The coal vessel Quisetta, Capt. Hynes, has discharged a cargo of coal at Job Bros. & Co. the past week. This was badly needed as at present there seemed to be a regular coal famine.

LEFT FOR STRAITS.—Mr. W. H. Whitley left here by yesterday evening's Bruce express for Bay of Islands. He will there join the Home for Bonne Esperance to prosecute the fishery there. Forty men accompanied Mr. Whitley and will fish under him.

DISCHARGING SALT.—The work of discharging salt (3,300 tons) from the s.s. Philae, now in the stream, is going on night and day. About 20 schooners are around her all the time receiving the salt through the shutes. About a dozen schooners (Goodridge's dealers) are "salted" every day.

IN THE PENITENTIARY.—Up to yesterday there were 34 prisoners in the Penitentiary, all of whom are males except four. Up to this date last year there were 47 incarcerated, and such a small number of prisoners is an evidence of the law abiding spirit of Newfoundlanders generally.

TREPASSEY BRANCH RAILWAY.—The work of surveying the new branch line of railroad to Trepassey will begin on the first of June. The surveyors will start off from a point near Donovan's and will continue the work during the summer months. The first sod of the new line will be turned on June 1st, 1911.

REJOINS THE HESPERIAN.—After the Siberian returns to Liverpool Capt. Williams will rejoin the Hesperian, which ship he made several voyages in before transferring to the Siberian. He commanded the Hesperian when she picked up the Carthaginian, disabled from a bent piston rod, a few weeks ago.

PLAYED WITH BAG-PIPES.—A passenger by the S. S. Siberian, a canny Scot, came ashore last night attired in Highland costume and with the bag-pipes on which he executed several Scotch airs, marched up Water Street to the West End and down near Gower Street. He was followed by a multitude of people who thoroughly appreciated his efforts to entertain them.

AMBULANCE OUT.—John Cadeau was taken from the hospital in the ambulance last evening and put on board the Siberian to go to his home in Halifax. He had been one of the crew of the cable ship Mackey-Bennett, and was landed from that steamer here last winter, as he was suffering from heart trouble and dropsy. He has been in hospital ever since and is now slightly improved.

SAILOR BECOMES DISORDERLY.—Last evening one of the sailor's of the Siberian on coming ashore drank more than was good for him, and refused to leave an East End saloon when ordered. The man wanted to fight all and sundry, and would certainly have been accommodated but the arrival of Officers Devine and Walsh prevented a row. The officers hustled him off to the station. He was released last night to go on board ship.

HOUSEHOLD NOTES.

If you must carry hot coals from the fire and fear that they will spill, why not try dumping them into a long handle frying pan. They cannot escape and cannot burn the pan.

To remove tarnish from gold braid, first rub it free from all dust and then cover it well with powdered rock alum. After half an hour rub this off with a stiff brush and the tarnish will disappear.

Molasses cake is improved by being baked slowly. Have the oven hot when first putting in the cake, then cool it off so that the cake may be at least forty minutes in the baking. A longer time will not hurt.

A careful seamstress always has a piece of cloth under the presser foot of the machine. This not only saves wear of the machine, but will absorb any drop of oil that may gather and would soil the next fabric stitched.

A delicious French dish consists of French plums stuffed with whole almonds, dipped in olive oil and roasted on a broiler over a hot fire then rolled in thin slices of bacon and grilled; they should be served piping hot.

If a plate of sandwiches is prepared beforehand for a luncheon it is a good plan to pile them on a plate and then wrap plate and all in waxed paper.

A good rule for making sponge cake is to devote exactly the same time to beating the yolks of the eggs as it takes to beat the whites to a perfect stiffness.

Soak old flour sacks in borax water over night to remove the printing and then boil for half an hour in soapy water, and they will make excellent wash cloths for dishes.

It is a mistake to think that ice tea can be cooled by a few lumps in the pitcher. There must be either finely cracked or shaved ice in the glasses to make it palatable.

If jellies are becoming candied, cover them with a quarter of an inch of pulverized sugar, underneath the paper, and they will remain in good condition, even for years.

To take out wagon grease, if it is the kind made of animal fat, sponge with ether; if it is the kind made with coal tar, it may be removed with a cloth dipped in petroleum.

To prevent thread from knotting when doing hand sewing, always make a knot in the end last broken from the spool. This done, stretch the thread by giving it several quick pulls.

If furniture has grown dull and streaked, try rubbing it with a mixture of equal parts of turpentine and coal oil, it polishes quickly and is much less expensive than prepared polishes.

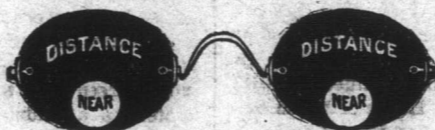
