The Senate of the University of Toronto met ast night and passed the report of the examin-rs in law, arts and agriculture.

The feature of the results in arts is the ad-administration up to the handle of the new law

ministration up to the handle of the new law regarding supplemental examinations.

Formerly a candidate was only allowed to take one supplemental, and then not always; if he failed he stood a good chance of losing his year, or if the examiners thought it would be too "harsh" to pluck him entirely they would let bim through by a squeeze. Now the law practically is that a man can pass half or less of his subjects in his year and take the balance of them as supplementals. The result is that the examiners have no hesitation in demanding the full por centage on each subject and if a candidate does not come up to it he is ordered to take a supplemental in that subject. Formerly if a candidate failed in one subject for B.A. he falled in all; now he can fail in one or more subjects and on passing supplementals in these gets, his degree. 


