**Profit of Fruit-Growing.**

N. Ohmer, of Dayton, Ohio, read a paper at the late annual meeting of the Ohio Horticultural Society, held at Chillicothe, on the subject: "Can fruit-growing be made a profitable vocation?" He answered the question with an emphatic yes. It can be made as profitable as any other branch of horticulture, though depending on many conditions. He says:

"First the individual must have a love or taste for the profession; must be intelligent and industrious; must work with his eyes open; must read up, and go from home occasionally to see how others in the same profession manage their orchards and fields of berries. I have never started out on a tour of observation, without learning something new and applying it to my benefit. If you don't read up, and get up, you will very soon be numbered among those who do not succeed in making fruit-growing pay."

**Taking Care of Hogs.**

In the early days of hog raising in the west the opinion was pretty widely held that hogs needed less care than any other kind of live stock, and being a pretty common opinion that a good deal of water was good enough for hogs, and that anything they would eat would increase the growth of the animal and make more or less pork. From opinions of this kind a good many intelligent farmers moved forward and when corn becomes a thing in the market throughout the country, they adopted or resorted to the principle that corn was the best feed that hogs, young or old, could have, and it seemed to be the opinion that where hogs could have plenty of corn all the time that they needed no other kind of feed; but through investigation coupled with experiments has of late years upset this theory, and has come to be well known at least advanced thinkers over this matter, that hogs need as much variety in the way of food as does any other kind of farm animal, and it is very certain no farmer can manage his best attainable result in hog production unless he uses the strictest care in feeding his pigs and young hogs.

**The Kitchen Hot-bed.**

It is a trifling matter, but one well worth remembering, that for most farmers' gardens one scarcely needs a hot-bed to bring forth roots and other vegetables or flowers, if they can have at hand a good kitchen range. A few dozen plants in general all that is wanted, and a square foot or so of earth in a hot-bed will give all the plants one is likely to want in the vegetable way; and a similar one for flowers. Seeds do not need light to sprout; indeed, good gardeners think that light is a disadvantage. All they need is heat and moisture, and they can get in a slow oven, or by a warm range, as well as anywhere. Of course as soon as the young leaves appear they must have light. Then the boxes can be moved to the windows or to some sheltered place in the open air. All this has to be done gradually. Every one who has tried hard are sudden changes of temperature to the human system, and it is just as bad to plants. The best thing is to put them under a wash in the open air, if one has no other means. The seed have been sprouted in this artificial way, it is generally so for the season that a very little protection is enough to take care of the plants. In this way one can get things several weeks ahead of time in the ordinary way of doing things, and at little cost or trouble; and this is a great advantage to those of small means.

**Causes of Wheat Failures.**

A correspondent of the Ohio Farmer writes to that journal, and gives his opinion as to the principal causes of short wheat crops as follows:

"I have given much thought to the causes of failure of the wheat crop, and the best evidence that I can give is that the English wheat crop the present year will be almost an entire failure, on account of the long continued wet weather and the sudden condition of the whole country being throughout the whole of continental Europe also, the indications are that the crop will be much less than usual, and that there will be a surplus of wheat in the United States during the coming year and renders the problem of our own crop and the surplus of the last crop of winter wheat, particularly interesting. The New York Produce Reporter says: 'We have had many reports of injury to the wheat plant this week, but this is not the first time that the crop has been injured in this way. **Fertilizing Value of the Sod.**

According to experiments and analysis made in Germany to determine the number of pounds of potash and stable contained in an acre of clover sod, to the depth of ten inches, it is shown that there were 8,231 pounds of potash and 121 pounds of phosphoric acid. Undoubtedly, the acre of sod which contained roots enough to afford such a large amount of nitrogen, was produced on land in a high state of cultivation, but suppose that an acre of sod contained only one-half as much nitrogen, or 35 pounds. How could a farmer apply an equal amount of nitrogen to his soil so cheaply and so easily as by clover raising? The clover root is rich in nitrogen, a fertilizer which is the most costly of any element of plant food offered in the market. It is just the fertilizer needed for the growth of wheat and corn. A crop of wheat, yielding twenty-five bushels of grain, is said to contain an equal amount of nitrogen to that of a crop of wheat, yielding only ten bushels of grain, and only one third the amount found to be contained in an acre of good clover sod in Germany, furnishing the best evidence that the sod is an excellent preparation of the land for a wheat crop.
