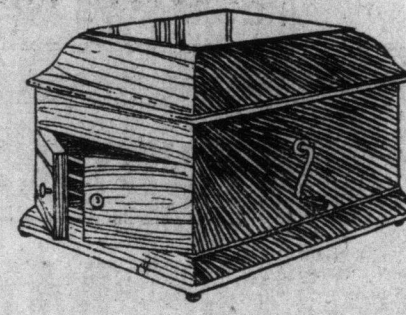

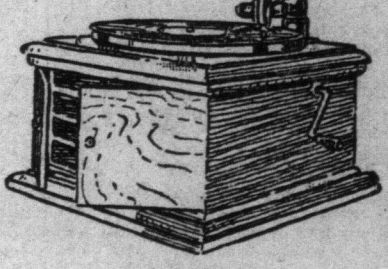

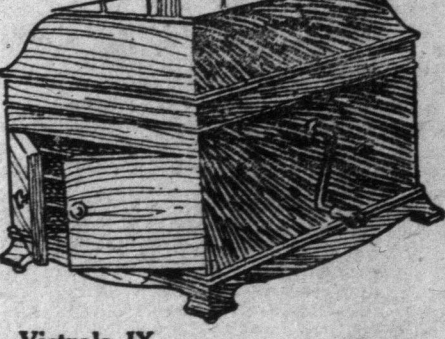

## Books for Boys Some Hints for Your Book Hunt, by Katharine Hale.

THE heart of a boy does not always turn the way that his fond parents, or even the well-meaning publisher would have it when it comes to the matter of books. "Give me a lively story," quoth the normal red-blooded youth—and this year "there is quite a choice of such." I should say that "Michael, Brother of Jerry," the latest dog story of Jack London, was decidedly "lively," and full, moreover, of colorful pictures of sailing in the South Seas, of tropical islands, and matters, told by a master of story-writing.

"The Loom of Youth" is a remarkable boy's book, written by a boy himself. Also Waugh is a young Englishman of eighteen, who writes about his own life at a famous public school. He tells the story of the school as it is, or was, in 1915, and there is everything that would interest Canadian boys in the comparison and contrasts with our own school life.

"Further Adventures of Nils" is a sort of story by Selma Lagerlof, a Swedish writer, who is the only woman to win the Nobel Prize for literature. To one who loves animals and birds and strange legends, this will be treasure-trove, indeed. There are also fascinating animal stories by Ernest Thompson Seton—"Wild Animals at Home," and "Two Little Savages," the latter full of wood lore and Indian lore.

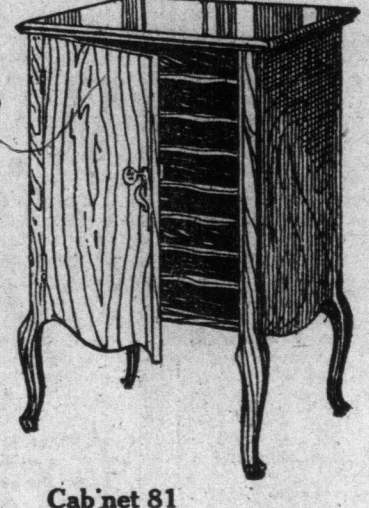

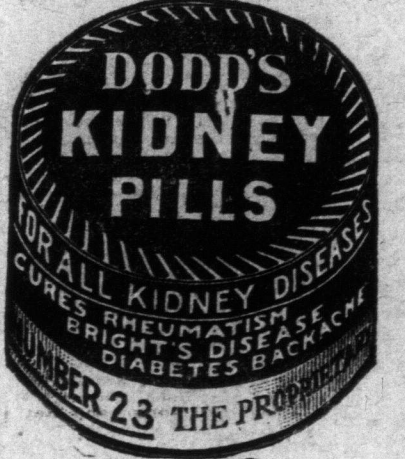

TO FIND COST OF LIVING

Edmonton, Dec. 11.—What it costs to live in Edmonton is again being looked into with a view of settling the question of wages for the coal miners. The cost of living commission appointed by the federal department of labor is meeting in another quarterly session, and is taking evidence from merchants as to the prices prevailing on December 1 on the several commodities used by miners for ordinary domestic purposes.

NEW ALASKAN COAL AREA
