

## Halifax Industrial School.

#### ANNUAL REPORT.

The President and Directors of The Halifax Protestant Industrial School submit herewith, for the information of subscribers and the general public, their Annual Report for 1898, together with the Financial Statement of the Treasurer, and a list of Cash Subscriptions and other Contributions received during the year.

The number of boys in the Institution at the beginning of the year was thirty-one; received during the year, fifteen, of which four were committed for truancy for terms of four and six months; ten of the former inmates left during the year, owing to expiration of time, leaving thirty-two in the School at the end of the year.

The conduct of the boys during the year was good, with one or two exceptions, and most of them manifested an exemplary interest in their School work, including the instruction imparted to them in the Sunday School. The Day School was conducted by Mr. Gardner, whose excellent qualifications for the work have been referred to in former reports. In connection with the Sunday School the Superintendent was assisted by Mr. Frank D. Morton, Mr. Frank Theakston, and Mr. Wm. A. Hart whose services were much appreciated by the boys. The School Board of the city supplied the School with new desks which are a great improvement on those formerly in use.

The health of the boys was exceptionally good during the year, not a single case of serious illness having occurred to require the services of a physician.

The boys were employed as usual in the shoemaking and kindling wood departments and in gardening and light farm work, due regard being exercised as to their fitness for these employments by reason of their age, physical condition and natural aptitude.

Facilities are afforded for a reasonable amount of recreation, mostly in the way of out-door sports and pastimes. The School needs a gymnasium and recreation room for use during inclement weather and the Directors would be glad to supply it if funds were available for such a purpose.

The usual Christmas festivities were a source of much pleasure to the boys. Thanks to the kindness of friends a sumptuous dinner was given, followed by class exercises in singing by the boys and by addresses from Directors and other friends present.

Several improvements to the School property were made during the year, including the grading of the roadway leading from Quinpool Road to the School, fencing, &c., and some internal changes in the equipment of the School Building.

The Directors regret that they have to report a balance on the wrong side in the financial statement. For many years they have been hampered in their work by a discrepancy between the income received and the expenditure necessary to the maintenance of a satisfactory standard of efficiency, the result being a continuous series of deficits. At the beginning of 1898 the deficit was \$925.31. By exercising a prudent economy in the management of the schools resources this was reduced during the year to \$553.51.

Many generous friends continue their subscriptions from year to year and their loyalty to the interests of the School is much appreciated by the Board

A moderate increase in their number would soon relieve the School of the incubus of arrears and would promote its usefulness in many ways.

During the year the Superintendent received good reports of several boys who left the School in 1897. They succeeded in obtaining steady employment and expressed a grateful appreciation of the value of the training which they had received in the Institution.

In conclusion the Directors have pleasure in testifying to the satisfactory manner in which the Superintendent and Matron — Mr. and Mrs. Norman — continue to discharge their important duties.
