THE PEOPLE'S BATTLE
In this city tomorrow a battle will be waged in which the welfare of the city is involved to a greater extent than in any single contest in the lifetime of this generation.

On one side will be ranged the progressive business men and the workmen of the city, who desire a better system of city government at a time when St. John is entering upon a period of growth and expansion.

On the other side, and opposing them, will be the ward bosses, ward politicians and certain city officials, aided by a few timid souls who are afraid that the citizens of St. John are not capable of self-government.

The line is clearly drawn. Those who are opposed to commission are making considerable noise, but the people are not deceived. They know whence it comes, and who the men are who seek to retain control of civic affairs for purely selfish reasons.

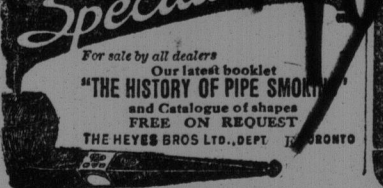
