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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

Quebec Provincial Bille Association.

CONSTITUTION.

RULE 1. That this Association be called the "Quebec Provincial Rifle Association," and shall have for its object, the encouragement of Rifle shooting in the Province.

2. That the Annual subscription for Individual Members be two dollars, and a donation of ten dollars in cash, at any one time, shall entitle the donors to be elected a life member.

3. That any regularly constituted Rifle Association in the Province, may become affiliated to this Association, by the payment of an annual subscription of not less than ten dollars, the number of memberships to be in proportion to one for every half dollar so subscribed.

4. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Council composed of the Office bearers, and two representatives from each affiliated Association. Five to form a quorum.

5. The Office bearers of the Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the annual meeting.

6 A Patron and Vice-Patrons may be elected at the first meeting, and afterwards whenever a vacancy occurs.

7. The Deputy Adjutant Generals and Brigade Majors of the Province, being members of the Association, shall be members, ex-officio, of the Council.

8. The Representatives to the Council must be members of Association, either by affiliation or otherwise, they shall be chosen annually by the Association they represent, and their names sent to the Secretary, at least, one month before the annual meeting.

- 9. The Council may from time to time, make such By-Laws for their proper guidance as they may deem necessary, but no by-law to be altered or new one proposed, without at least such notice being given to each member of the Council, as by the by-laws may be determined.
- 10. The annual prize meeting shall be held at such time and place, as may be agreed on at the annual business meeting.
- 11. The annual business meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the by-laws.
- 12. An Annual report shall be made by the Secretary and Treasurer and submitted to the Council, previous to publication.
- 13. At the annual meeting, the Council shall appoint an Executive Committee, to carry out the Annual Prize Meeting, under such regulations as may be made by the Council from time to time.

BY-LAWS.

- 1. That the annual meeting of the Association be held at Montreal on the third Thursday in May.
- 2. Extraordinary meetings may be called by the Secretary, when required, by any six members of the Council, fifteen days notice of such meeting being given to each member of the Council, and the requisition must state the object for which the meeting is called
- 3. Three Auditors shall be appointed annually, whose duties shall be to examine the Treasurer's accounts previous to the annual meeting.
- 4. The Treasurer shall be required to deposit from time to time—all sums of money paid over to him, on behalf of the Association—in a safe bank.
- 5. The payment of sums for current expenses, must be authorized by the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents. Other payments, to be made only upon the authority of the Council.

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SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The operations of the past year have been very successful and gratifying to the Council. Although the number of Competitors was not as large as in 1870, the competitions were entered into with great spirit, and were conducted with order and efficiency. The matches were opened on the 15th of August, and closed on the 21st-With the exception of a thunder storm on the 17th, the weather was favourable for shooting. As soon as the scores were declared on the bulletin board at the end of each match, winners were paid their prizes, so that at the conclusion of the meeting, there was no confusion or delay.

The total number of competitors entered was 1484; in 1870 there were 1708, showing a decrease of 224. This falling off was not from any lack of interest in Rifle shooting among the members of the Volunteer Force and others, but from the fact, that nearly all the Corps of Active Militia had 'passed sixteen days in Camp in the months of June and July, and therefore many of our marksmen could not get away from their employments to attend the matches, also the absence of the Regular Troops from Montreal, who had hitherto contributed to swell our numbers at previous matches. The welcome presence of a number of competitors from all parts of Ontario, was a marked testimony, that the liberality of the Council was duly appreciated, in throwing open (with but two exceptions) the matches to all competitors. This feature in our matches compared favourably with the practice of any other Provincial Association in the Dominion.

The system of consecutive firing adopted for the first time in Canada, gave great satisfaction, and was a saving of time. Each competitor after taking his sighting shoots, fired his number of rounds, and was at liberty, till his squad went to the next range, and it enabled the Executive Officers to carry on the matches

with greater expedition than the old way. This system was afterwards tried at the Dominion matches at Halifax, and at District matches in this Province, and was unanimously adopted.

