LOCAL NEWS PARAPHRASED.

Reboham masonic lodge installed its officers last night. The Hall case will be again argued at Osgoode hall to-day.

Twenty-five snow cases will be called in the police court to-day. Judge Boyd yesterday committed John Ryan to jail as a lunatic.

Col. Arthur will try his luck in St. James ward for aldermanic honors. There will be matinee in both of the opera houses to-morrow afternoon.

A company, Royal Grenadiers, will hold their annual dinner at the Hub to-night. The Chicago and Grand Trunk express due at 6.16 a.m., was five hours late yesterday.

St. Andrew's and Zealand lodges will celebrate St. John's day by a brilliant conversation at Horticultural gardens.

Chief Ardagh yesterday morning paid a visit to the house of providence and made several recommendations as to progress in case of fire.

The Meteorological office, Toronto, has ordered up cautionary storm signal No. 3 at Quebec, Galt, and maritime province stations.

The authorities of St. James' cathedral have proposed to the bishop to take charge of such extra parochial duty that of hospital, jail, central prison, reformatory, etc.
