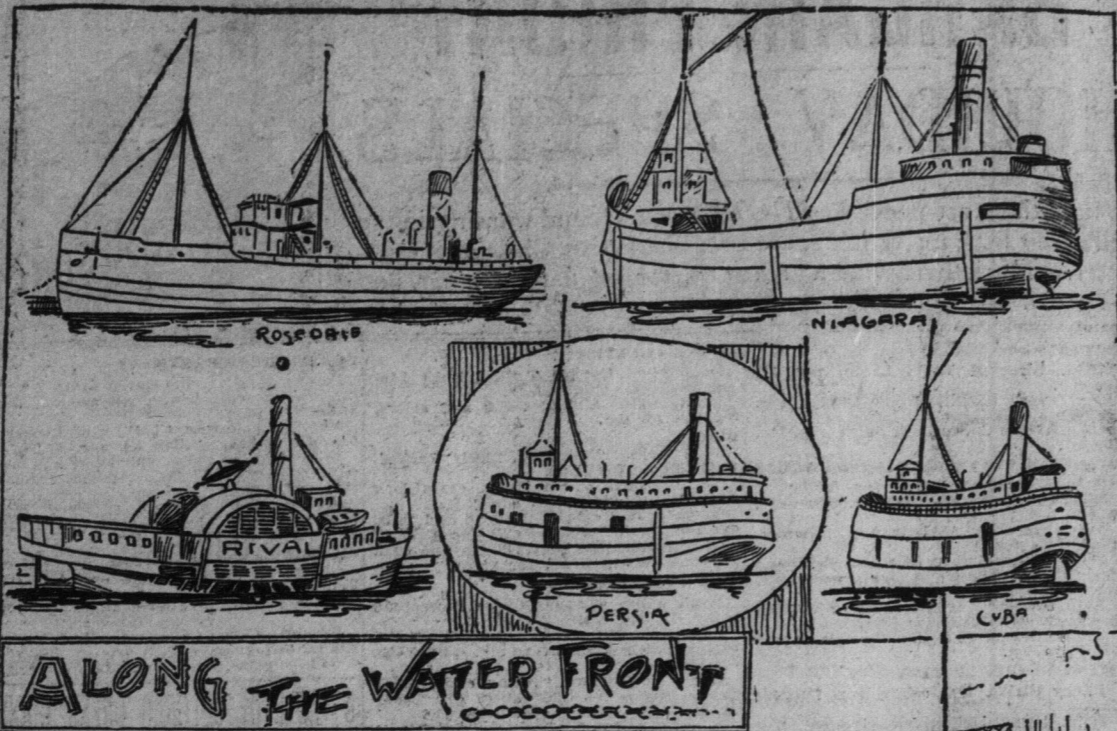

Dominion Government Will Have to Pay

THOSE INDIAN ANNUITIES.

That is the Judgment of the Imperial Privy Council.

British Foreign Office Says Statement That British, French and Russian Squadrons Were Ordered to the Barbadoes Were Unfounded - A Spanish Newspaper Speaks Boldly in Regard to the United States - The French Budget-General Cable News.

London, Dec. 9.-The Judicial Committee of the Privy Council to-day dismissed both of the Canadian appeals which they had under consideration since Nov. 11. The cases were the appeal of the Dominion of Canada against the Province of Ontario and that of the Province of Quebec against the Province of Ontario, involving the liability of the provinces to the payment of certain annuities to Indians or lands which the latter ceded to the former Province of Upper Canada prior to the formation of the Dominion.

The Judicial Committee said it was clear that under the terms of the treaties the Indians had not obtained the right to annuities beyond the promise, which was merely a personal obligation of the Governor representing the province to pay the annuities when they should become due. The Indians, the committee held, had not obtained the right giving them an interest in the territory they surrendered and the province was not obliged to apply the revenue derived from the surrendered lands to the payment of annuities.

AS REGARDS TURKEY.

The British Foreign Office queried as to certain reports.

London, Dec. 9.-A representative of the U. A. P. visited the Foreign Office to-day for the purpose of ascertaining the truth of a despatch published by a New York newspaper this morning, and carried here, according to the Russian Standard, with the assent of Germany, Austria and Italy, would at once compel the Sultan to adopt a radical reform.

The Sultan to adopt a radical reform under the joint supervision of the three powers first named.

The British, French and Russian squadrons were under orders to assemble at the entrance to the Dardanelles without delay, and in short that the Sultan was to be reduced to a state of vassalage. After reading the despatch, the Foreign Office authorities declared the statements contained therein to be absolutely unfounded. The statement, they said, had not been changed in the slightest degree. The statements, they added, were still trying to agree upon a plan of exerting pressure upon the Sultan to induce him to enforce the reforms in Turkey that had been promised, but it would be a long time before they could think of moving troops and ships. Still, they said, they were glad that stories of the kind shown them were being published, as they might have the effect of further frightening the Sultan into action in the direction of instituting reforms.

The Birmingham Post prints a London despatch similar to the one described above, qualifying it by saying "it is stated" that fleets will shortly be mobilized, in order that the Sultan be ready if it should become necessary to enforce reforms in Turkey.

These reports do not attract much attention here, as they are regarded as belonging to the class of solutions of the Turkish situation which are always shown to be false when enquired into.

FRENCH BUDGET.

Parliament Will be Asked for Money to Strengthen the Fleet.

