

## By-Laws of the Township of Raleigh

No. 594—A BY-LAW

To provide for the construction of the Robbins and Coutts Drains in the Township of Raleigh, in the County of Kent, and for borrowing on the credit of the municipality the sum of \$702.80 for completing the same.

PROVISIONALLY ADOPTED the Twentieth day of February, A D. 1893.

WHEREAS, a majority in number of the owners, as shown by the last revised Assessment Roll, of the property to be benefited by the construction of the Coutts and Robbins drains, have petitioned the Council of the Township of Raleigh to construct a drain at or near the blind line of the Ninth Concession, and across lots seven, eight and part of nine, to the Carter drain.

Also, to construct a drain commencing at the line between the 6th and 7th concessions, thence northwesterly along the easterly side of the Town line road allowance to the old outlet of the Tilbury East Government drain in Raleigh.

And whereas, thereupon, the said Council procured an examination to be made by W. G. McGeorge, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said localities proposed to be drained, and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said W. G. McGeorge, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefited by such proposed work, stating as nearly as he can the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such proposed work by every lot or portion of lot; the said assessment so made, being the assessment hereinafter by this By-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the lots and parts of lots, hereinafter in that behalf specially set forth and described; and the report of the said W. G. McGeorge in respect thereof, and of the said proposed work being as follows:

Chatham, 22nd November, 1892.

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To the Reeve, Deputy-Reeves and Municipal Council of Raleigh:

Gentlemen,—Having received from your Honorable Body instructions to make an examination and survey with a view to constructing a drain on lots 7 and 8, in the 9th concession of Raleigh. I beg to report that I have made such examination and survey, and have staked out and taken levels along a line for a drain in the position that will best meet the wants of the petitioners, and best drain the lands intended to be drained by the work under the petition and resolution of the Council.

The drain which will be known as the Robbins drain, will begin at the middle line or blind line of the 9th concession of Raleigh, and at the road ditch on the easterly side of the 6 and 7 side road. It will then run along the northerly side of the blind line to Station 12 and 40 feet, the stations

being six rods apart consecutively from Station 0 at the 6 and 7 side road northeasterly along the blind line aforesaid, from Station 12 and 40 feet the drain will run northerly, north-easterly and easterly across the east half of north half of lot 7, the west half of north half of lot 8, and the east half of the north half of lot 8, as shown on the plan accompanying this my report, and easterly on the east half of south half of lot 8 to the Carter drain. The drain is very much needed as it runs through a very wet locality.

Accompanying this I remit a profile giving data for the construction of the work; the excavated earth to be cast three feet clear of the drain.

Chatham, 16th February 1893. To the Reeve, Deputy Reeves and Municipal Council of Raleighe:

Gentlemen,--Having been instructed by your honorable body to make an examination and survey of the drain along the easterly side of the Tilbury East and Raleigh town line in the Sixth Concession, that is at the part of the town line lying beside the Sixth Concession of Raleigh, with a view to its deepening and improvement, to comply with the petition of A. Coutts and We beg to report that we have made such examination and survey, and recommend that it be improved to the data furnished on the profile accompanying this our report, from the drain at the north side of the road between Concessions 6 and 7 of Raleigh, northwestward to the Raleigh portion of the Government drain from Tilbury East; and we recommend that the drain be made a covered drain for a length of 160 feet, from a point midway between station 30 and station 31 northwestward, the covered portion to be tiled with tile of ten inch bore guarded at each end of the covered portion, the ti e to be laid to the gradient of the profile and to be covered to the surface level of the ground. The drain will greatly benefit the town line between Tilbury East and Raleigh.

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the road long ions This sum we assess as in the annexed schedule against the lands and roads benefited. The drain when completed to be kept in repair and maintained at the expense of the Municipality of Raleigh and of the Municipality of Tilbury East, and of the lands, roads and railroad assessed for its construction, said lands, road, railroad and municipalities paying in the same relative proportions as for construction.

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And whereas the said Council are of opinion that the work as reported on by the engineer is necessary and desirable.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, pursuant to the provisions of the "The Consolidated Municipal Act, 1892," and amendments thereto.

1. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted and the said drain and the works connected therewith be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2. That the Reeve of the said township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh the sum of seven hundred and two dollars and eighty cents, being the funds necessary for the work not hereinafter otherwise provided for, and may issue debentures of the corporation for that amount and interest in sums of not less than one hundred dollars each, payable within five years from the date thereof, with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, that is to say, in five consecutive annual payments, to be of such amount that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year shall be equal, as nearly as may be, to the amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period of five years, such debentures to be made payable at the branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the Town of Chatham.

3 That for the purpose of paying the sum of Seven Hundred and Two 80 100 Dollars, being the amount charged against the said lands so to be benefited as aforesaid, other than roads belonging to the municipality, and to cover interest thereon for five years at the rate of five per centum per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied), upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots, and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid against each lot or part of lot respectively, shall be divided into five equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid in each year for five years after the final passing of this By-law during which the said Debentures have to run.

4. That the sum of One Hundred and Thirty-six 15-100 dollars, being the total amount assessed as aforesaid, against the said roads of the said municipality shall be paid by the Treasurer of this corporation out of the general funds of the municipality.

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b. That A. G. Robertson, for the Robbins drain, and R. J. Morrison, for the Coutts drain, be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to let the contract or contracts for the construction of the said drains and the works connected therewith, by public sale to the lowest bidder, (not exceeding the estimate), but every such contractor, with one good and sufficient surety, shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of such contract according to said plans and specifications, and within the time mentioned in such bond (unless otherwise ordered by the Council); and it shall be the duty of the said Commissioners to cause the said works to be made and completed in accordance with such plans and specifications, and to grant orders on the Treasurer to each contractor, less twenty per cent of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted by a competent Engineer; and for the due performance of these and all duties of Commissioners they shall be entitled to receive a sum of: to A. G. Robertson twenty dollars, and to R. J. Morrison fifteen dollars.

6. That this By-law shall be published as provided in Section 571 (2) Con. Municipal Act, 1892, three weeks previous to the final passing thereof, and may be cited and referred to as 'The Robbins and Coutts Drain Bylaw," and shall take effect on and after the final passing hereof.

### No. 595—A BY-LAW

Respecting the sale and disposal of Debentures issued under By-law number 530 of the Township of Raleigh.

1. Whereas under By-law Number 530 of the Township of Raleigh entitled "A By-law to provide for aiding and assisting the Amherstburg, Lake Shore and Blenheim Railway, and issuing Debentures therefor for the sum of Ten Thousand dollars to be given by way of bonus to the said Amherstburg, Lake Shore and Blenheim Railway Company by the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh.

2. And Whereas it was provided by said By-law that after the final passing passing thereof the said Debentures were to be delivered to Tru-tees to be appointed in pursuance of the Statutes of Ontario in that behalf, for receiving and holding the said Debentures, and for the purpo e of realizing the sum of Ten Thousand dollars to be given to the said Railway Company as soon as the work of the said Railway was completed.

3. And Whereas the said Railway Company has complied with all the

conditions contained in said By:law.

4 And Whereas the Council of the Township of Raleigh have entered into an arrangement with the said Railway Company whereby the sum of Ten Thousand dollars cash is to be paid to the said Railway Company and accepted by them in lieu of the said Debentures being delivered to the Trustees for the benefit of the said Railway company as aforesaid, and the said Railway Company has consented to the Council of the said Township of Raleigh selling and disposing of the said Debentures as they may deem proper.

5. And Whereas in order to raise the said sum of Ten thousand dollars

it will be necessary to sell and dispose of the said Debentures,

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Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of

Raleigh, in the County of Kent:

(1) That the above recited arrangement with the said Railway Company as to payment over the sum of Ten thousand dollars in 'ieu of delivering the said Debentures, and as to the sale of the said Debentures, is hereby ratified and confirmed.

(2) That for the purpose of raising the said sum of Ten thousand dollars the Reeve of said Corporation is hereby authorized and instructed to borrow the said sum of Ten thousand dollars from any person or persons, body corporate or bodies corporate, who may be willing to advance the same on the credit of the said Debentures, and for the purposes aforesaid to negotiate, sell and dispose of the said Debentures or so many of them as may be necessary.

(3) That the moneys to arise from the said sale of the said Debentures shall be applied for the purpose of paying and discharging the said bonus granted to the said the Amherstburg, Lake Shore and Blenheim Railway Company by said By-law Number 230, and not for any other purpose what-

soever.

