THE TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE MANAGERS OF
THE PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME
AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

The Lady Managers of the Protestant Orphans Home and Female Aid Society of Toronto in presenting their Twenty-first Annual Report, beg to return thanks to Almighty God for the many benefits they have enjoyed at His hands during the past year.

During the year the number of inmates of the Home has reached 104—10 of whom have been apprenticed, 23 taken by their friends, 35 left the Home, 2 adopted; one little girl named Nellie Pierce died and 33 have been admitted. There are now in the Home 79 inmates—48 Boys; 19 Girls.

Through the kindness of Aldermen Canavan and Hynes an additional grant of \$200, was obtained, to that now received by the Home, for which the ladies beg leave to return their thanks to these gentlemen, and the other members of the Council.

On the 27th of June last, after one or two delays, caused by the inclemency of the weather, a Strawberry Festival was held, through the kindness of the Reverend Provost Whittaker, in the Trinity College Grounds, and was under the immediate patronage of the Lieut.-Governor, and Mrs. Howland was present during the afternoon and was pleased to accept a pretty work-basket from the children for her kindness in attending and contributing so liberally to the Festival. They also presented to the Rev. Provost a book-marker, another to the Rev. Mr. Ambrey of Trinity College. The children were feasted and spent a very pleasant day.

On the 21st. of October an entertainment was given in the Music Hall, consisting of Tableaux Vivants and Concert, and was a great success.

The Ladies desire to express their warmest thanks to Lieut.-Col. Gowan and his brother Orangemen for their great kindness in attending the entertainments given in aid of the Home, and also for the generous gift of money which has been applied in paying off the debt on the land of the Home.

They also desire to thank Dr. Ogden for his care of the inmates of the Home during the past year, and Mr. VanKoughnet, Solicitor to the Home, for the unremitting attention he has bestowed on the affairs of the Institution for so many years. Also to express thanks for the kindness shewn to the institution by the late Capt. Milloy by giving his annual free trip in the "City of Toronto," and to the Nurse and Matron for their attention to the inmates during the year.

They also desire to return their thanks to Mr. Andrew Fleming for his exertions at New Year's in procuring the bountiful supply of provisions gathered by him for them. And to the numerous butchers, bakers and fruiterers for their many generous gifts to the Home during the year.

Last year several friends of the Home, appreciating Mrs. Murray's untiring and most faithful services for fourteen years during which period she has, as first Directress devoted all her spare time to the best interests of the Orphans, conceived the idea of placing over her pew in St. George's Church a handsome stained glass window, with her monogram on the top and these words of our Lord at the bottom. "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me;" and aided by the children of the Home, and those more directly interested in the institution, have carried their idea into execution.

In conclusion they are happy to announce that Mrs. Murray and Mrs. VanKoughnet have reconsidered their determination to resign, as first and second Directresses.