Another novelty introduced in two of our matches, was that of Optional Rifles, Sniders and Smallbores firing in the same match; Sniders at 500 and 600 yards, against Smallbores at 800 and 900 yards. Great interest was shewn in these matches, the Snider men being confident of holding their own. The result shewed that they were not mistaken. Out of 30 prizes 15 were taken by Sniders. These matches were of great service to the funds of the Association, and many competitors entered with both descriptions of Rifles. In one of them the first prize was taken by a Snider.

The most exciting match was the Battalion one for the Provincial Cup. This cup was won the first year by the 5th Royals, the second year by the 2nd Battalion G. T. R. Rifles, and as the terms of competition for the Cup are, that any Battalion winning it two years out of three, become the possessors of it permanently, the contest between these two battalions for the final possesion was very keen. Great interest was manifested by their respective friends on the ground, amongst whom were many Ladies, but while these Corps were doing their best and seemed to be the point of attraction, the 8th Battalion Stadacona Rifles, Quebec, were quietly working their way to the front, and finally came out winners, with a score of 201 points, the highest that has yet been made in the competition for the Cup, and 12 points ahe d of the 2nd Battalion G. T. R. Rifles, which was second.

The Finances of the Association are in a healthy state. After paying all claims, the Treasurer shews on hand the handsome balance of \$878.56.

Major Worsley and Mr. MacDougall were untiring in their efforts to collect subscriptions, and were very successful, Mr. Esdaile assisted Major Worsley in the duties of Executive Officer. The thanks of the Association are due to the managers of the Bank of Montreal and to the many kind friends of the association in Montreal, who contributed so liberally to the funds.

It is to be regretted, that with the exception of the affiliation fees from the Rural Battalions of the 5th Military District, the Three Rivers Provisional Battalion, the 8th Stadacona Rifles, Quebec, and Messrs. Allan Gilmour and Robert Hamilton, no subscriptions ciation being hearty co-ope Province.

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he affiliation District, the cona Rifles, lamilton, no subscriptions have been received outside of Montreal. The Association being a truly Provincial one, ought certainly to induce the hearty co-operation of the Officers and men of every Corps in the Province.

His Excellency the Governor General again very liberally gave a handsome Cup, which was placed as first prize in the 7th competition, and won by Private Ferguson, G. T. R. Rifles.

The President, Lt.-Col. Bryages, gave a splendid Cup of the value of \$150 for the Sniders. Championship of the Province, to be won three in five years before becoming the property of the winner.

The National Rifle Association gave a Silver Madel, value \$25. This with the President's Cup and \$35 cash, formed the Snider Championship. The first prize in the second match, and was won by Quarter Master Thomas of the 54th Battalion.

Capt. Esdaile gave a beautiful Cup of the value of \$100 to be fired for by the winners of first and second prizes in the matches of 1869, 1870 and 1871, and the winners of the Provincial Cup at Laprairie in 1868. Captain Wall of the 2nd Battalion G. T. R. Rifles was the winner.

Joseph Walker, Esq., presented a very fine Revolver to be fired for, and which formed the second prize in the Esdaile Cup match. won by Sergent Stanhouse 5th Royals.

Our worthy President, Col. Brydges, gave a splendid lunch in his Marquee on the grounds, on the day of the Battalion match. The Hon. the Minister of Militia, Sir George E. Cartier, the Staff of the District, Members of Council, and a number of Ladies and Gentlemen were present on the occasion. After lunch several appropriate toasts and speeches were made, when the Company adjourned to the Ranges to witness the Battalion match then in progress.

Eastern Counties Junction Railways, the Richelieu Navigation Company, the Canadian Navigation Company, and the Ottawa Navigation Company, for their liberality in allowing Competitors passage over their lines to the matches, both ways for one fare.

Dr. Coates, of the 51st Battalion, was constant in his attendance as Surgeon, but fortunately no accidents of any kind occurred during the match.
