After a long delay and many wearisome disappointments the additional space has been secured from the Dominion Government, adding between 50 and 60 perces Government, adding between 50 and 60 eres to the grounds, nearly doubling the present space. It is preparing this added ground for exhibition purposes, erecting a new grand stand, grading a new half-mile track, building new and commodious conveniences, draining, fencing, etc., that a large number of workmen are engaged, and work will proceed night and day with different gangs of men until all is completed. The work on the grounds is progressing in a very satisfactory manner and by Sept, 5, the opening day, the new buildings now in course of erection will completed.

The improvements contemplated are a new grand stand 675 feet long to seat 12,000 people; a new horse ring track, etc., cost \$58,752; \$00 new horse stalls, 600 cattle stalls, new sheep and pig buildings, \$78,000; \$000 feet of fencing to enclose new ground, \$1000; re-arrangement of fencing in old ring. \$400; enlargement of fencing in Dufferin-street and 2500 feet along Grand Trunk Railway, \$2100; architects' fees and sundries, \$4246; total \$150,000.

The new grand stand, some new stables, the enlargement of the carriage building, the construction of the new half-mile track and horse ring will be completed by Sept. 5, but it is probable the balance of the work will not be commenced until the fall.

The grading of the half-mile track was commenced on Monday morning, the contractor being Mr. John Riley of St. Catharines. The track itself will be the standard half-mile track, 70 feet wide in front of the standard do feet on the back stretch. Inside the outer track will be a second track for the exhibition of harness and saddle horses when the outer track is being usbd for speeding purposes. The old ring will be converted into smaller rings for the judging of cattle and the heavier classes of horses.




