at once invalidated. That such is really the case may be demonstrated in few words : all are aware that the Secularization Act expressly provides that the great bulk of the Clergy Reserve Fund is to be paid over to the County Councils for municipal purposes, consequently the remission of taxation in each municipality will be in proportion to the amount received from that fund, if affairs are properly managed ; and consequently a sum equal in amount to the reduction of taxation can be contributed by the laity without imposing upon themselves any fresh burthens ; or, should the fund be applied to carrying out new enterprises, rather than a reduction of taxation, then a proportionate enhancement of the value of property must be the result ; so that in either case the truth of our assertion is

most apparent—viz., that the expenditure of the Clergy Reserves Fund within the municipalities for local improvements, or the reduction of taxation, renders it possible for the laity to contribute to the relief of the Church a much larger amount than has been named, without thereby burthening their resources to a greater extent than at present.

Those who have all along professed to regard the alienation of the clergy reserves from the sacred purposes to which they were devoted as a sacrilegious act of spoliation, your committee doubt not will hasten to prove the sincerity of their professions, by voluntarily contributing in aid of the Church, so cruelly despoiled, an amount equal at least to the benefit they will thus either directly or indirectly derive from the appropriation of the Church's property to secular purposes.

Better is it to respond to the just claims of the Church now, than hereafter, at the close of life, restore the thirty pieces of silver with the agonizing remorse of Judas. However tempting to the covetous heart may be the prospect of increased gain, be it remembered that Achan's curse will attend it. Upon serious reflection, who is there that can resolve to reserve this bitter portion for his last moment. A just sense of our accountability and unworthiness at the best, will surely cloud the last mortal struggle with enough of bitterness and distress, without the deliberate addition to its pangs of the remembrance of wilful and repeated acts of sacrilege. As reasonable and christian men, we will not, we cannot deliberately incur so great a responsibility. You are not required to do some great thing—to make some great and unheard of sacrifices disproportioned to your means, but simply to refund for religious purposes from your increased wealth a portion equal to the benefit you will derive from the appropriation of the Church's inheritance to your use.

And happily in this sad conjunction of her affairs, the Church has not been found destitute of an organization which renders her legally capable of gathering in and managing the united offerings of her members. The Diocesan Church Society, of which we form a branch, has been invested by the legislature with certain powers, which enable it to discharge this duty with effect. while its numerous and multiplying ramifications through every part of the Diocese render it a most fitting agent for the purpose.

It is an institution, moreover, that in other respects can scarcely fail to conciliate the regard and affection of every right-minded christian. Performing all the functions of a Bible Society, a Religious Book and Tract Society, a Church Building and Church Endowment Society, and a Missionary Society, it furnishes a system of unlimited expansion; and if faithfully sustained and strengthened by the zeal and substantial gifts of the Laity of our Communion, cannot fail to become a most effica-

cious instrumentality for supplying the religious wants of the country in every particular.

The Committee respectfully submit that under the present prosperous condition of the country and adverse state of the Church, the foregoing is not a sufficient contribution to the treasury of the Lord from such a mission as this. They base this opinion upon the following facts :

The Church population of the four townships constituting this mission is now about 2,500, or 500 families : of these twenty-one families contributed to both the objects in which this mission is interested, thirty-three to the support of the minister only, and forty-two to the Church Society only ; that is, ninety-six families at an average of 9s. 3½d. each, leaving about four hundred families who have not given anything towards either of these objects. If, however, each family had contributed only a dollar per annum, (about 1½d. per week) the contributions would be more than double their present amount.

The performance of ministerial duties is sought for and obtained by non-paying members of the Church, as well as by those who contribute to her support. The churches are free to all ; the sick are visited, children baptised, and the dead buried, without enquiry having been made as to whether the persons desiring those services assist in supporting the Church or not. Then, at least one half of the congregations consists of members of families who do nothing towards that object ; four-fifths of the baptisms, or ninety-one out of 113 ; eight, that is the whole of the funerals ; and fourteen out of nineteen marriages, were performed for families similarly situated. Neither the Committee however, nor the minister, desire that the ministrations of the Church should be confined to contributing churchmen ; but they consider that those who are ready to profit by the services of their clergyman, and able to do much or anything towards the support of the Church, should imitate the example of David, who would not offer burnt offerings to the Lord his God of that which did cost him nothing, and should therefore give to either or both the objects for which contributions are expected according as God has prospered them.

The Committee think that this want of a more generally diffused spirit of contributing towards the maintenance of the Church arises from the too frequent use by churchmen of the dissenting term of "hearers," as applied to persons attending upon the regular ministrations of the Church : but they would respectfully submit that churchmen should not look upon themselves merely as hearers, but rather as sons of the Church, and as such, should manifest their affection by doing all that lies in their power to further the objects she has in view, both in their own immediate locality and in the more distant parts of this extensive diocese. It should, however, be observed that the sum of £70 has been contributed towards the erection of St. Mark's Church, principally by persons residing in its locality. While this probably has had the effect of diminishing the contribution towards the

ordinary Church purposes of the mission, it has been the means of placing the building in such a state as to lead to the hope that it will be ready for service early in the spring. The Committee here thankfully acknowledge the kindness of J. R. Williams, Esq., of Tecumseth, who, with his usual liberality, has contributed £10 towards the expense of building it, and also of Alexander Gaviller, Esq., of the same township, who has given \$5 towards the same object.

During the past year the contributions to the Parent Society from the diocese at large did not answer the expectations of those who thought that the fragrant breach of public faith experienced by the Church would have called forth an outburst of attachment to her which would at once restore her to her previous condition, but now, as the extent of her loss is in a great measure known; and as the Parent Society has taken upon herself the making up the deficiencies in the salaries of the clergymen who have committed, it is hoped that the members of the Church will stand in the breach and give her that assistance which she so fully deserves and so much stands in need of.

When the last annual report of the Parent Society was published, four widows and fourteen orphans looked to her for maintenance; but death has since that time been busy among the labourers in the Lord's vineyard, two of whom have been lately transferred from the scene of their labours, leaving their families also in care of the Church. Eight candidates for orders are assisted by her in the prosecution of their studies, and portions of the salaries of several missionaries, catechists, school masters and interpreters, are paid out of her funds.

From the melancholly view that we have been compelled to take of the state of the Church in this diocese, it is pleasing to hear of her progress in other parts of the world. From the many proofs of this fact published in the report of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, the Committee select as examples the Diocese of Barbadoes, where the missionary spirit of churchmen is not satisfied with laboring in their own lands, but in sending the gospel to benighted Western Africa; and the diocese in the Southern part of that continent, where, at the time that our government was setting its seal to what will be a lasting disgrace to Canada, theirs was authorizing the expenditure of £45,000 per annum in maintaining missionaries among the heathen; justly considering that a band of Christian ministers will be more effectual in putting a complete stop to savage violence than the most powerful military organization.

Fourteenth Report of the Tecumseth Parochial Branch.

In presenting this, the Fourteenth Report of the Tecumseth Parochial Branch of the Church Society, your Committee would thank God for enabling them again to state that our progress has been onward, and that during the past year our subscriptions

showed an increase over those of the preceding year by £19; and this increase is the more gratifying from the fact of the money having been contributed for the express purpose of spreading the knowledge of the Redeemer's name amongst those less favored than ourselves.

During the past year the Rev. J. Langtry has been diligently laboring in Nottawasaga, Essa and Cookstown. In the two former places before Mr. Langtry's appointment only occasional services were performed; whilst now throughout that extensive mission divine service is stately and regularly held. This must be to us a cause of much thankfulness, that in great measure through our instrumentality those heretofore so destitute have now the regular ministration of God's word and Sacraments; and also that your minister, thus relieved of a portion of the charge he voluntarily assumed, and which occupied much of his time, is now enabled to devote the whole of his attention to your wants and to do what before was out of his power,—that is, visit regularly from house to house, those who are entrusted to his pastoral charge.

It is with much pleasure that your Committee can now state that the transfer of the deed of the Glebe of this township has been effected, it being now vested in the Incumbent and Churchwarden's of St. John's Church, thus securing in perpetuity what will, after a few years, be a valuable endowment for the parish. Also, the deed of a quarter of an acre of land in a most eligible situation has been given for Church purposes, about a mile west of Davis's station, on which it is hoped a church will be erected before the close of the year. A subscription is also now being entered into for the purpose of purchasing a superior melodeon for Trinity Church; the organ heretofore used, and which was kindly lent by Mr. T. Gaviller, being very much out of repair.

St. John's Church, during the past year, has been neatly painted inside; the expense of which was defrayed by voluntary contributions of the congregation.

Your Committee, in conclusion, would express, in the name of the Society, their thanks to those young friends who so zealously exerted themselves as collectors, and trust that during the present year their labours of love will be crowned with equal or even greater success.

The accompanying report was read at the annual meeting in February, after which subscriptions for the current year were asked for publicly at the meeting, which was very numerously attended; and also by the collectors. It was stated that whatever might be contributed would be expended in part towards the general fund of the Parent Society, and the remainder towards the support of missions in the destitute parts of the country. The result has been, that £84 4s. has been paid to the Treasurer, being an increase of £23 over last year's subscriptions, and 143 additional subscribers.

Extract from Report of the West Gwillimbury Parochial Branch of the Church Society.

In matters connected with the well being of the Church in this mission, the progress has been satisfactory. The calls for pecuniary assistance upon our members have been cheerfully responded to. The amount raised for Church object during the past year was nearly £360 currency.

Report of the Nottawasaga Mission.

This mission extends over about 400 square miles, and properly divides itself into two sections, there being twenty miles of unbroken woods running across the centre, while the northern and southern portions are thickly settled, and for the most part well cleared up.

The success which, by the blessing of God, has attended the efforts of your missionary is in a high degree satisfactory and encouraging. The congregations at almost every station have gradually increased—and your missionary trusts that the growing reverence and attention every where apparent—the more frequent joining, audibly, in the services of the Church, and the increased interest taken in her temporal affairs, afford reasons for believing that his labour has not been in vain in the Lord."

The six stations at which your missionary has performed regular service during the past year are as follow :

St. John's Church.