6. This By-law shall come into force and take effect on, from and after the final passing thereof.

### No. 596-A BY-LAW

To confirm the appointment of Solicitor and Counsel for the Township of Raleigh.

Whereas, Matthew Wilson, of the Town of Chatham, and his partners in the firm of Wilson, Rankin, McKeough and Kerr, have from time to time acted as solicitors and counsel for the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, on the instructions of the Reeve or officers or Council thereof, and as such solicitors or counsel have done various services in various proceedings and actions, including an action brought by Sarah Ann Williams and Charles A. Williams against the said corporation, which action is now in appeal from the Supreme Court of Canada in the Privy Council in England.

And whereas, it is desired to confirm and ratify the authority and acts of the said Wilson and his partners in said firm, as solicitors and counsel aforesaid, and to authorize them to continue so to act under this By, law un-

til the same shall have been repealed.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of

Raleigh, in Council assembled;

1. That Matthew Wilson of the Town of Chatham, in the County of Kent, one of Her Majesty's Counsel, and his firm of Wilson, Rankin, Mc-Keough and Kerr, be and are hereby retained and instructed to act as solicitor and counsel for the township of Raleigh (in all matters in which their services may be asked or desired by the Reeve or officers or committees of Council of said Township of Raleigh) under the instructions and directions of the Reeve, officers or committees of Council of said township until this By-law shall have been repealed.

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2. That the said Matthew Wilson be, and he is hereby retained and instructed as solicitor and counsel for, and on behalf of the said corporation to go to England and appear before the Privy Council, in the appeal of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh against the judgment or decision of the Supreme Court in the said action brought by Sarah Ann Williams and Charles A. Williams against the said corporation.

3. That the said Matthew Wilson and the said firm be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to employ for and on behalf of the said corporation in the said appeal in the Privy Conneil, solicitors and counsel as to them and him seem proper under the instruction and directions of the Reeve of said corporation.

4. That the acts and authority of the said Wilson and his partners in said firm, in the actions and proceedings heretofore taken as counsel and solicitors for said Corporation of Raleigh be, and the same are hereby confirmed.

5. That the said corporation reserves and retains to itself and the Council thereof, the full right and authority to at any time repeal this By-law, and to withdraw the power and authority of the said Wilson and his partners in said firm to act as counsel and solicitors as aforesaid.

6. That the said corporation reserves and retains to itself and to the Council thereof the full right and authority at any time (either while the said Wilson and his partners in said firm may be acting as counsel and solicitors as aforesaid or otherwise) to retain and employ other counsel and solicitors, as the said corporation and the Council thereof may seem proper or in the interest of said corporation.

## No. 597-A BY-LAW

To appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh in the County of Kent:

1. That the following sums of money be and they are hereby appropriated for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the said Township of Raleigh, that is to say:

In the First Rural Road Division, the sum of three hundred dollars. In the Second Rural Road Division, the sum of three hundred dollars. In the Third Rural Road Division, the sum of three hundred dollars.

In the Fourth Rural Road Division, the sum of three hundred dollars. In the Fifth Rural Road Division, the sum of three hundred dollars.

And that the Commissioners of the said respective Rural Road Divisions expend the same.

2. That the following sums accruing due from Statute Labor tax be expended in the several Statute Labor Divisions from which they were collected, as reported by the Clerk, that is to say:

In the First Rural Road Division, the sum of ......\$24 32

In the Second Rural Road Division, the sum of\$23	90
In the Third Rural Road Division, the sum of 30	
In the Fourth Rural Road Division, the sum of 18	
In the Fifth Rural Road Division, the sum of 12	
And that the Commissioners of R. R. Divisions superintend the	same

within their respective Divisions.

3. On the Town line between Raleigh and Harwich, the sum of one hundred dollars, and that A. H. White be Commissioner to expend the same.

