The Conde de Espana was a wholesale murder-er, and was slain by his own people; Moreno, the political butcher of Malaga, was hinself assassinated in the end; Quesada, the trampler of the Madrid populace beneath his horse's hoofs, was torn by that populace asunder, and his mutilated fingers stirred a convivial bowl for the Nacionales who slew him; the Governor of Cadiz, in 1830, was assassinated for his severities, in the street; Elio, Captain General of Valencia, was the excutioner of his political adversaries, and perished on the scaffold. The contemporary annals of Portugal furnish similar instances; for, within ten years, Gomez Freire, an unpopular Minister, was shot down in the streets of Lisbon, Telles Jordao, the inhuman persecutor of the Constitutionalist prisoners in the Tower of St. Juliar, was torn in pieces and as frightfully mutilated as Quesada was in Madrid. This is the true mirror for Ministers in the Pennisula—the awful lesson which "must give them pause" in the midst of their riot of power and berbarous instincts. "No hay boda sin tornaboda," says a significant Spanish proverb—"There is no wedding but there is a day after it."

WINTER IN THE SOUTH OF SFAIN.—In this delicious climate vegetation is never suspended, except by the excessive heats of summer.