This Church is situated in the village of Cookstown, on the concession of the four townships, West Gwillimbury, Tecumseth, Innisfil, and Essa. But little improvement has been made in the Church itself, though the money towards liquidating the old debt of £50 on the building of the Church, has for the most been collected. Steps are now in progress for fencing the burying ground, and subscriptions are being raised to purchase a melodeon for the Church. Service is performed in this Church every second Sunday—the congregation is considerably increased—the responses much more generally read—and from sixty to seventy scholars attend the Sunday School when the roads are good.

Mr. John Banting's House.

Eight miles south of Cookstown, in the township of Tecumseth. Here the congregation has almost doubled itself during the past year, and the same improvements are manifest as at Cookstown, though in an increased degree; service on the evening of the same Sunday as at Cookstown.

Wilkinson's School House.

Ten miles west of Cookstown, in the township of Essa. This congregation has of late very much increased, and proposals are made to build a Church, if there were any prospect of regular Sunday service, which has generally been performed on Friday, though for the last few months, on the same Sunday as at Cookstown and Banting's. These stations form the southern portion of the mission, and would make a reasonable parish, which, with faithful and constant visiting, might be made almost self-supporting in a year.

St. Luke's Church.

In the village of Creemore, township of Nottawasaga. The congregation, which was at first but twenty-five or thirty, is now regularly from eighty to one hundred. The Church has been finished with the exception of painting and plastering, and efforts are being made to have that done in July. The people are for the most part but beginners in the back-woods, and have as yet received but little return for their labour, though they have manifested a most willing mind, and have contributed near two hundred pounds towards Church purposes during the past year—service every second Sunday. There is a regular Sunday School kept in this Church, at which the average attendance, summer and winter, is sixty.

Collingwood.

Here the success of the Church has been most marked: for the first six months your missionary's congregation seldom exceeded

fifteen or twenty; it is now at least one hundred and fifty regularly. An excellent choir has been formed, and the whole congregation join heartily in the services of the Church. Upwards of £500 have been subscribed for Church purposes—a frame building has been erected at a cost of £350, which is intended to be used as a Church for two or three years, though ultimately as a school-house. A burying ground is about to be purchased; and a considerable sum has already been subscribed to buy a melodeon for the Church. The Lord Bishop was petitioned to appoint your missionary to the northern portion of his present mission, and promised to do so so soon as the necessary stipend was raised by the various congregations—£205 was at once subscribed for that purpose at Collingwood and Creemore—which is the greatest effort that has yet been made by any mission of but one year's standing towards the independent support of its clergyman. Collingwood is distant eighteen miles from Creemore, and service is performed on the same Sunday in both places.

Mr. James Shiel's House,

On the eighth line of Nottawasaga. With one or two exceptions, service has been held at this station on a week day, and the congregation in consequence is small. Your missionary sometimes visited the east part of the township of Osprey, where there are a good many Church people, though but few assemble for service. Your missionary has performed one hundred and sixty services in these various stations during the past year, and in discharge of his various duties, has rode about 4000 miles; while he has only had sixty-one baptisms, five marriages, and eight funerals. The Lord Bishop of Toronto held confirmations at Cookstown, Creemore and Collingwood, in which places together seventy-one candidates were confirmed. Meetings of the society were held at the same three stations, and parochial branches organized in each. The sums collected at Cookstown and adjacent stations, amounted to £27. This the Rev. F. L. Osler claimed to aid in making up the quota of your missionary's stipend furnished by the Tecumseth branch; and it accordingly appears among the contributions of his mission. At Creemore the sum of £8 1s. has been collected; at Collingwood, £10 11s. 9d.; and the whole amount from both these stations has been forwarded to the parent society; which, together with the subscription of the Rev. J. Langtry of £3, makes the sum £18.-12s. 9d., from the northern portion of the mission, and £45 12s. 9d. from all the stations at which collections have been taken up.

GORE AND WELLINGTON DISTRICTS.

The Twelfth Anniversary of the Gore and Wellington Branch of the Church Society. Your committee are happy to report, that they find its affairs in a sound, healthy and efficient state.

No Report from Paris or Binbrook.

A lively interest has been exhibited in the welfare of the Society throughout the various Parochial Associations, where the usual Annual Meetings have been held; and your Committee desire to express their thanks to those gentlemen who have aided the resident clergy on these occasions, as well as to those who have come to assist this night in the proceedings of this anniversary.

Your Committee are aware that since they last performed the agreeable task of presenting their Annual Report a very important change has occurred in the position and prospects of the Church in this country. The deep design laid years ago to deprive her of her patrimony, after having been pursued with an industry and determination worthy of a better cause, has at length been consummated. and the Provincial Legislature have passed an act for the purpose of alienating the Church property called the Clergy Reserves.

The Church Society, which has always been regarded as a valuable auxiliary to the Church, appears to your Committee to be now more than ever entitled to the cordial support of all the members of our communion. It affords the readiest medium of collecting and appropriating the contributions of Churchmen throughout the Diocese; it excludes no member of the Church from its deliberations, nor from the management of its concerns, simply requiring as an indication of interest in its welfare a contribution to its funds proportionate to the circumstances of the individual. It is a voluntary religious association, called into existence by the exigencies of the Church at the time when the withdrawal of aid by the Propagation Society in England seemed to be inevitable, and when the Church believed that she should have no other resource to fall back upon than such portion of her public patrimony as might escape the hands of spoliation. But now that that property has been entirely swept away, and the Church deprived of all interest in the Clergy Reserves, surely this Society will be valued more highly than ever, and will be supported with greater zeal and generosity.

Your Committee refer with mingled feelings of gratification and regret to the missionary operations of this association. They are gratified to think of the happy results which have thus far attended the self-denying labours of their missionaries, evinced as they are by increasing congregations, rising Church edifices, numerous baptisms and confirmations, and a growing feeling of attachment to the Church. They regret that the good work cannot be more widely extended and more efficiently carried on, that

the crying wants of hundreds and thousands, not a hundred miles from our doors, cannot be satisfied, and that in one of their missions the work has been unfortunately suspended in consequence of the well-merited promotion of one of their missionaries to a settled charge, and the difficulty of getting another to fill his place. The only remaining Missionary, the Rev. Mr. Mulholland of Owen Sound, whose Report will shortly be submitted to this meeting, implores additional assistance, and represents the destitution of the settlers as most deplorable. Your Committee are of opinion that this state of things cannot be permitted to continue, that some vigorous and important action must be taken. The allowance to travelling missionaries must be augmented and experienced men brought into the field, if the Church expects to retain the affections of her people and to keep pace with the rapid settlement of the country. Truly "the fields are white unto the harvest, but there are not labourers enough to send forth into the harvest."

The education of the rising generation must necessarily occupy the serious thoughts of every reflecting man, and the true-hearted member of the Church cannot but regard with feelings of alarm the attempts that have long been making to establish in this country, a godless system of education; schools where the youthful mind is never directed to eternity—nor the Book of Life, that precious volume, the source and fountain of the best knowledge, and the truest wisdom, is never opened and never read. Your Committee are persuaded that a great revolution on this subject will ere long take place, and that a Christian people will rise up and vindicate the honor of God; and restore the word of God to that place in our schools and universities which it held in the opinion of him who has written—"The fear of the Lord is the *beginning* of wisdom; a good understanding have all they that do thereafter; the praise of it endureth forever." Good men of every denomination have warned us of the dreadful consequences which any country may anticipate "where the masses of the people are imbued with knowledge and that power which knowledge imparts, but when no Christian education is at hand to act as a restraining power over their wild and unruly passions."

Such are the details of the Society's transactions during the past year. In bringing them to a close, your Committee may be allowed to call upon its members for their cordial assistance and support. In the present state of things, the most strenuous exertions are required from all who love the Church and its institutions. The enemies of our Holy Religion and the adversaries of our Apostolic Church, are unceasing and inveterate in their attempts to throw down the walls and bulwarks of that Zion which has so long been the faithful guardian and dispenser of God's word. The appeals come to us louder and more loudly from the destitute settlements for help, and the Church looks to her lay-members to furnish them with ample means to supply those wants.

GORE AND WELLINGTON DISTRICT BRANCH.

The following are the parochial reports read at the Annual Meeting held in Hamilton. We regret that on account of their length we are compelled to omit the Owen Sound and Waterloo Mission Report. The whole of the reports are of the most gratifying nature, and show that the hearts of the members of the Church are sound to the core.

Guelph.

The large attendance at the Annual Meeting of this Parochial Association and the liberal contribution to its funds, evince that the interest of the members of the Church at Guelph in the cause of the Church Society continues unabated. The sum of £55 10s. has been remitted to the Treasurer, being a small increase over the receipts of any former year.

Galt.

The Committee of this Association have great pleasure in stating that the sum contributed to the funds of the Church Society in this mission is greater than in any preceding year, which is one of the best proofs that the members of the Church within the bounds of the Association continue to feel the deepest interest in the success of the society and the accomplishment of the all important object which it has in view. They cannot or ^{for} to state, however, that the increase in the sum contributed ^{for} year is chiefly owing to the liberality of the congregation which assembled in the Church at Beverley, and the exertions made by the members of the Church in that neighbourhood; the amount subscribed this year is £48 0s. 1½d.

Elora.

In presenting their Annual Report, the Committee have the gratification to announce a large increase in the amount of subscriptions, and what is of far greater importance, a corresponding amount of zeal in the congregation of St. John's Church, as regards furthering the objects of the Church Society.

There is a determination on the part of this congregation, that the Church of England shall, as far as they are concerned, not be crippled by the recent acts of the legislature, which doubtless originated in a desire to weaken her influence. The more the Egyptians afflicted the Israelites, the more they multiplied and grew, and so will it be with our beloved Church.

The Committee are much indebted to the eight ladies who kindly undertook the task of calling at the houses of such members of the Church as profess to belong to this congregation, in order to solicit subscriptions. Everywhere, with the exception of one

or two, they were received with a cordiality highly gratifying, and the most lively interest evidently taken in the success of their work.

It appears to be the general wish of the subscribers, in which the Committee most cordially concur, that the whole amount of subscription should be paid over to the Church Society, and no part expected back for local objects. When it becomes necessary to raise anything more for ourselves, we would prefer setting on foot a subscription with that avowed object.

Oakville.

The parish of Oakville reports :

Nelson.

The Committee, although they cannot report any increase over the last year, are glad to say that the same deep interest in all the affairs of the Association continues to be felt by the members of the Church in this mission, and they rejoice in the success of a Society, which, under the Lord's blessing, may largely aid in the building up of Zion and the amelioration of her wants. The sum collected is £32.

