The Rector hopes to get away to his island in Muskoka at the end of the month. He will be the guest of the Rev. Edward Cayley and his family.

Rev. C. B. Kenrick has been heard from. He sails for Montreal by the *Victorian*, on the 20th inst. and should be at St. George's on Sunday the 30th inst. He has greatly enjoyed and benefited by his trip and visit home.

While visiting the wonderful Electric Works at Niagara recently, the Rector fell over an iron rail and had an unpleasant abrasion of the skin which compelled him to lay up for a week. He has employed the interval in preparing a special sermon to be used on any occasion when a preacher should fail to keep his engagement to preach for him. The text is: "Watsoever ye would that men should do unto you, even so do unto them, for this is the Law and the Prophets," which was the offertory sentence printed on the programme for the church parade.

The S. S. Picnic was a great success. The day was beautiful and the trip to Bond Lake most enjoyable. There was just enough rain to lay the dust and sweeten the air. Though such valuable helpers as Misses Edith and Hilda Boulton were

away in Muskoka there was no lack of help, for Mrs. and Miss Phillips, Miss Murray and Miss Spragge gave the teachers most effective aid. Miss Cayley unfortunately was not well enough to be present, but Miss Ethel Street managed everything so admirably that no one was conscious of anything amiss or lacking.

CHURCH PARADE.

The service at the church parade on the 2nd inst. was as bright and joyous and hearty as any service ever held in St. George's. It was most inspiring to hear over 350 men singing the well-known hymns "lustily and with a good courage." A very large proportion of them must have been Churchmen, for as Mr. Phillips said, they drowned the organ when they sang *Venite*. With great interest and attention also did they listen to Dr. Tucker's inspiring address on the claims of Citizenship in this young and vast growing Dominion. The momentary embarrassment caused by the failure of the expected preacher to appear was most happily averted by the presence of Dr. Tucker. On his way from Winnipeg on the previous day he had seen the announcement of the church parade, and as he "knew all those fellows well in Montreal," he most unexpectedly came to be present with them at the service. Unexpectedly, yes, but not accidentally! Was it not rather highly Providential, that help, and just the needed help, should be sent just at the moment it was needed? The heartiest thanks

of all present were won by Dr. Tucker both for his gracious readiness, and for his timely address. As the Colonel of the Regiment said afterwards: Nothing could have been better than Dr. Tucker's appropriate and eloquent address.

The following letter from Col. Hibbard shows how the Regiment appreciated the service:

MONTREAL, July 4th, 1905.

"DEAR SIR,—Please accept my sincere thanks for the hearty and excellent service in the St. George's Church on Sunday last, and which was thoroughly enjoyed by all members of the Regiment. 
