



FORTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

The Committee of Management beg leave to present the usual Annual report, with its accompanying Financial statement.

The remarks as to the increased demand for assistance made in the report of last year are again applicable on the present occasion.

The funds of the Society have been most liberally supplied, showing a greatly increased interest in its work : but, on the other hand, it is a cause for much regret that the great want of employment for all classes of working men should render necessary so heavy and continuous a demand upon the résources of the Society.

There has been a considerable difficulty in finding immediate employment for the many immigrants who, attracted by low rates of fare, came out from the Old Country during the past Autumn, and Members would practically aid the Committee and perform a part of their duty to the Society if, when aware of any employment vacant or when themselves needing labour, even of the smallest kind, they would at once advise the Secretary.

The balance in the hands of the Treasurer at the beginning of the year was \$510.13; the receipts during the year have been \$2872.02: making a total of \$3382.15.

The expenditure of the Society for the relief of the destitute, printing, advertising, office expenses, &c., has amounted to \$2767.95 : leaving a balance in the hands of the Treasurer of \$614.20.

RELIEF.

Relief has been given to 1551 applicants during the past year, (representing some 5700 individuals), to the amount of \$1171.84, exclusive of the Christmas distribution, \$625.70, which is an unusually large increase on the previous year.

This amount has been expended in meat, bread, meals, lodgings, railway passages, money payments, &c., as usual.

One order has been given for assistance towards the funeral and interment in the lots of the Society in St. James's cemetery.

Much time has been spent in visiting the applicants at their homes; and, while some cases of imposition have been detected, much real want has been witnessed and relieved.

MEMBERSHIP.

There have been 5 Life members elected during the year, and 80 annual members. The number of members now on the books being; 17 Honorary Life members, 205 Life members, and 310 Ordinary members : but a reference to the list of sub-

The Committee that was appointed to revise the roll of members, while they felt themselves compelled to strike off 22 names, refrained from dealing with others in the same way in the hope that their arrearages will be paid up before long, and that, as the work of the Society is being enlarged, revived interest will be taken in its proceedings.

The Committee are only aware of 3 members having died during the year, viz. :--Mr. T. B. HARPER, Mr. J. E. CLEG-HORN, and Mr. R. HODGSON.

CONCERT IN ST. JAMES'S SCHOOL HOUSE.

A concert took place in St. James's School Room on the 20th February, the use of which was most kindly granted by the Dean and Church Wardens. The ladies and gentlemen who took part therein generously volunteered their services, and the net proceeds amounted to \$108.50.

ANNUAL RELIGIOUS SERVICES.

The Annual Religious Services were held in the Elm Street Methodist Church on the 27th of April, and in St. James's Cathedral on the 4th of May, and the Committee would again acknowledge the very courteous way in which the use of these churches was granted to the Society.

The sermon in the Elm Street Methodist Church was preached by the Rev. J. C. Antliff, M.A., B.D., and was most appropriate to the occasion. That in St. James's Cathedral was preached by the Bishop of Toronto. The service there was purposely deferred from the 20th of April to the 4th of May in order to obtain the presence of the Bishop. The excellent discourse delivered by his Lordship was the first sermon preached by him in Toronto after his consecration to the see.

The collection in Elm Street Church amounted to \$100.00; that in the Cathedral to \$160.00.

DINNER ON ST. GEORGE'S DAY.

On the evening of St. George's day a Dinner was held in the American Hotel. 94 gentlemen sat down thereto, and a very sociable, pleasant evening was spent. The pecuniary gain was \$27.13.

MOONLIGHT EXCURSION.

It was intended to have a Moonlight Excursion on the 4th of September, but the storminess of the weather compelled the relinquishment of the project.

UNION OF ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETIES OF NORTH AMERICA.

The connexion with the St. George's Union of North America has been maintained, although, owing to the visit of the Governor-General and H. R. H. the Princess Louise, no delegates from this Society were able to attend the meeting of the Union, which was held at Bridgeport, Conn., in the month of September.

LECTURE BY THE REV. T. W. HANDFORD.

The Rev. T. W. Handford again delivered a Lecture in the Bond Street Congregational Church in aid of the Funds of the Society, the subject being "The Victorian Age, or 40 Years of England's Life." On this occasion there was a large attendance, and the net proceeds were \$107.40.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE.

The hearty acknowledgements of the Society are due to the Physicians of the Society for their kind and gratuitous services rendered to the sick poor during the past year.

CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The Annual Christmas Collection was made in December by the Committee, Stewards, and other members of the Society. Tl of br di ste by

The amount collected was \$852.00, being \$224.25 in advance of last year. There were about 6300 lbs. of beef, 3300 lbs. of bread, 178 lbs. of tea, 800 lbs. of sugar, and a load of turnips distributed on this occasion. The distribution took place in a store, No. 90 Yonge Street, very kindly lent for the occasion by Mr. P. Jacobi.