Mohawk and Tuscarora.

The Committee report a considerable increase, the amount being £32 5s. It is very satisfactory that this increase is owing chiefly to additional Indian subscribers: while most have contributed according to their ability, it is but justice to make particular mention of the liberality of a small tribe of Delawares, who, during the last few years have been converted from paganism to the Christian faith, and brought into the Church through the zealous efforts of their excellent missionary the Rev. A. Elliott. On account of their recent conversion to Christianity, as well as their poverty—for they are very poor—it was considered inexpedient to call upon them for anything towards the Church Society till this year, and though their number is but small, they contributed the sum of £7 5s.

Barton and Glandford.

The amount of contributions from this new Parochial Branch is reported to be £11 8s. 1½d. The completion of the second Church, the purchase of ten acres of land, and the erection of a parsonage house, engage the efforts of the parishioners in this mission, and for the present hinder a large donation to the Church Society.

Ancaster and Dundas.

The unavoidable absence of the rector of this parish from home, will readily account for the fact that no Report has yet been received from either of these associations, which have always held a respectable place in the returns of this Branch of the Church Society. The collections, it is conjectured, may have fallen off during the past year in Dundas, but a corresponding increase is anticipated in Ancaster, the other section of the parish. The Dundas congregation, the Rector remarks, have contributed £25 to the purchase of a bell, and are called upon to raise that sum annually to defray the expenses of the second Sunday Service in that parish. Taking these matters into consideration, it is expected that the aggregate amount from the two parishes will be about £50.

Norval and Georgetown.

An Association having been formed last month in Georgetown, the sum of £8 18s. 6s., has been collected, which together with £14 4s. 4½d., collected at Norval amount to £23 0s. 10d. The sum shows an increase of more than £8 over the collection of last year.

Brampton.

In accordance with notice given, a meeting was held in this Village on the 24th of January, for the purpose of forming a Parochial Branch of the Church Society in this newly-established Mission. Though the day appointed turned out very cold and stormy, yet several Clergymen were present, and amongst them the Secretary, who explained to the meeting the numerous and laudable objects of the Society. A branch was formed and collectors appointed, who report the sum of £22 0s. 7½d. collected, (exclusive of the Clergymen's subscription of £10,) notwithstanding that two brick churches are being erected within the Mission, and that the Parish has undertaken to provide the whole amount of the Clergymen's Stipend, one quarter has been remitted to the Parent Society; the remaining three-fourths has been appropriated towards the building of the Church in the Village.

Hornby.

Owing to the severity of the weather, the attendance at the Annual Meeting was small, but the few who attended showed themselves to be zealous advocates of the Society. Immediately after the meeting the collectors visited each house, and notwithstanding the absence of some who were the largest contributors the past year, the amount collected exceeds that of the former year by £2 3s. 10d.

Cayuga Heights and Mount Pleasant.

The Parochial Association of Cayuga Heights and Mount Pleasant conjoined with much pleasure in remitting to the Gore and Wellington District Branch Church Society the sum of £17 18s. 1½d. for the year ending 1855. The sum exceeds that of last year, and the Committee of the above mentioned associations are confident that much satisfaction and interest prevail within their mission, as to the success of the Church Society, inasmuch as an inquiring and cheerful spirit was evinced during the time the collections were being taken up in aid of its funds.

Ascension Church.

The Committee, in returning the Report of their Parochial Association for the year just expired, have to state that while the number of their subscribers has slightly increased, the amount collected continued about the same as the last year.

The sum of £36 5s., has been contributed for the general objects of the Society; at the same time their collectors have received the further sum of £80 3s., the amount of subscriptions specially contributed towards the very pressing local wants of their own Church.

The amount available last year for local objects was expended in support of the Sunday School, and in completing the purchase of the lot of land adjoining the Church. This lot is now free of debt, and secured for the erection of a School House, a want to which the attention of the congregation has been directed and which they trust ere long to see supplied.

It may possibly at first sight appear that the sum subscribed for the general purposes of the Society is not so large as it might be; but when it is considered that the requirements of a new Church, such as theirs is, are so very numerous, that many of these demand immediate attention, the committee hope that the efforts of the members of their Church will not be deemed unsatisfactory, for while anxious to help forward every institution which has for its object the propagation of their most holy faith, they are of necessity constrained to direct their main exertions to the due ordering of the sanctuary in which they themselves assemble for worship.

It is not for the Committee of this Association to eulogize the objects which are embraced within the Constitution of the Church Society.

They feel them to be the chiefest which engage the attention of men, after they have fulfilled their first duty, the believing of Him whom God hath sent; and therefore they cannot but desire to cooperate with their fellow-christians throughout the diocese, in carrying into execution designs which so entirely accord with the precepts of the Christian Faith.

Christ's Church.

The amount collected by the Parochial Committee, is £121 10s. The diminution apparent in this as compared with last year's collections, the Committee can satisfactorily account for no less a sum than from £15 to £20 being lost by deaths and removals of old subscribers. Strangers newly arriving are not solicited until they have been upwards of one year resident in the Parish. The congregation have likewise, during the past year, with much liberality, added £150 to the income of their pastor, and presented the late curate with a purse of over £60.— They have likewise incurred large expenditure connected with warming and heating the new Church; the furnaces and gas fitting required an outlay of between two and three hundred pounds. They have likewise purchased the property adjoining the Church for £1250, of which sum £250 has been paid. Under these circumstances, and considering the fact that Hamilton being a commercial place, feels most sensitively the fluctuations of trade and the scarcity of money, your Committee are not at all discouraged at the small falling off which appears in this year's collections. The funds returned to this Parochial Committee for local expenditure were laid out in supporting the Parochial School Library. The former institution has for a time been suspended, but only that measures may be matured for opening it again on a larger and more efficient scale, and rendering it more nearly adequate to the wants of this populous parish.

NIAGARA DISTRICT BRANCH.

This is the Fourteenth time that the managing committee of the Niagara District Branch of the Church Society have been permitted, in the good providence of Almighty God, to present their *Annual Report*: and for the mercies and blessings vouchsafed to them during those past years, they desire to express their unfeigned gratitude to the gracious "Giver of every good and perfect gift."

During the past year one of their number, the Rev. Adam Townley, Incumbent of Dunnville, and who always took a deep interest in the Society, and afforded efficient aid to the parochial and district meetings, has been transferred to the rising town of Paris, and thus left the circuit of this association. Whilst praying the Head of the Church to bless him abundantly in his new and important field of labour, your managing committee would tender a most hearty welcome to his successor, the Rev. John Flood, and beseech Almighty God to bless him in like manner in the discharge of his duties amongst us.

It is a cause of deep regret to your Managing Committee to be obliged to report the District as still destitute of the invaluable labours of a travelling missionary. This being an object of such

primary importance in the estimation of the members of our association, and the hopes of those more particularly interested in the labours of the travelling missionary having been so often and so sadly disappointed within the last two years, your Managing Committee have deemed it right, in justification, to enter fully into an explanation of the causes which have led to the present destitution. Immediately after the removal of the Rev. James Godfrey, our last travelling missionary, to a settled parish, application was made to the Lord Bishop for a successor to that gentleman; but we were answered that no promise could be made to us in consequence of the limited number seeking ordination and the many places waiting for clergymen. This was discouraging indeed; and early in the following spring your Secretary, as Rural Dean, drew up a scheme by which most of the stations occupied by our travelling missionaries might have been partially supplied through the aid of clergymen settled in the District. This plan was submitted to His Lordship the Bishop and met with his full concurrence. Most of the clergy on whom this additional burthen was thrown cheerfully undertook to supply the places allotted to them, with occasional services. But though this plan was devised to afford a temporary supply, your Managing Committee never lost sight of the duty of obtaining as soon as possible a missionary for the district. In the course of the following autumn information was received from a gentleman just returned from Ireland that a friend of his, a clergyman of some four or five years' standing, had expressed an anxiety to come out and undertake the duties of our travelling mission. As this gentleman was well acquainted with the country, and having been for many years a member of our Church Society, and as he brought out with him for the inspection of our authorities strong letters of recommendation on behalf of his friend in Ireland, your Secretary took those letters to Toronto, and submitted them to his Lordship the Bishop, and was authorised by that venerable prelate to write to the clergyman in Ireland who had expressed a desire to come out, offering him on his Lordship's behalf the situation of travelling missionary. Accordingly your Secretary wrote to that gentleman on the 16th of November, making him the offer of the situation of Travelling Missionary in this Rural Deanery. In the month of January following your Secretary received a note from the Rev. H. J. Grasett, B. D., Secretary to the Lord Bishop, stating that his Lordship wished to know if we had funds on hand to support a Travelling Missionary, and also if we desired the appointment of one, as it was thought that one of the young gentlemen about to be ordained at the special ordination to be held for that purpose, could be spared for our District. Your Secretary felt himself bound to answer that, having with his Lord Bishop's direction invited out for that duty a clergyman from Ireland, he did not think that the Managing Committee would feel

themselves at liberty to employ any other gentleman until such time as they had heard from him, or that full time had elapsed to enable him to answer your Secretary's letter of the 16th of November.

Thus, the only opportunity, that has ever been afforded us of obtaining a young man ordained in the country since the mission became vacant, was lost.

Month after month passed without any letter from the clergyman in Ireland; and at last your Secretary, having been informed by the friend who first brought the matter under his attention that his friend in Ireland had received no letter from him on the subject of the travelling Mission, he wrote him again, making the same offer as he had done in the letter of the 16th of November previous. This letter reached its destination, and the gentleman to whom it was addressed said that he would be most happy to accept the duty, for that it was the kind of charge he had long desired to have; but that, unfortunately, he had just ten days previous engaged to supply a clergyman's place for the summer, and that clergyman had already gone abroad and would not return till September; but that he would be ready to sail for America by the 1st of October, if we could wait so long. As your Secretary learned on enquiry that there were no prospects of obtaining a missionary from amongst the few who were to present themselves at the next ordination, he replied that your Committee would wait for him till then, and that he would endeavor himself to supply as far as possible those parts of the travelling mission within his reach, until his arrival in October.