- 4. On the Town lines between Raleigh and the Town of Chatham, the sum of twenty-five dollars, and that A. Williams be Commissioner to expend the same.
- 5. On the Town line between Raleigh and Tilbury East, the sum of one hundred dollars, and that R. J. Morrison be Commissioner to expend the same.
- 6. That R. J. Morrison be and he is hereby appointed Commissioner to superintend the Pike Drainage and Pumping Works.
- 7. Provided that the sums appropriated in the third, fourth and fifth clauses of this By-law are conditional on equal amounts being appropriated for the said purposes respectively by the adjoining municipalities.
- 8. That it shall be the duty of the said Commissioners so appointed to expend the sums hereinbefore appropriated for the purpose and in the manner so provided; and they are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer of this Corporation to parties filling contracts thereon, not exceeding the amounts so appropriated for such purpose respectively, less the amounts hereunder specified as overdrawn by the Commissioners of the preceding year, stating on such order the nature of the work done and where it was performed. Provided always, that no Commissioner shall exceed the amounts hereinbefore appropriated without having first obtained the consent of the Council, and the Treasurer notified thereof by the Clerk.

9. That it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to charge the following accounts with the sums as shown by the Auditor's report to be overdrawn,

In R. R. R. Division No 1, the sum of	\$130 00
In R. R. Division No. 2, the sum of	12 65
In R. R. Division No. 5, the sum of	18 55

## No. 598-A BY-LAW

### No. 599—A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 3871, known as the Pike Drainage Works By-law.

Whereas, under the provisions of the Consolidated Municipal Act, 1892, Municipal Councils may pass By-laws to amend By-laws which may have been passed for the construction and maintenance of drainage works, and which may have been acted upon in whole or in part, and which do not provide sufficient means for the completion of the work or redemption of the Debentures authorized to be issued thereunder.

And whereas, the pumping account of the said Pike Drainage Works is now overdrawn to the extent of £t least four hundred dollars, as shown by the report of the Treasurer.

And whereas, it is necessary to provide for the said amount so over-drawn

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh.

1. That there shall be raised, levied and collected upon and from all the lands and roads assessed for the said Pike Drainage Works, the said sum of four hundred dollars, by a rate pro rata on all the lands and roads so assessed therefor, sufficient to discharge the said sum and in addition to the annual rate authorized by the said By-law numbered 387½ for the redemption of the Debentures and maintenance of the said works in the year 1893.

## No. 600-A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 498, know as "The Tilbury East Government Drain Outlet By-law."

Whereas, under the provisions of the Municipal Act, Municipal Councils may pass By-laws to amend By-laws which may have been passed for the construction of drainage work, and which may have been acted upon in whole or in part, and which do not provide sufficient means for the completion of the work, or redemption of the debentures authorized to be issued thereunder.

And whereas, the preliminary expenses attendant upon the survey of

the portion of the said drain situated in the Township of Raleigh amounts to the sum of three hundred and twenty 34/100 dollars.

And whereas, no provision was made for the payment of the said sum of three hundred and twenty 34/100 dollars in the estimated cost of the drain, which was constructed by the Corporation of the Township of Tilbury East, and known as "The Tilbury East Government Drain Diverted Outlet," and which was constructed in lieu of the proposed improvement in the Township of Raleigh.

And whereas, the said sum of money was advanced by the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, with a view to the improvement of the said

drain at the request of the ratepayers on the said drain.

And whereas, it is necessary to provide funds in order to recoup to the said Corporation of the Township of Raleigh the moneys so advanced by them in anticipation of the said work being proceeded with.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, under and by authority of "The Consolidated Municipal

Act, 1892," and amendments thereto in that behalf.

1. That for the purpose of repaying to the said Corporation of the Township of Raleigh the said sum of three hundred and twenty 34/100 dollars, so advanced by them for the purposes aforesaid, the said By-law No. 498, known as "The Tilbury East Government Drain Outlet By-law" be so amended as to add the sum of three hundred and twenty 34/100 dollars to the sum therein authorized to be raised.

2. That for the purpose of paying the said sum of three hundred and twenty 34/100 dollars, there shall be raised, levied and collected in the year 1893, off, and from all the lands and roads assessed for the construction of the said work, a supplementary levy, sufficient to pay and discharge the said debt, by a rate pro rata on the original assessment levied on the said lands

and roads

## No. 601—A BY-LAW

To assess and levy rates for County, Township and School purposes for the year 1893.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Cownship of Raleigh, in the County of Kent.

I. That the following sums shall be levied and collected upon and from all the rateable property of the Township of Raleigh for the year of our Lord 1893.

(1) The sum of \$5281.37 for the general purposes of the County of

Kent by a rate of 2 15/100 mills in the dollar.