Relief was given to 676 families, consisting of, according to the detailed records, 3519 persons.

THE TENT.

The Society's Tent has been rented on four different occasions and the sum of \$50.00 realized therefor.

ST. JAMES'S CEMETERY LOT.

The enclosing and planting of the Burial Plot belonging to the Society in St. James's Cemetery is a matter which has engaged the consideration of the Committee during the past year. The accomplishment of this object is much to be desired, but, in view of the numerous calls of a more pressing nature upon the funds, the Committee have not seen their way to devote thereto the comparatively large sum that would be required for this purpose.

INVESTMENTS.

The Investments remain in nearly the same position as last year, the only change being that the City Debenture of \$125.00, falling due, has been paid, and this amount, together with the amount of the 27 Life Memberships, invested in another City Debenture costing \$406.45.

CONCLUSION.

In conclusion, the Committee feel justified in offering to the members of the Society hearty congratulations on the successful termination of their year's labours. "To do good, and to

distribute forget not," is a Divine command; and, certainly, the service of a year on the Committee of St. George's Society affords an opportunity in this direction that may well rejoice the heart of any Englishman who has the desire to minister to the wants of his needy fellow-countrymen.

It seems much to be desired that every member should keep constantly in view the benevolent and patriotic work which the Society is designed to carry out, and manifest his interest in that work by more frequent attendance at the monthly and quarterly-meetings and by personally endeavouring to induce friends to join our ranks, and so enlarge the membership. There are doubtless very many Englishmen and sons of Eng. lishmen in our city who, if the existence and objects of the Society were brought before them, would gladly unite with us, and thus extend our influence and enlarge our capacity for use. fulness, and maintain and strengthen the sentiments of good fellowship, benevolence, loyalty, and love of country, which become the Sons of St. George and "Merrie England," and tend to adorn the national character of Canada, the land of our adoption.

BY-LAWS.

I. The Society shall consist of such persons of English or Welsh birth or descent, in the male line, as shall be elected members thereof according to the regulations hereinafter made.

II. The objects of the Society are to unite Englishmen and Welshmen, and their descendants, in a social compact for the promotion of mutual and friendly intercourse, and for affording to persons of English or Welsh birth or descent who may be in distress, their advice and counsel, and, if necessary, such pecuniary assistance as the funds of the Society will admit of.

III. In addition to the Officers named in the Act of Incorporation, six Stewards shall be elected, who shall co-operate with the Committee in all celebrations to be held by the Society; also a Marshall and Standard Bearers shall be appointed by the President.

IV. The Officers of the Society shall be elected as follows : any member may nominate a Candidate for each office, in succession; and in the event of more than one nomination for any one office the decision shall be by ballot.

V. The President and Vice-Presidents shall not be eligible for re-election to the offices respectively filled by them for the next succeeding pear.

VI. The Annual General Meeting of the Society shall be holden on the third Friday in January, in each year. In each year there shall be holden four Quarterly General Meetings, viz.: 1st, the Annual General Meeting, and one each on the first Friday of the months of April, July, and October. Monthly Ordinary Meetings shall be held on the first Friday of each month throughout the year, excepting in January, April, July, and October, as otherwise provided.

VII. Any gentlemen desirous of joining the Society shall, at a General or Ordinary Meeting, be proposed and seconded by members, and may be elected by a majority of such meeting, on payment of first year's subscription.

VIII. The Annual Subscriptions of Members shall be Two Dollars. The subscription year shall be from 1st January to 31st December. Any new Member elected between the 1st of January and 30th of September, shall pay the full subscription for the current year : any elected on or after 1st October, may be admitted on paying for the current quarter only.

IX. A subscription of \$10 shall be a life-subscription, and the same, together with all donations of \$10 and upwards, unless such donations are made for a specific purpose, shall be invested by the Managing Committee, and form a portion of the permanent fund, the interest on which shall be applied to the charitable purposes and ordinary expenditure of the Society. No ordinary member shall be eligible to life membership until he has paid all arrears of subscription as such ordinary member.

X. The Annual Meeting shall order the investment of such proportion of the surplus fund as may appear desirable and in such manner as may be then determined, and the annual subscriptions, with the interest of investments shall constitute the ordinary funds applicable to the charitable purposes and ordinary expenses of the Society.

XI. The Treasurer shall be authorized to advance to a distressed individual a sum not exceeding two dollars, upon the written recommendation of the President or either of the Vice-Presidents, or of any member of the Managing Committee by them appointed to grant such relief; provided always, that such recommendation does not involve the payment of more than two dollars to any one person or family. In cases

demanding more than the ordinary relief thus afforded, the same shall be referred for further enquiry and action to the Managing Committee, as hereinafter set forth.