That month came and passed, and early in November your Secretary, much to his surprise and disappointment, instead of welcoming his brother clergyman from Ireland and introducing him to his interesting field of labour, received a letter from him, stating that the clergyman whose place he had been supplying had not returned till a month later than he had expected him: that he could not leave the parish till his return, and that he was strongly advised by several persons who had often crossed the Atlantic not to think of venturing across at that inclement and dangerous season of the year; but that if we would wait till the spring, he would be most happy to come and take charge of our travelling Mission. Your Secretary lost no time in replying, and expressed his surprise at the reasons alleged for his failure to meet his engagement; stating to him that our venerable Bishop had not feared to cross the Atlantic in the month of November, though at the age of seventy-two, and that it was the constant practice of our merchants to cross and recross during the winter months; and that, unless he set out immediately on the receipt of this letter, the Secretary could hold out to him no prospect of employment in this District.

On the 26th December last your Secretary received a letter:

from the reverend gentleman, in which he endeavoured to defend the course he had pursued, and stated as a further reason for his not coming out according to his promise that a friend, who had promised to furnish him with funds to bear his expenses out, had not been able to procure them, but would be able to do so in the spring. Your Secretary having occasion to visit Toronto early in January, laid the whole correspondence before his Lordship the Bishop; and his Lordship's advice was, that your Committee should give up all ideas of employing one who had disappointed them so often; and advised your Secretary to apply to a clergyman from the diocese of Montreal, who was then supposed to be disengaged; but on doing so, your Secretary found that he was already engaged as assistant at Simcoe.

Your Managing Committee have deemed it their duty to enter thus fully into an explanation of the causes which have so unfortunately left this travelling mission vacant for the last two years.

Since last report your Secretary has continued to supply the missionary stations at the junction of Marshville once a month, whenever the state of the roads would admit of his doing so; and he has much pleasure in reporting that he has been well repaid for his labours by the blessing which appears to have attended his humble endeavours to break the bread of life to those who would otherwise have been destitute of it; he would allude specially to one case which it may be well to report.

Amongst those who attended his ministry at the junction was a family not belonging to the church, and composed of father and mother and seven children, four of whom were grown-up young persons.

The parents were pious people, and highly respectable farmers. They had taken great pains with their children, and had carefully instructed them in their social relation and religious duties; but, in consequence of defective views of the holy ordinance of baptism, had failed to bring their children into covenant with God.

The eldest son, a fine promising young man, who was about to enter upon the profession of a provincial-surveyor, was stricken, in the providence of God, with that prevailing disease pulmonary consumption; and for months was evidently sinking into his grave in spite of all that kind friends and the utmost skill of the faculty could do for him. As it was necessary for your Secretary to spend Sunday night away from home, in order to reach Marshville in time for service next morning, he occasionally availed himself of the proffered hospitalities of this family; and profited by those and other opportunities which he made to speak to this young man on the great concerns of his soul. He found him deeply interested in this most important of all duties, the "working out his salvation with fear and trembling;" but there still appeared something wanting. After having seen him the preceding evening, your Secretary was about to return home from Marshville in

June last, and whilst bidding adieu to his kind friends there he hesitated for some time as to which of the three roads he should take, as there was very little difference in any of them. At length, however, he was directed, as he believes, to take the middle one, which passed directly by the house where his young friend was lying. As he drew near the house, where his kind friend who had entertained him the night previous lived, the thought struck him that he would water his horse. When asking for a pail for that purpose, he was told by the good lady of the house that his young friend had grown suddenly worse, and was then supposed to be dying. Accordingly he hastened to his bedside, and found him indeed near his last, but perfectly sensible, and able to converse a little.

Your Secretary then felt that his duty was plain. He examined him carefully as to "his repentance towards God, and his faith towards our Lord Jesus Christ," and being fully satisfied, he called his father aside and asked him if his son had ever been baptised. He answered in the negative, and said that it was a subject about which he had many most anxious thoughts. He was told that, having examined him, and being fully satisfied that he was a fit candidate for the holy ordinance, your Secretary felt it his duty to offer it to his dying son. The father remarked that he was most anxious that it should be administered, and would speak to him and to his mother about it. Both expressing an anxiety that he should thus be brought into covenant with God before his departure hence, your Secretary was privileged to baptise him in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Ghost. From the time of the administration of that holy rite to the hour of his death, which occurred in the course of the evening, he enjoyed perfect peace, he expressed an entire readiness to depart, and be with his gracious Lord; he felt then the deficiency, of which he had formerly complained, had been most mercifully supplied, and he was enabled at the hour of his departure to commend his soul into God's hands, with a hope full of immortality.

The subject of baptism having been thus forcibly brought before the parents of this family, they studied the question most thoroughly, and being perfectly convinced that it is one of God's own ordinances, and generally "necessary to salvation," they soon afterwards presented their three youngest children, two boys and one little girl, for that holy ordinance; and the three oldest after due examination and careful instruction, were last October admitted into communion with God according to our prescribed form for public baptism of such as are of riper years.

The satisfaction expressed by the parents of these exceedingly promising young people, at feeling that now they have all their children brought into covenant with God, and sealed with his most holy seal, would repay a thousand-fold all the pains bestowed

upon them. And this feeling is not a little heightened by the fact, that another member of this baptised family has lately been called hence ; and though he was young in years, yet he was strong in faith, giving glory to God.

In addition to the services at the Junction and Marshville, services were performed at Queenston till last July, once a month, each by the Rev. T. Creen, the Rev. C. L. Ingles, and the Rev. T. B. Fuller. At the time the Rev. E. Denroche, formerly Incumbent of Brockville, removed with his family to that place, and kindly took charge thereof, during his temporary abode there. Since he took charge, the old building where the services of the church have been held for many years past has been entirely renovated in its interior arrangements, and vastly improved ; chiefly by Mr. Denroche's personal exertions. For these and other acts of Christian kindness and love, the few church people in that neighbourhood owe a debt of gratitude to that reverend gentleman.

A subject of considerable moment to the Church Society occupied the attention of your Managing Committee at the annual meeting of the Parent Society in June last, viz: a proposed change in the constitution of the Society, whereby the *whole* of the funds raised in the several parishes constituting the District Branch Association should be remitted to the Parent Society, instead of one-fourth, as heretofore. The proposed change was fully and ably discussed ; and it was apparent to the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, who presided on the occasion, that those District Branch Associations by which the constitution as now existing had been fairly carried out, were *decidedly opposed* to the change, his Lordship, after complimenting those who had taken part in the discussion, recommended both parties to avoid pressing the question to a division : thus leaving the constitution of the Society unaltered in that particular. And your Managing Committee cannot but think that it was well that this was the issue of the discussion ; for, whilst the constitution of the Church Society requires only one-quarter of the collections to be transmitted by the District Branch Associations to the Parent Society, there is nothing to prevent the several parishes transmitting, through the District Treasurer, the two-fourths that are now regularly returned to them to be spent under the direction of the incumbent and parochial committee for their own parochial wants, if they wish to do so ; nor anything indeed to hinder them from transmitting the *whole*, unless in District Branch Associations like our own, where one-fourth of the collections by the Parochial Branches is annually devoted, after meeting slight incidental expenses, to a travelling missionary fund for our District. And when it is considered that all the collections made after the quarterly sermons are sent to the Parent Society at Toronto, and that it is in the power of *every individual contributor to specify any particular*

object for which he or she *desires* his *contribution* to be *applied* ; and that the two-fourths returned to the several parishes, where they have been raised, have prevented the constant recurrence to a subscription list for every little church object, when the burden generally falls on a few only, your Managing Committee feel persuaded that it will be the wisdom of the Parent Society to continue a system which has worked so well, where it has been efficiently carried out.

At the present moment the Gore and Wellington Branch Association is employing *three travelling missionaries* at *handsome salaries*, all as fully and entirely under the control and direction of our venerable Bishop as any clergyman on your managing committee ; and had we not met with the vexatious disappointment detailed above we could have employed one at least.

It should be generally known too, that all those clergymen ordained after May, 1853, about twenty in number, have been shut out from the benefits arising from the Clergy Reserves, though in receipt of stipends from the same at the time of the passing of the provincial act, and that several of those gentlemen are now suffering from actual want.

The great extent of this Diocese, reaching from the Ottawa to the St. Clair, and from Lake Ontario to Lake Superior, and containing upwards of one hundred and forty officiating clergymen, has long called for its subdivision ; and steps have for some time past been taken for raising funds to endow a see at London, for the Western, and another at Kingston for the Eastern portion of the Diocese ; and his Lordship, our venerable Diocesan, has summoned his clergy and laity to meet him in Synod at Toronto on Thursday the 17th day of April next, to take counsel together on these and other important matters affecting the vast interests of the Church.

Although we happily belong to that portion of the present Diocese which will remain the Diocese of Toronto after the contemplated separation, yet we are not uninterested in these important movements.

Owing to various causes—the overtaxed time of the Secretary, the little assistance afforded by the clergy generally, the unfavorable state of the roads and weather, during the autumn—few public meetings have been held on behalf of the Church Society within this Rural Deanery, since our last annual meeting.

A very interesting meeting (as usual) was held in St. Paul's Church, Fort Erie, attended by the Rector and the Secretary. Another was held at St. Paul's Church, Dunnville, attended by the Incumbent, the Rev. A. Townley and the Secretary. Meetings were called for Christ's Church, Port Maitland, and though attended by the Incumbent and Secretary, and at St. George's Church, Drummondville, attended by the Rector of the parish, the Rev. C. L. Ingles, and the Secretary ; yet such was the in-

clemency of the weather that no meetings could be held. Sermons on behalf of the objects of the Church Society were, however, preached in St. George's Church, Drummondville, and St. John's Church, Stamford, by the Secretary.

For the past year the Parish of Niagara reports the collection of..... £24 9 8

Being for general purposes..... £20 14 8
Widows and Orphans' Fund 8 15 0

The Parish of St. Catherines reports with great satisfaction that the subscriptions for the past year amount to £63 10s. 6d., being a considerable increase over the amount collected for some years past. The increase is owing in part to the addition of new subscribers, and also to the pleasing fact that several of the old subscribers enlarged, and in some instances more than doubled their former subscriptions. This the parochial committee deem very encouraging, as evidence not only of the growing interest in the objects of the Church Society on the part of the congregation in general, but also of the zeal of two young ladies, to whose exertions much of the success here recorded is, under God, mainly to be attributed.

