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FORTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF

THE MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL.

The Annual Meeting of the Montreal General Hospital was held on the 18th May, when the Secretary presented the following Report :

The Board of Governors of the Montreal General Hospital present their Annual Report to the Corporation, with a concise statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Society for the year ending 28th April, 1869. The income of the year has been \$17,047.95, and consists of the following items :—

The expenditure of the year has exceeded that of the preceding year by \$2,332.61, an excess which has been partly attributable to the purchase of new furniture for the fever hospital, and a new kitchen range, but chiefly to the large increase in the number of patients admitted, and the consequent additional number of nurses and servants employed, and the large amount of food required. For while there have been disbursed this year for furniture \$532 more than in the preceding year, there have been expended \$315 more for employées and \$1,175 more for food, medicines and medical comforts.

So inadequate have been the resources of the the Institution to meet its increasing expenditure that the Committee of Management have been reluctantly obliged to request the Attending Physicians to reduce the daily number of in-door patients to 100, a step which must of necessity exclude many of the sick poor from the benefits of the Charity, and which at the same time strongly enforces the obligation resting upon the citizen of contributing to the endowment of the Hospital to an extent commensurate with the wealth of the city and the claims of our indigent sick.

The number of persons treated as in-door patients during the year has been one thousand five hundred and eight (1508), an increase of 91 over that of the preceding year; and ten thousand one hundred and ninety-two (10,192) out-door patients have received medical advice and medicine during the same period, an increase of seventeen hundred and seventy-three (1773) over the number of the preceding year.

The new fever hospital, the completion of which was announced at the last annual meeting, was opened for patients last summer and proved most opportune, as an epidemic of small-pox prevailed in the city in the latter part of the year, and 150 cases were treated within its walls. It is impossible to estimate how much the citizens owe to the existence of such a refuge for the subjects of that frightful disease, or how wide-spread the epidemic might have been, if those afflicted with it had been obliged, for want of such an institution, to remain amidst their friends in their own dwelling.

Amongst improvements effected during the year may be mentioned, the erection of a new shed for coal, the introduction of steam into the laundry, and a very much needed and thorough alteration of the dead-house. In consequence of the cost of the newly erected fever hospital, and coal-shed, and the introduction of steam into the entire building, and above all the annually increasing expenditure of the institution, a Committee of Governors was appointed in September last, to call upon the citizens for special subscriptions to the Permanent Fund of the Society, and that Committee made the following appeal by circular to the citizens:

MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL:

The undersigned, a Committee of the Governors of the Montreal General Hospital, submit the following facts, for the consideration of their fellow-citizens:

1st. A fever and small-pox wing has this year been added to the General Hospital, and steam furnace and apparatus have been introduced for heating the entire building. The cost of these, together, has been \$18,000; towards which Mr. William Molson generously contributed \$5,000, leaving a balance of \$13,000 unprovided. But these are much needed and valuable permanent additions to the property; indeed the new wing was an imperative necessity, in order to prevent the spread of disease within the institution itself and throughout the city.

2nd. The expenditure of the Hospital for this year's current expenses, apart from any special outlay, will be about \$20,000, expended upon 1,400 in-door and 8,500 out-door patient, at a cost of nearly \$14 per each in-door. This may be thought extravagant, but it would seem impossible with all the economy that can be used, to reduce it.

3rd. The income from all sources, upon the basis of last year, will be \$17,000, leaving \$3,000 unprovided. The whole deficit upon the present year appears to be \$16,000. To provide which has been, and is, the anxious concernment of the Board. And this want alone, if merely stated, reveals the circumstances of the Hospital at this time.

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4th. The ordinary sources of income, which are mainly the government grant and city collections, are upon their present scale wholly insufficient. As to the former, the grant of the government of Quebec of \$4,000 a year to this one, ill compares with grants to other hospitals; but the general government has been deaf to every appeal of the Governors for its increase:

As to the city contributions, liberality on the part of many persons is to be acknowledged, but the Governors deplore the fact, which they must plainly state that less than \$500 out of the city contributions of \$4000 come from their Roman Catholic friends, while, nevertheless, one half of the in-door, and three-fourths of the out-door patients who receive the benefit of the Hospital are Roman Catholics. Is this just?

In view of this fact which has been before published, the Governors regret that their Roman Catholic fellow-citizens so inadequately share in the maintenance of the General Hospital. Application for some considerable contribution has been made to the authorities of the Church but thus far without success.

5th. It only remains after the statement of the foregoing facts, that the Governors should appeal for aid to their townsmen of all classes and creeds.

6th. The necessity of the Institution and the aim of the Governors at the present time by this special appeal is to obtain forty thousand dollars, so that actual deficit may be supplied, and addition may be made to the Endowment Fund; and it must be frankly stated that if aid be not afforded, the work of the Hospital must be curtailed and its usefulness impaired.

The undersigned have been appointed a Committee by the Board of Governors to make this effort which is proposed as a special effort, not to take the place of the ordinary annual collections for the Hospital, but to supplement these by special and considerable donations which the more wealthy of their fellow-citizens are now earnestly asked to contribute, and to obtain which the undersigned will, as generally as they may be able follow up this appeal by a personal call. In this crisis of the old and useful institution which they represent the undersigned expect to meet with liberality.