XII. The Managing Committee shall meet weekly, and any five members thereof shall form a quorum. It shall be their business to direct the affairs of the Society generally, under this Constitution; to determine all matters referred to them by the Society, and to prepare for each Annual Meeting a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year, to be submitted previous to the election of Officers.

XIII. The Managing Committee may make loans (not exceeding twenty dollars to one person or family) from the ordinary funds of the Society, to persons in temporary distress or trouble, upon receiving such reasonable security as they may deem expedient, provided the period of such loans does not exceed six months. It shall have power to grant extended relief, in particular cases, at discretion, the orders upon the Treasurer being, in all such cases, signed by two or more of the Members of the Committee.

XIV. The Committee, assisted by the Stewards, shall arrange for the Annual Celebration of St. George's Day, and report ach arrangements at the Monthly Meeting in March. No expense of any celebration or social entertainment whatever shall be charged against the funds of the Society.

XV. The President (or, in his absence, the Senior Vice-President), shall direct the Secretary to convene a Special General Meeting of the Society, upon requisition (stating the purpose thereof) from any five members, and the Secretary shall call a Special Meeting of the Managing Committee, either by direction of the President (or, in his absence, the Senior Vice-President), or upon the requisition of any two members of the Committee.

XVI. The chair shall be taken thirty minutes precisely after the hour appointed for meeting, and if there be not then a

quorum of at least ten members present, the meeting shall be forthwith adjourned.

XVII. Any member in arrear of subscription for two years may be considered as having withdrawn from the Society; and his name shall be erased from the list of members, after due notice being given him. No member shall be entitled to vote at the annual election of Officers or at any subsequent meeting, neither shall he be eligible for election to any office of the Society, if he shall not have paid his previous year's subscription.

XVIII. The annual subscription shall be considered due and payable in advance, on or before the 23rd day of April in every year.

XIX. The duty of the President shall be, to preside and preserve order at all the meetings of the Society, and to protect and further its interests to the best of his ability. In his absence the Senior Vice-President present shall exercise the authority and duty of the President. In case of the absence of the first four Officers from any meeting, the members present shall be empowered to elect a Chairman out of their number.

XX. The Secretary shall have charge of the Seal, Banners, and other Insignia of the Society. He shall keep a fair register of all proceedings, orders, rules, and regulations, and manage the correspondence. He shall, when applied to, and on payment of such fees as may be determined on by the Committee, issue certificates of admission to each member (on his having signed the Constitution), to which he shall affix the Seal of the Society. He shall, when nccessary, summon the Society to its various meetings, and shall sign such cards of Invitation to all Celebrations as may be required of him by the Committee and Stewards. He shall also, at all meetings of the Society and of the Managing Committee, enter into the respective Minute Books the names of the members present at such meetings.

XXI. The Treasurer shall have the custody of the funds. He shall countersign such certificates of admission as may be issued by the Secretary. His accounts shall be fairly kept, and exhibited to the President and the Managing Committee whenever called for, and shall also be laid before the Society at its January meeting. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to open an account with such one of the Chartered Banks in the City as may be approved of by the President and Managing Committee of the Society, and there deposit the securities of the Society in the joint names of the President and of himself; and, when directed by the Committee, all funds belonging to the Society, and paid to the Treasurer, shall be deposited in such Bank.

XXII. All vacancies in the offices of the Society, happening in the interim between two succeeding Annual Meetings, may be filled by election in the usual way at the Quarterly Meeting next after the same shall have occurred.

XXIII. To preserve order, and to expedite the business of the Society, any member who may have proposals to make, or observations to offer upon any propositions, shall rise and address the President; and no person shall interrupt another when speaking, if the speaker be in order.

XXIV. The introduction of political or religious subjects, or their discussion, shall never be allowed at any meeting of the Society.

XXV. The members of this Society shall faithfully observe and conform to all the rules and regulations that shall be made by the Society, and entered in the books thereof, on pain of being dismissed from it, and having their names erased from the list of members.

XXVI. If the majority of all the members present at any General Meeting shall vote for the expulsion of a member, his name shall be erased; and he shall never afterwards be admitted to any meeting of the Society, unless again elected

XXVIII. At any Quarterly or Annual Meeting the members present may, on one month's notice previously given, elect any one of its members an honorary life member, in consideration of services rendered the Society; and also may elect any distinguished person eligible to become a member, in like manner, for services rendered either to the Society or the country, and such honorary member shall be entitled to all the privileges of an ordinary member.

XXIX. An Obituary Record shall be kept by the Secretary of any member of this Society who may hereafter die, stating his birth and parentage, if known, date of admission as a member, his position, general character, and such other facts in regard to him as may be interesting to chronicle. Such record to be published with the Annual Reports.