When it is also stated that within the last nine months the sum of £700 and upwards has been raised towards the liquidation of the parsonage debt, and after the sum of about £400 expended on a second enlargement of the church, besides the quarterly collections and contributions to various church objects of minor importance, which would amount to perhaps £100 more, making in all about £1200 raised for special church purposes within that short period; the parochial committee would humbly trust that these will be considered as satisfactory evidence that the congregation of St. George's are not indifferent to their privileges and duties as members of Christ's Holy Catholic Church; and they will be disposed according to their ability, to perform their part in the advancement of the Redeemer's kingdom.

The Parish of Chippawa reports the amount of subscriptions for the current year, being the same as that reported the preceding year, though the list of subscribers presents a falling off in point of numbers, owing to the removal of several families from the parish during the year. The united association of St. George's Drummondville, and St. John's Stamford, in the Parish of Chippawa, reports the sum of £20 6s., being an increase on the previous year. The committee would further mention that in addition to the above £82 15s. 1½d., has also been raised in these united charges for various other church objects, making a total of £103 1s. 1½d.

The parish of Thorold reports for general purposes £38 6s. 3d.; Widows and Orphans' fund, 10s.

The chairman of this association reports that owing to the general failure of wheat, the staple crop in his parish, and the

consequent effect upon all branches of business, and to the sickness of a gentleman who has always taken a leading part in making the collections in the south part of his parish, he had great fears before the day when the collectors brought in their returns that there would have been a great falling off in the returns for this year, instead of a slight increase : and he feels that had there been a travelling missionary employed the amount would have been much greater. He attributes the amount reported to the increased interest taken in the affairs of the church ; for many farmers contributed this year who had to buy their seed wheat last fall, and who will not have bread enough to supply them till next harvest ; and he cannot but particularly notice the zeal manifested in the cause by one of the collectors, a young man eighteen years of age, whose collections were the best of the whole.

The Parish of Dunnville reports the sum of £10 for general purposes, as collected from the congregation in that town, and the chairman states that in consequence of the failure of the meeting called for Port Maitland, from severity of weather, the collectors nominated by the five persons present were not apprised of their duties in time to make up their returns in season for this meeting.

The Parish of Fort Erie reports, through their chairman, that his parishioners, having suffered severely during the last summer in their wheat and hay crops, losing of the former full 30,000 bushels, and of the latter so much so that their cattle are starving, the collections have fallen from £14 last year to £11 2s. 6d. this year.

The parish of Louth reports the sum of £4. This amount may appear small, but the chairman states that the debt remaining on St. John's Church, Jordan, and other necessary improvements, have absorbed the means of the members, but promises that after this the parish will do better than it has done hitherto.

In reporting, therefore, the operations of this District Branch of the Church Society for the past year, your Managing Committee see no cause for discouragement, but much for hope. Some of the parochial branches reported a large increase, others a smaller one. Some report a decrease, but the causes which have produced these unfavorable returns are believed to be temporary and transient ; whereas there has been a general increase in the liberality of the members of the Church, exhibited in providing more amply for the wants and comforts of several of the settled clergy within the bounds of your association.

Had we been able to engage the services of a travelling missionary, your committee believe that there would have been a large increase in the amount reported ; and as no pains will be spared to secure the services of one during the year, with a good prospect of obtaining such services, they confidently anticipate a large increase during the year.

TALBOT DISTRICT BRANCH.

The Committee of the Talbot District Branch of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto did not publish any Report for the year ending April 30th, 1855. They were not, however, altogether inactive, as a collection was made amounting in all to £6 12s. 6d., the whole of which was remitted to the Parent Society. It must be borne in mind that this association, although dignified by the name of a District Branch, is, in fact, still nothing more than a Parochial Branch. The subscription which has been made for the current year, amounts to £26 3s. 1½d., of which £9 7s. 0d., will be remitted to Toronto.

The Committee are happy to be able to state that since the publication of their last Report, much has been effected of a local nature. St. Paul's Church, Port Dover, a neat and commodious edifice, which was begun some time ago, has been completed; and not only so, but by the zeal and untiring efforts of the ladies of the congregation, has been placed entirely out of debt. Those interested in its erection, with the exception of one who was called away before the object of her endeavours was realized, had the privilege on Sunday, the 10th of February last, of seeing it opened for Divine Service under the most favourable auspices; not only the pews, but aisles and chancel, being crowded, both morning and afternoon. The Cemetery of St. John's, Woodhouse, has been enclosed by a new and substantial board fence; and the interior of Trinity Church, Simcoe, has undergone extensive improvement and repairs.

The Committee have great pleasure in referring to the introduction of an excellent organ into the last named Church. This desirable object, also, has been accomplished by the well directed efforts and strenuous exertions of the ladies of the congregation and their friends. The Committee would also state that the Quarterly Collections have been generally made, and the amount contributed large. They have great satisfaction also in being able to report that an assistant Clergyman, the Rev. R. S. Birch,

B.A., has been engaged in the Parish of Woodhouse, nearly the whole of whose salary will be raised within the District. By this arrangement, Port Dover and Victoria will have the advantage of a service every Sunday, a consummation which has long been wished for; and a reasonable hope is given that Parochial branches of the Society will speedily be formed in both of those places.

In conclusion, the Committee would state that three-fourths of the sums collected in aid of the Society for the current year, exclusive of the subscriptions of the Clergy, will be retained for Church purposes within our midst, and express a hope that as our congregations increase in members, so an increasing interest may be taken in the affairs of the Society.

LONDON DISTRICT BRANCH.

Delaware and Caradoc.

The Committee of the Delaware and Caradoc Church Association, in presenting its members with the results of a year, would premise that their report on this head is incomplete, as the gentlemen who were appointed collectors, will not have their returns completed before the close of the present month.

Your Committee have learned through one of the collectors that the amount of subscriptions to this branch would be considerably increased, if its members were apprized that the three fourths of the sum collected were to be retained for local purposes, which scale we purpose to adopt for the present year, and it is to be hoped that when all the collections are paid into the hands of our Treasurer, that the one-fourth will not fall far short of the sum remitted to the Parent Society during the past year.

While your Committee cannot but regret their feeble efforts in advancing the manifold objects which the Church Society contemplates, and which presents so many openings for acts of Christian philanthropy and loving kindness, they can nevertheless rejoice at the noble deeds displayed in other parts of the diocese by her more favored members.

Your Committee, in conclusion, entertain a sanguine hope that as this locality has at length become alive to the necessity of putting their shoulders to the wheel, in order to work out the voluntary principle which is now the only resource for the sustentation of the Church and its wants at their own doors, that if spared to witness in this place another demonstration in behalf of the Society, a more cheering report, under the divine blessing, will be announced in reference to her finances.

WESTERN DISTRICT BRANCH.

Sarnia Parochial Branch.

We are much gratified in being able to report that the Church mission in this section of the province is progressing favourably. At the time of our last report we had but one clergyman regularly stationed here; we have now a resident clergyman in Sarnia, another in Moore, and another in Plympton; the stipends (with the exception of £100 a year to the missionary to Sarnia) are defrayed entirely by the residents of the three townships. The sum of £100 has been raised by this parochial Branch towards the support of these clergymen, independently of the pew rents and weekly subscriptions for Church purposes, and the sum of £16 7s. 6d., now raised for the Society in the annual collection. It is to be regretted that the objects of the Society are not better understood in this parish, yet we hope that on the return of our resident minister, the Rev. Geo. Salter (now absent in England, whither he has gone in search of health for himself and family), we shall be able to do more than we have hitherto done.

Our parish is not large; there are only about thirty heads of families belonging to our congregation, and the parish has only been regularly organized for one year. This, and the exertion necessary to support our resident minister, and to uphold our Church, it is expected will form a sufficient excuse for this branch not having this year raised a larger sum for the Society.

The Committee has also much pleasure in reporting that a Sunday School has this year been established, at which there has been an attendance of thirty-five scholars, who are apparently interested in the instructions afforded them.

Moore and Plympton.

These Townships have collected £13 5s., and remitted £10 7s. 11d., of which sum 25s. was specially to be appropriated to the Widows and Orphans' Fund.

In Plympton £2 5s. 9d. was collected, and £1 2s. 6d. remitted to the Parent Society.

NEWCASTLE DISTRICT BRANCH.

Reports have been received from the different Parochial Associations, in the following order, viz.:

Cavan Parochial Association.

This Committee report that in consequence of the severity of the weather, the parochial meetings were not as numerously attended as they otherwise would have been. This will be understood, when it is recollected that the present winter has been one of unusual severity, and that in consequence of the

frequent heavy snow storms, the roads in many places have been rendered impassable.

The following improvements, although of a strictly local nature, are deemed not unworthy of notice in this report.

St. Paul's Parochial Committee.

During the past year the graveyard of St. Paul's Church, comprising an area of three acres, has been neatly enclosed with a good substantial board fence, and the interior of the Church is being painted in imitation of oak, and the work is very nearly completed. The cost of these improvements has been estimated at about £50, and it is thought that the portion of the funds of the Parochial Association available for local purposes this year will be sufficient to liquidate the balance still due on them.

This Committee has raised during the past year the sum of £12 5s. 0d. ; one-fourth of which will be transmitted to the Parent Society.

St. John's Parochial Committee.

This Committee report that the members of the congregation have within the past year procured an excellent melodeon, at a cost of more than £20; the expense of which has been defrayed, partly from the funds of the association and partly from voluntary subscription for that purpose. A new lightning-rod has also been erected, with a view to the preservation of the building; and this appears the more necessary, as the previous tower of this Church was destroyed by lightning.

Your Committee are happy to hear that most of the members of the Church in Cavan have faithfully and cheerfully paid their subscriptions to their minister's salary during the past year—an excellent example, and worthy of general imitation, when we consider the greatly increased expenses of the Clergy, in consequence of the high price of all the necessaries of life. If the incomes of the clergy are not regularly and duly paid by their people, difficulty and embarrassment must be the consequence, and the people as well as their pastor will suffer by this neglect and injustice.

The sum of £17 15s. 0d. has been raised by this association for the past year, one-fourth of which is at the disposal of the Parent Society.

Perrytown Parochial Association.

The Rev. John Hilton having been recently appointed to the charge of this mission, two Parochial Associations have been fully established, and your Committee believe with complete success, and with every prospect of future usefulness. There are two Churches within the mission, the one at Perrytown, the other at Elizabethville, five miles apart; and for each congregation an association has been wisely established.

