Recent evidence seems to indicate that under certain conditions, vegetable matter may be converted into coal in a much less period than many geologists have believed to be necessary. At least an approach to such conversion has been discovered into more of the Upper Hartz, in Germany, where some of the timbers originally used as supports have been transformed into what appears to be a genuine lignite, brown coal. The time occupied by the process cannot, it is believed, have extended beyond four centuries—a brief period compared with that usually assigned to coal formations.

It has been shown by Prof. Loomis that more rain falls on the eastern than in the same latitude on the western side of continents. This is true everywhere except in the higher latitudes. Thus the average rainfall at San Francisco is only from a half to a third as great in quantity as in the cast of Pennylvania; and the sween of even more striking difference may be found by comparing More.