(2) The sum of \$7,260 for the general purposes of the Township of Raleigh, as per Schedule "A" hereunto annexed, by a rate of 3 mills on the dollar.

(3) The sum of one thousand nine hundred and seventy six 50/100 dollars, being an amount al to the Legislative school grant of \$506, and

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x 50/100 3506, and the amount required to be raised for each school section as provided in Section 109 of "The Public Schools Act, 1891," by general rate of one thousand four hundred and seventy 50/100 dollars, exclusive of the property of certain supporters of the separate schools, by a rate of 91/100 of a mill on the dollar.

II. That the Clerk of this Corporation is hereby required to levy a special rate (over and above all other rates) upon, and which shall be collected from all the rateable property included in each and every School Section the Trustees of which shall furnish him, on or before the 24th day of August, with a written statement signed by the Secretary-Treasurer, and certified by the seal thereof, of the amount required for Public or Separate School purposes in each School Section (less the amount required to be raised as aforesaid by general rate, such a rate pro rate as will amount to the sum so required, as near as may be; and the Treasurer of this Corporation is hereby authorized and instructed to pay to the order of the Secretary-Treasurer or Trustees of each School Section all moneys so levied and credited to such School Section.

III. That the rates so imposed by this by-law shall be collected by the Collector of rates for the said Township of Raleigh, and paid over to the Treasurer of this Corporation, in bankable funds, on or before the fourteenth day of December, A. D. 1893, in so far as the law will enable him so to do, unless otherwise ordered by this Council.

IV. That William H. White be an l he is hereby appointed Collector of rates for the said Township of Raleigh during the current year and until the said rates are all collected and a due return made to the Treasurer of this Corporation, (the amount so collected to be paid at least every two weeks), conditionally upon his furnishing bonds duly executed by himself, and good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by this Council, in the sum of twenty thousand dollars. And for the due performance of these and all duties of Collector, as provided by the Statutes of Ontario and the Bylaws of this Municipality, he shall be paid the sum of one hundred dollars, inclusive of all duties that do, or may pertain thereto.

## No. 603-A BY-LAW

To raise \$2000 to comply with a judgment of the Court in Williams et al. vs. Raleigh.

Dated 4th September, 1893.

Whereas proceedings were taken under which certain drainage works were constructed in Raleigh under acts respecting drainage works and local assessments therefor.

And whereas on account of such proceedings certain liabilities were cast upon the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh or Council thereof

And whereas a certain action in respect of such drainage works was brought in the High Court, and carried on against said Corporation by Sarah Ann Williams and Charles A. Williams; and whereas said action has been dismissed, except in respect of such drainage works called No. 1 Drain, which is a part of a system of drainage works constructed as aforesaid and commonly known as the Government Drain in Raleigh.

And whereas in order to comply with the judgment now entered and standing against said corpo ation in respect of said Government Drainage Works, it is necessary (amongst other things) to pay the costs awarded by the judgment of the courts to said Sarah Ann Williams and Charles A. Williams

And whereas the lands and roads liable to assessment and assessed for such Government Drainage Works are those hereinafter set forth.

And whereas each lot, part of lot and road, hereinafter set forth, was assessed and charged the sums hereinafter set opposite to it in the first column of figures representing dollars and cents.

And whereas it is the duty of the Council of said Corporation to enable the Corporation to comply with such judgment in respect of said drainage works in said action, by charging any sum of money that may be required, pro rata upon the lands and roads liable to assessment for such drainage works.

And whereas the sum now due and payable, and required to enable the corporation to comply with such judgment amounts to at least \$2000, and the said Council desires to charge the same as provided by law.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled:

1. That he said sum of two thousand dollars be and the same is here-

by charged pro rata upon the lands and roads liable to assessment for said drainage works as hereinafter set forth.

2. That each lot and part of lot and road be and the same is hereby charged with the sum hereinafter set opposite to it in the second column of figures representing dollars and cents.

3. That the sums charged against roads be paid out of the general funds of the municipality of Raleigh, and applied towards complying with

said judgment.

4. That the sum charged against each lot or part of lot be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied) upon such lot or part of lot; and that the moneys realized by such charges and levies be applied towards complying with said judgment.

5. That this By-law shall come into force and take effect on, from and

after the day on which the same shall be finally passed.