When the objects of the Church Society were duly explained to the people at Perrytown, by the clergy then present at the meeting, they came cheerfully forward and subscribed the sum of £4 15s. 0d. in the church, which, by the zealous exertions of the missionary and two earnest-minded parishioners, was subsequently raised to £12 3s. 9d., most of which was paid at the time of subscribing.

But, taking into consideration the fact that the missionary has been only recently appointed, and that by many of our people there the objects of the Church Society were very little, if at all understood, your committee feel that the mission of Perrytown has done extremely well, and has, in this respect, set a very good example to other rural missions similarly circumstanced.

Elizabethville.

After Divine Service upon New Year's Day, there was a parochial meeting held in the Church at this place, and the members of the congregation have subscribed the sum of £4 13s. 4d. And it is believed that, had the worthy missionary been enabled to visit the people of that neighbourhood in sufficient time, in order to explain to them the nature and objects of the Society, a much larger amount might have been raised.

The members of both Parochial Committees in this mission gladly avail themselves of the three-fourths allotted to local purposes, in order to procure communion plate and covering for the altar, both of which are greatly needed. But a hope is at the same time expressed that hereafter a much larger proportion than one-fourth will be sent to the Parent Society for general purposes.

The Committee at Elizabethville make special mention of Mr. McMurtry, by whose energy and very great exertions the Church at that place has been chiefly erected.

Cartwright Parochial Association.

This Committee report that a highly satisfactory meeting was held according to appointment, at which the clergy then present, together with several of the laity, enforced and very ably advocated the claims of the Society. The people, as on two former occasions, came forward and paid down their subscriptions, amounting to £10. This is an example which might be copied with advantage by some of the older and more settled parishes in our towns and villages.

It appears that the subscriptions in this township have been nearly doubled during the two years that the Church Society has had a Parochial Association established therein. This clearly shews that as the claims of the Society become better known to our people, they are the more ready and willing to assist in supporting and carrying on its operations.

There is one feature in this mission which deserves a special notice in our Report, because it clearly shews the rapid increase of the church in our rural parishes; increased church accommodation is already needed, the church having become too small for the congregation. During the past year the members of the congregation have paid towards their minister's salary the sum of £22 15s. 0d.

Manvers Parochial Association.

After two unsuccessful attempts, the Annual Parochial meeting was held in this township on the 26th of February, and was a novelty in the country, having been held at night. However the attendance on that occasion is reported to have been very good, and the nature and objects of the society, together with its claims for support, were ably elucidated and explained. The result was, that the sum of £15 was subscribed on the spot, the greater part being paid in at the same time. This sum has since been increased by additional subscriptions to £20.

Agreeably to the constitution of the Society, one-fourth of the whole amount raised in Cartwright and Manvers will be forwarded to the Parent Society.

The members of the Church in Manvers have, during the past year, paid the sum of £6 5s. 0d. towards the income of their pastor, the Rev. William Logan, who has charge of this and the adjoining township of Cartwright.

Clarke Parochial Association.

The churchmen of this neighbourhood are actively engaged in an undertaking, the successful accomplishment of which will tax their Christian liberality to the utmost. Measures have already been taken for the erection of a church in the village of Newcastle during the ensuing summer, the estimated cost of which will exceed a thousand pounds. Upwards of seven hundred pounds have already been subscribed, and this sum, it is hoped, will speedily be increased to the amount required.

In the prosecution of this laudable enterprise the parish is largely indebted to the munificence of the Hon. George S. Boulton, who, to the gift of a valuable lot of land, as a site and burial ground, containing about three acres, has added the very liberal contribution of fifty pounds towards the Building Fund.

Notwithstanding the heavy responsibilities in which this undertaking necessarily involves the congregation, your Committee are happy in being able to state that the claims of the Church Society have not been overlooked. Some, indeed, deemed it inexpedient, under present circumstances, to make the usual appeal in its behalf. The Parochial Committee were, however, unwilling to remit their labours even for a season, not considering any pressure of local wants as a sufficient excuse for neglecting to aid the general cause.

The amount this year collected is not quite as large as that of previous years, being only £20; yet the decrease is less, perhaps, than might have been expected. The proportion usually reserved for parochial purposes will, together with other funds in possession, nearly liquidate the debt due on the parsonage; a debt which for years past has absorbed all the means at the disposal of this Parochial Committee.

Grafton Parochial Association.

The same willingness to support the various objects of our excellent Society, which in previous years has distinguished the members of the church in this parish, has also been shewn during that which has just been brought to a close. And if the sum collected does not equal that of the preceding year, it is to be attributed solely to the severity of the weather and the extreme difficulty of calling upon our people for their subscriptions, especially in the back parts of the township.

Your Committee, however, are happy to say that the sum subscribed by this Association amounts to £23 17s. 6d.

For some years past the Incumbent of this Parish has been endeavouring to keep together a congregation, the members of which reside from six to eight miles distant from Grafton, and therefore cannot conveniently attend their Parish Church. The occasional week-day services which they now receive have stimulated them to take measures for the erection of a small Church in that neighbourhood; and this plan has been so far matured, that one individual has consented to give a suitable site of one acre for a Church and Burial ground; and a subscription has been actually set on foot, and the sum of about one hundred and sixty pounds already subscribed for that purpose. This Church, it is hoped, will be erected in the course of the ensuing summer; but without the remotest prospect at present of the congregation receiving a Sunday Service, unless a District Travelling Missionary could be appointed, who would visit this and the neighbouring out-stations in that vicinity.

It is intended that whatever amount may this year be contributed by the people of that neighbourhood shall be kept distinct, and the proportion allotted to local purposes be applied to the building of the Church.

Colborne Parochial Association.

For several years this Parish has been encumbered with a heavy debt due on the glebe, and Parochial Committees have from time to time gladly availed themselves of the portion of the Society's funds allotted for local purposes for reducing and finally paying off this debt. Your committee were in hopes that this desirable object would have been fully accomplished before our annual meeting took place, but unavoidable delays have

occurred to prevent it. The Committee, however, report that measures are now in progress for coming to a final settlement; and they cherish the hope that in the course of a very short time this endowment will have been secured in perpetuity for the benefit of the Incumbent.

The same staff of active and energetic collectors (including the two churchwardens) who have for several years exerted themselves on behalf of the society, have this year also undertaken the work of collection, and the result of their labours as reported is the sum of £28 10s. 0d.

Of this amount the three-fourths available for local purposes will, as above stated, be applied towards liquidating the debt on the glebe.

Darlington Parochial Association.

This Committee report nothing worthy of special notice, except the fact of the recent meeting at Rowmanville having been the best ever held in the place. The speeches of the several clergymen were interesting and effective, evidently awakening an increase of missionary zeal in the audience. But, in consideration of the heavy burden resting upon every member of the congregation, arising out of the erection of a very superior church, towards which they have all contributed most liberally, the meeting was of opinion that subscriptions in the ordinary way could not consistently be applied for the present year; recommending, however, that a special appeal should be made on behalf of the Parent Society, and the amount received be sent directly to Toronto.

Four ladies were requested to undertake the work of collection, and the result of their appeal has been the sum of £12 10s. 0d. Last year the sum of £7 10s., was remitted to the treasurer, so that by the present mode of appeal it appears that the Parent Society will be a gainer of £5.

But still your committee regret any departure from the regular working of the Society, in so important a parish as Darlington.

Cobourg Parochial Branch.

In this parish—naturally expected to take the lead in this district in Church enterprises, from its size, population and comparative wealth—the impediments to a very large contribution to the general funds of the society still continue. It was stated at the last Annual Meeting that a new church had just been completed, and, as is usual in such undertakings, had left a considerable debt to be discharged. Balancing unpaid subscriptions against the amount of liabilities, this debt did not, at the time of the first occupation of the new church, much exceed £500. The Churchwardens, however, found so much subsequently to be done, which was absolutely essential to the comfort of the con-

gregation and the due performance of Divine Service, that a considerable additional expenditure had to be incurred.

The Churchwardens have, since Easter Monday last, been enabled considerably to reduce this debt; and they have besides laid out more than £100 upon the church and church premises. Much more is still to be done to render everything complete; but they have full confidence in being able during the ensuing year to effect most of these necessary improvements, and to pay at least £100 more towards the extinction of the debt.

These are circumstances which must, to some extent, abate the amount of donations to other objects; and amongst these the cause of so excellent an institution as the Church Society may be partially and temporarily effected.

Leaving a present balance in the hands of the local committee of £1 13s. 3d.

In respect to a Cemetery for this parish, arrangements have been concluded for the purchase of ten acres of land for this purpose, in an isolated but convenient position, within the limits of the town; and although occasional aid from this association will be seasonable and useful, it is expected that ultimately a sum will be realized from the sale of burial lots amply sufficient not only to pay for the land, but to enclose, improve and beautify it in such a manner as the universal feeling of the parish would desire to see carried out.

Port Hope.

This parish has expended within its bounds, for strictly local church purposes, about £300 during the past year. The parishioners have also freely and liberally contributed to the erection of churches and building of parsonages in various parts of the Province. They have given largely to the Sabrevois Mission to the French Canadian Roman Catholics, under the sanction and control of the Lord Bishop of Montreal, and they have contribu-

ted also to the Bible Society. The Port Hope Parochial Committee have, however, collected a larger sum than they have ever before forwarded to the Parent Society; and not wishing to retain any part of it for local purposes, the whole amount is at the order of the Parent Society in Toronto; nearly of the whole of the contributors making their donation special to the widows and orphans' fund of the Church Society.

The sum in hand amounts to ten pounds sixteen shillings and three pence.

From this brief review of the various parishes or missions comprising this district branch, it will appear that the claims of the Church Society have not been passed over or neglected during the past year. That whatever the pressure of local wants may have been, they have not been suffered to interfere with missionary operations for the good of the church at large. And when it is considered that each mission or parish enjoying the benefit of a resident clergyman is expected to contribute largely to his support; that there are pew rents to be paid in nearly all the churches; that there is also a weekly offertory, besides four quarterly collections for the society, exclusive of local improvements, such as the building and enlargement of Churches and the erection of parsonages; when all these things are considered, we should feel thankful that the work is so far permitted to prosper in our hands, and that if our excellent society has not yet received that full and general support to which its merits fairly entitle it, yet your committee have learned not to despise "the day of small things;" but rather hopefully to trust, from what has already been accomplished, that in due time much greater results may be anticipated.