Paris, Dec. 9.-The Budget Committee of the Chamber of Deputies to-day heard the Premier, M. Meunier, as well as M. Cochery, Minister of Finance, and Admiral Besnard, the Minister of Marine, on the subject of M. Lockroy's amendment demanding a credit of 200,000,000 francs for the navy.

The Minister of Marine declared that the condition of the navy was not so unfavorable as its critics had represented. However, had for several months been studying a program for increasing the strength of the fleet, and it would soon be decided to ask Parliament for money to carry it out. But the Admiral, in conclusion, the Government would reject any suggestion to re-establish any extraordinary budget for the navy.

SPANISH SHOWS HER TEETH.

The Has Forces Sufficient to Punish Interference of the United States.

Madrid, Dec. 9.-The Madrid newspapers are greatly excited over the references to Cuba and Spain contained in President Cleveland's message to the United States Congress, and declare the intervention of the United States in Cuba would be unacceptably humiliating to Spain.

Correspondencia Militar says Spain has forces more than sufficient to punish any interference on the part of the United States in the affairs of Spain.

The Herald says that the Cabinet will hold a meeting to-day for the purpose of considering President Cleveland's message to Congress. Ex-Premier Sagasta declares that the message is of so much importance that he will await the receipt of the whole text of the document before discussing it. Some of the Spanish newspapers declare that the message provokes Europe, not Spain alone.

THE PHILIPPINE REVOLT.

A despatch from Manila says that General Polvorcia has assumed the duties of Governor of the Philippine Islands. General Blanco, formerly Governor of the Philippine Islands, has been appointed to the head of the king's military household.

VANCOUVER TO BLAME.

The Admiralty Court Holds Her Responsible for the Collision with the Lake Ontario.

London, Dec. 9.-The Admiralty Court has decided that the steamer Vancouver, which ran into the steamer Lake Ontario in the St. Lawrence River during a fog on the night of Aug. 9, was solely to blame for the disaster. The court held that Vancouver was proceeding at a high rate of speed.

KITSON WILL GO TO LAW.

Arthur Evidently Thinks That He Has Been Done By - The Morning Announces that Arthur Kitson will bring an action against Sir James Kitson.

Paris, Dec. 9.-The Figaro strongly approves of President Cleveland's message to Congress, and says: "It proves that, apart from the fomenters of international discord, there is a reserve of wise men in America who are swayed solely by the dictates of conscience and reason."

The Gaulois says: "The message is of a nature to arouse the susceptibilities of Europe and to attract the attention of the chancelleries."

Eubonic Plague spreading.

Bombay, Dec. 9.-The eubonic plague which has been prevalent here for some time past is spreading rapidly. There were 59 new cases and 23 deaths from the disease yesterday. The mortality in the city for last week, from all diseases, was 1200.

A Spanker Killed.

Paris, Dec. 9.-A despatch to Le Journal from Marseilles says an American colonist named Land was accidentally shot and killed by a detachment of French troops, who had been sent to rescue him from the rebels who had attacked him.

Bayard Accepts the Banquet.

London, Dec. 9.-The Lord Mayor of London, having invited U. S. Ambassador Bayard to accept a farewell banquet at the Mansion House, Mr. Bayard replied that it afforded him great pleasure to accept the invitation, and has fixed the day of the entertainment at March 2.

A Brand New Prince.

Dresden, Dec. 9.-Prince Louise Antoinette Marie, wife of Prince Frederick August of Saxony, gave birth to a son to-day.

WALKED INTO AN OPEN TRENCH.

The Serious Accident Which Befell Old Mr. Muller at Niagara Falls - His Back Broken.

Niagara Falls, Ont., Dec. 9.-(Special.)-About 9 o'clock last night William Muller, sr., a well-known resident of this place, met with a very serious accident, which will, in all probability, prove fatal. While on his way home he walked into an open sewer trench at the corner of Park-street and Welland-avenue. Mr. Muller was found by the watchman who keeps watch over the place at night. He was lifted out of the hole and taken to his home and medical aid summoned. Dr. McDiarmid attended him and found that his spine was fractured about four inches below the neck. Mr. Muller has not as yet regained consciousness.

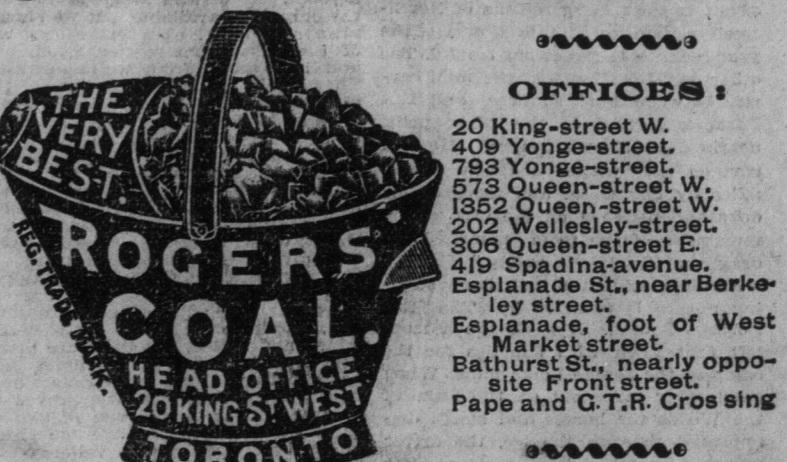
