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


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The chief of the Fire-Department at Rouen proposes to make use of the electric trolley-wires which extend to so many parts of the city, and in which power is or can be always ready for use as a source of power for driving the pumps of fire-engines where the fire occurs in the neighborhood of electric tram-lines. The fire-engines will be fitted with electric-motors instead of steam-engines, and connection will be made to the trolley-wire or to the trelleyfeeder in the immediate neighborhood of the burning building. The arrangements should save valuable time, especially during that important first fifteen minutes, since there will not even be the necessity of getting steam up from banked fires. If also the connection to the electric tranway services are made at one of the feeder-pillars, as can easily be done, the tramway service should not be interfered with.-London Trade Journals' Review.

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