The following is a statement of the several Parochial Associations in connection with the District Branch, together with the amounts respectively raised for the Society during the past year.

The following clerical changes have taken place in this district since the last Annual Meeting, viz. :—

The Rev. W. A. Johnson has been succeeded by the Rev. Charles Ruttan, as Assistant Minister at Cobourg; the Rev. John Hilton has been removed from the mission of Norword to that of

Perrytown; and the Rev. J. S. Clarke has been transferred from the mission of Seymour and Percy to the Incumbency of St. Paul's Church, Kingston.

There are at present ten clergymen officiating in the district, with thirteen Parochial Associations in connection with our branch of the society. And the two missions of Seymour and Norwood are vacant.

PRINCE EDWARD DISTRICT BRANCH.

The Prince Edward District Branch of the Church Society has, in addition to its usual difficulties, had the melancholy task of recording the loss it has sustained in the demise of the Rev. Mr. Tooke. It has pleased Almighty God to remove this soldier of the cross from his appointed post—the sentinel from his watch tower—and it but remains that the survivors should buckle on their armour anew, and with fresh courage sustain the contest in which they are engaged.

In compliance with a resolution of the committee of management, the diocesan secretary preached the annual sermon on behalf of the society, to the great satisfaction of the congregation of St. Mary Magdalen, Picton.

The Parochial Committee of Picton report the payment by individuals in the parish, of the sum of £25 cy., for the support of the Missionary at Northport, and also the receipt of £12 10s., being a contribution from Asa Winder, Esq.

The Hillier Association report the impracticability of holding their Annual Meeting at the usual season, owing to the unprecedented drifts of snow; and deplore that from this cause they should have lost the benefit of the eminent services of the Rev. T. S. Kennedy, the secretary.

The Marysburgh Parochial Committee believe themselves to be only speaking the mind of the whole Parish, when they say that they feel deeply the loss of their beloved pastor, the late Rev. Mr. Tooke; and while they are determined as far as in their power to testify their affectionate sympathy for the widow and the orphans, by doing for them all that they ought, they will also by God's grace do their best to provide for another clergyman, when in the providence of God one shall be sent. The amount subscribed is sent in full to the Parent Society in Toronto, as an earnest of their feelings and intentions.

The Northport Parochial Committee report that the sum of £3 3s. 9d. was collected and sent in full to the Parent Society.

The Carrying Place being without a clergyman, the Rev. R. G. Cox, of Hillier, appointed a meeting in Consecon, on the occasion of the visit of the Secretary of the Diocesan Society.—The collection on that occasion amounted to £1 16s. 8d.

BATHURST DISTRICT BRANCH.

Fitzroy and Pakenham.

We are met here to-day to celebrate an occasion, novel as it must be interesting to us—the first Anniversary of the Fitzroy and Pakenham Parochial Branch of the Church Society of this Diocese. It is now a little more than twelve months since the secretary of the Parent Society visited this mission for the purpose of assisting the late incumbent in organizing a branch. Those who were present at the meeting then held and heard the character and objects of the society explained at large by the secretary, and the immense benefits clearly laid before them that must necessarily result to the Church in those places where a branch is established and continued in operation, could not fail to be deeply impressed with the importance of the subject, as well as with a sense of their own individual obligation to sustain so excellent a system by every means in their power. That such an impression was the result of the Rev. gentleman's zealous appeal seems to have been very fairly evidenced in the amount contributed by the mission to this sacred cause.

The object for which the secretary of the society undertook the great labour of visiting us was not accomplished when that meeting dissolved. It was intended to secure a permanent result—a lasting effect. He merely put the ball in motion, and then left us to preserve that motion. This intention we are now met to execute, for the intention of the Society is that the members of each Parochial Branch shall meet annually to receive a report of its past operations, and devise such wholesome measures as may most conduce to advance the interests of the Society.

There cannot perhaps be a more faithful index conceived or planned to point out the true and unmistakable character, condition and feeling of the Church, its principles and its policy, than the annual reports of its "Parochial Church Committees; and did time and the occasion admit, it would be no less pleasing than interesting to analyze the great benefit that results from these annual *reunions* and reports, not only to the Church in its collective capacity, but to the individuals themselves who compose the Church. They spread the truest and minutest information concerning her great work; they stimulate the interest of her members; they foster their affection for their spiritual mother, and by necessary consequence advance the cause of Christian holiness, not in one particular branch or point, but in all branches and in all points, making men good, not in part but entirely; and that from the *only* motive that can originate *true* goodness—a grateful love for Christ, who saves them from their sins, and conducts to immortality and blessedness amidst the dangers, the delusions, the follies, and the madness of a fallen and ruined world.

The Church Society is not a body of which we hear much but see

nothing; but it is a body with which we are acquainted intimately. We ourselves here assembled constitute a true Church Society, though in subordination to the Parent Society—we are a branch. The Parent Society is the stem or trunk from which we spring and by which we are upheld. It permits us not only to retain the three-fourths of our contributions to it for our own local purposes, but it also lends us its aid when we require it and its funds permit. During the past year we have much reason to be thankful for the liberal grant by the Society of £4 worth of books and tracts to us, although not of even twelve months' existence as a branch. These books are at present in circulation throughout every part of this extensive mission; and I have been much gratified with the many assurances I have received of the pleasure with which they have been read, and of the profit derived from them by the members of the Church. The Society has reason to be gratified with the response which this mission has made to its first appeal. We find on referring to its last annual report that £37 5s. has been raised for the Society, of which £10 5s. was forwarded to the Secretary, and the balance expended in the mission. With a portion of this sum the Church in Pakenham has been enclosed with a substantial fence, and serviceable additions made to the furniture of the interior; while Fitzroy Harbour has applied one portion of its share to the increase of the fund collected for the erection of a handsome stone church in that locality, and the other to the purchase of a Sunday School Library. These are visible, substantial, and permanent benefits which we have already derived from a single collection. What future results may we not then anticipate from this Society, when its objects, being more fully known and appreciated by the members of the Church amongst us, their contributions will increase and grow more in proportion to these objects; and it is to be hoped, to their own means? With regard to the amount above stated as the contribution to this mission for the last year to the Society, it must be said that it was considerably swelled by the addition of the pew rents of the Pakenham Church. Members holding pews handed in as their subscriptions the amount of their year's rent. This was not strictly correct, because in the first place pew rents should be appropriated by the vestry; and secondly, it gives a false estimate of the strength of the Society in the mission, which should rather be tested by the direct contributions of its members, than by the application of funds derived from other sources to swell its income.

This mission is a most extensive one, and the members of the Church in it very numerous, numbering in the township of Fitzroy alone in the year 1852, 1172. Taking these facts in connection with their prosperous circumstances, it is not unreasonable to expect a proportionate expenditure upon religious objects. It will then be interesting to know what has been done during the pre-

ceding year. We will first give the figures and then proceed to detail those objects in contemplation, and which are necessary for the more efficient ministrations of the Church in the mission.

The entire sum contributed by the mission during the year 1844—that is, from the 31st of December, 1854, to the 1st of January 1855, exclusive of the salary of the incumbent and sundry sums subscribed towards the erection of the Church in Fitzroy Harbour—amount to £75 10s. 1d. Of this sum, £13 15s. was contributed to defray the expenses of three delegates to attend the meeting of the Synod lately held in Toronto. As however, this amount was not sufficient, the mission was represented in the person of the incumbent only, thus leaving the entire amount subscribed by Fitzroy Harbour, £4 6s. 3d. still on hand, to be applied to the same purpose whenever the Synod meets again, which, there is reason to suppose, will be some time during the ensuing summer. The balance, £37 5s. 0d., is composed of the Church Society collection, of which, as was above observed, £10 5s. was forwarded to the Parent Society, and the balance applied in the way already stated.

From these figures let us now turn to a brief consideration of the state of the mission, in regard to its requirements. The most obvious disadvantage it labours under, is the want of Church accommodation. As respects one end, Fitzroy Harbour, there is much reason to hope, owing mainly to the persevering, well directed and energetic efforts of our churchwarden, W. P. Taylor, Esq., and the zeal of the building committee associated with him, that the numerous and respectable congregation which now attends divine worship in the school house in that village will shortly be enabled to assemble in a more suitable building. It were much to be desired that we could congratulate the mission on the equally near prospect of a Church in the vicinity of the Fourth Line. It is now generally felt that the necessities of the mission require one somewhere in that locality, as it is the most thickly peopled by the members of the Church. The Pakenham Church is most inconveniently situated for the great majority. An united effort will be required to erect a building of a character that will reflect credit upon the religious sentiments of the members of the Church, and contrast more favorably with their own substantial

stone house, than that which now speaks to them so reprovably from its unpainted interior as well as from its black and neglected wooden walls.

The first difficulty usually felt in the erection of a church is to secure an eligible site. This difficulty does not now exist with us, as Mr. Thomas McCormack has liberally offered to make a grant of one acre for this purpose, and to sell five acres adjoining, upon which to erect a Parsonage and for the purpose of a glebe. Mr. Robert Harris has, unasked, likewise expressed his intention to add one acre of well wooded land to the glebe from that end of his farm which adjoins Mr. McCormack's. No more suitable situation could be selected for both objects, and therefore it is to be hoped that these offers will be thankfully accepted.

Perth.

During the last six months this parish has at length taken active measures to build a new church. After many years delay in this important undertaking a good beginning has at length been made. The subscription list runs over a period of five years, so that, supposing the parish to raise £2,000, there will be an annual sum of £400, payable in March each successive year. The subscription list already reaches £1,600, and the first instalment on which is now being paid. In consequence of this parochial movement, our canvass for the association cannot be successful for some time. There are many, who, in their contribution towards the Building Fund, feel they are doing more than they can afford; while others, though similarly circumstanced, yet are reluctant to permit any branch of the Society's important operations to be suspended. Your committee accordingly have solicited aid from such individuals, and herewith forward their names and amount. As the amount is small, the entire is sent to be appropriated to the funds of the Society.

EASTERN DISTRICT BRANCH.

From the Parochial Reports which have been forwarded to the Secretary, the following statement of subscriptions and donations is submitted.

Cornwall and Moulknette.

The Rector reports that he is gratified in being able to state that there is an increase in the gross amount of collections for the Church Society during the past year. This increase, though much smaller than it ought to be, he yet hails as a token that the good cause is at all events not losing ground in the Parish, and he hopes that by God's blessing he may be able to record a more gratifying increase another year.

