

Information has been issued by the Principal's Office regarding a Studentship in the Social Sciences which is offered by The Garton Foundation, London, England. The object of the Studentship is to enable a student of exceptional capacity and promise to devote himself for a year or more to the study of social or economic problems of fundamental importance. The Studentship, which is offered every other year, is tenable for two years, of the value of £400 per annum, and in exceptional circumstances the Trustees may make an allowance in addition to the stipend to meet the cost of travelling incurred during the tenure of a Studentship.

The Studentship is open to graduates, undergraduates or part time students and McGill has been asked to name one candidate. As the recommendations must be in London England by February 1st, applications should be made at once to the Principal's Office. Candidates must be British subjects, not over 30 years of age.