South Mountain.

In transmitting his report, the Missionary says, the Quarterly Collections from the different objects of the Church Society, have been remitted together with my own subscription, amounting to £4 13s. 9d.

I have been unable, I regret to say, to keep up a Parochial Branch of the Church Society, from the fact that the Committee that was appointed two years ago met with so many discouragements among a people who are striving to pay for land, that they gave up the hope of success for the present. During the year 1855 I travelled on duty 2,038 miles, and I have reason to believe that my labours were blessed.

The sum total of contributions in this district amounts to £280 6s. 0½d, being less than that of last year by £71 13s. 11½d. This deficiency however, may be accounted for by the fact that the Secretary received no report from five parishes.

[The following Reports were accidentally omitted to be inserted in their proper places]:—

Christ's Church, Scarborough'.

Our collections for the current year exhibit a gratifying addition both in subscribers and money over any former year: the amount reported is, in this part of the mission, £16 12s. 6d. currency, against £14 currency last year. The committee exceedingly regret that engagements have to be met which prevent the sending of the whole amount to the Parent Society, as, they are convinced, should be done.

The four special collections for the year, one of which has yet to be taken up, will it is expected realize the sum of nine pounds, and the one-fourth of the annual subscriptions (the Incumbent's £1 5s. being sent undivided,) is, with the latter £5 1s. 10½d. currency, making altogether £14 1s. 10½d. currency sent by this congregation to the Church Society during the year. The Committee ought not to omit in the doings of the year a donation to the incumbent of £12 10s., voluntarily subscribed over and above his stipend; a considerable outlay from time to time on account of repairs to the church going on; and a payment of £10 currency for insurance. Besides which, the ladies of the congregation, with commendable zeal, have procured and paid for new and costly coverings for the Communion Table, Reading Desk, and Pulpit—an appropriate Christmas offering to the sanctuary of God.

St. Paul's and St. Jude's Churches.

A new plan was adopted here of collecting the annual subscriptions at the meeting, instead of before or after it, and the result was an increase of £2 1s. 3½d. currency over last year's amount at St. Paul's: being £9 8d. currency, against £6 19s. 4½d. currency last year. In St. Jude's the amount collected in the usual way was £4 2s. 6d., an increase of 5s. 9d. currency, over last year's contribution.

The four quarterly collections of the two congregations, amounting to about £3 currency, and the amount to be sent out of the annual subscriptions, (£6 7s. 8d. currency,) in all £14 7s. 8d., represent the contributions of this Branch to the Parent Society during the year. There is much reason why this amount should be increased, in the loss of the Clergy Reserves, the general prosperity of the country, and the increasing demand which every where exists for the ministrations of the Church. Your Committee would therefore earnestly recommend that, after this year, the whole of the annual subscriptions should be sent to the Parent Society.

Emulating the example of the Christ's Church congregation, the ladies of St. Paul's have also made a very commendable offering of new covering for the Communion Table, Reading Desk and Pulpit, and a new carpet for the chancel. This, with the presentation of an excellent buffalo robe to the incumbent, and other instances of individual good will, is proof, your committee think, of a sound and healthy feeling, which must tend to promote the influence of the Church, and draw still more closely the bonds of affection which unite the pastor and his flock.

The congregation of St. Judes' Church, with three-fourths of their last year's subscriptions to the Church Society, have made a considerable addition to their Parochial library. A New Year's donation of considerable value has also been made to the Incumbent. Being, in pecuniary matters, more happily situated than either of the other two congregations, they send this year the whole of their subscriptions to the Parent Society.

Christ's Church, West Gwillimbury.

This Church having been greatly shattered by a storm which occurred some time ago, and rendered almost unfit for divine service, it has been determined to pull it down and to build on or as near as possible to the present site a brick Church. Plans and specifications have been supplied, the greater portion of the brick hauled to the spot, and the Committee is only waiting the receipt of tenders for erecting the building before completing the other necessary arrangements. The estimated cost is £600, towards this £330 has been already subscribed.

Trinity Church, Bradford.

This congregation presents an encouraging aspect; the attendance upon divine service has been steady, and though we cannot boast of any large increase, there certainly has been no falling off. The offertory collections have slightly increased. A new melodeon has been purchased at a cost of £26 5s. A bell has also been obtained and hung in the tower of the Church, at a cost of £64 10s. A stone foundation has been laid beneath the tower

and part of the body of the Church. In carrying out these plans for the benefit of the congregation, much energy and praiseworthy zeal have been manifested by the Churchwardens, Messrs. Thompson and Swallow.

St. Paul's Church, Coulson's Hill.

The members of this congregation have to thank God that their long cherished wish has at length been attained in the erection of this Church, which was opened for Divine Service on the 27th of May last. The Rev. Prof. Irving of Trinity College, preached in the morning, and the Lord Bishop of Toronto in the afternoon, after which the Bishop administered the Holy rite of Confirmation to twenty-four young persons. Divine service is celebrated in the Church every Sunday in the year—the third Sunday of every month excepted. The members of the congregation have raised considerable sums in liquidation of the expenses incurred in the erection of this Church, but still there remains a debt of £80, for which no provision has yet been made. The subscriptions in behalf of the Church Society for the year ending April 30th, 1856, amount to £29 13s. 2d.; of this, £1 5s., the Rev. A. Hill's annual subscription, one-fourth of the balance—viz., £7 2s. 0½d., and £3 in aid of the Indian missions, was transmitted to the Parent Society. Of the remaining sums £18 6s. 2½d., £15 6s. 2½d. has been paid in aid of the Nottawasaga Mission, and £2 11s. 0d. for books for distribution.

Orillia.

The Committee of the Orillia Parochial Branch of the Church Society has much satisfaction in reviewing the success which has with the Divine blessing attended the Church's efforts in this mission during the period to which this report refers. It is true the subscription list has fallen somewhat short of the previous year, but the same amount—viz., £6 0s. 0d. (somewhat more than a fourth,) has been sent to the Parent Society. No cause of discouragement can arise from the lack of increase in the Society's income when account is taken of the various important works that have been forwarded in the mission.

Over £500 has been collected and spent on the New Stone Church of St. James building in this village. The debt on St. Luke's, Coldwater Road, has been considerably reduced. The Church in Oro has been opened for Divine Service, and nearly freed from debt. Another instalment of £25 has been paid on the Parsonage house, by the continued praiseworthy efforts of the Ladies' Industrial Society. The four collections for the Society, amounting to £9 10s. 0d., have been taken up and forwarded to the Treasurer at Toronto; and the offertory on other Sundays, applied to charity and the incidental expenses of the Church, has amounted to more than £30.

In conclusion, the Committee would indulge the hope that a Clergyman may shortly be appointed to St. George's Church, Medonte, where an endowment of 100 acres of land partly cleared with a dwelling house upon it, has lately been secured.

Lloydtown and Albion.

Your Committee would take this opportunity to bring under your notice the financial state of the Parish of Lloydtown and Albion, in order to encourage those whose hands have not been idle, and to excite an interest in the minds of those who hitherto have forgotten the work they have to do.

Offertory Collections.—These are taken up at the three principal Sunday appointments, and which, including the quarterly collections required to be made on behalf of the Parent Society, amount to £33 17s. 3½d.; viz—St. Mary's, Mag. Lloydtown, £18; Christ's Church, Bolton, £11; St. James's, £4 16s. 1½d. These collections, after deducting the quarterly ones, are applied to meet the necessary expenses of the several Churches.

The Diocesan Collections, made after our last annual meeting, £47 11s. 10d.

Lloydtown, including what was collected at Woodrow's Station, £20, to which must be added a balance of 9s. 1½d from previous year; of this £6 5s. was forwarded to the Parent Society, and the balance applied to the Parsonage Fund.

Albion, including Christ's Church, at Bolton, from which the greater amount was collected, St James's and Rudley's station £27 11s. 10d., to which must be added £7 5s. 1d., balance from previous year; of this amount £7 5s. was forwarded to the Parent Society, £10 granted to aid in the erection of a new church on Lot No. 20, 2nd Con. Albion, £10 towards Lloydtown Parsonage Fund, £1 18s. in purchasing rewards &c. for Sunday School, leaving a balance in hand of £5 13s. 11d.

Clergyman's Income.—The total amount received towards this fund from the several stations was £100 2s. 6d.; Lloydtown £44 1s. 3d.; Christ's Church, Bolton, £27 5s.; St. James's, £12 10s.; Sandhill, £13 1s. 3d.

Parsonage Fund.—Total amount on Subscription List £227 3s. 7½d. amount received, £160 13s. 7½d.; amount paid by Treasurer £171 14s. 3d.

The Church to which reference was made in our last year's report has been completed and opened for divine service, while the parsonage has been covered in, and we hope the brick work secured from the severe frost.

Your Committee were gratified to learn that a few female friends connected with Christ's Church, Bolton, on Christmas day, forwarded to the wife of the clergyman two pieces of plate, "as a token of their Christian love and regard."

2. Moved by Alderman Duggan, seconded by Rev. T. J. M. W. Blackman :

Resolved, That while we rejoice to learn that the income of the Society has in some measure exceeded that of former years, yet we express our hopes that the increase during the ensuing year will be more commensurate with the increasing prosperity of the country.

3. Moved by the Rev. F. L. Osler, seconded by the Rev. T. S. Kennedy :

Resolved, That the position in which the Church is at present placed in this Diocese more than ever demands the energetic and well-sustained efforts of her children to obtain for her permanence and stability in our land, and that every member of our communion should feel himself imperatively called upon to support the Church Society, inasmuch as it affords an opportunity to high and low, rich and poor, of contributing as God has blessed them with worldly substance towards the carrying out this highly important object.

4. Moved by the Rev. R. Flood, seconded by James Patton, Esq. :

Resolved, That we rejoice specially in the measure of aid which the Society has been able to render to our Home Missions,—more particularly to those to the Indians; and we trust that we shall be able increasingly to occupy this important field of labour.

5. Moved by Colonel O'Brien, seconded by Rev. J. G. Armstrong :

Resolved, That the earnest sympathies of this Society are with the sister Societies of Quebec, Montreal, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and the Venerable Societies for the Promoting Christian Knowledge and for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts; and that we look with the same interest upon their efforts in the service of our common Lord and Master as we cordially believe they feel towards us.
