- II. The Second will be of the Sun, May 24th, in the Evening; Invisible in this Part of the World. — $\odot$ at 6h. 6' in Lon. $21^{\circ} 4' 3''$. $\odot$'s Lat: $30^{\circ} 30''$. $\odot$ will be centrally eclipsed on the Meridian at 6h. 4' in Longitude $154^{\circ} 30'$ West, and Lat. $11^{\circ} 15'$ South.

- III. The Third will be of the Moon, November the Second, in the Evening, Visible, if the Weather be clear.

- IV. The Fourth will be of the Sun, November the 16th, at Night, consequently Invisible in these Parts. — $\odot$ at 11h. 15' in Lon. $71^{\circ} 25' 16''$. $\odot$'s Lat. 35° N. $\odot$ will be centrally eclipsed on the Meridian at 11h. 8' in Lon. 129° East, and Lat. $14^{\circ} 45'$ North. — As the Semediameter of the Sun, at the Time of the Middle of this Eclipse, exceeds that of the Moon by only one Second, the Eclipse will be very nearly Total; leaving only the Appearance of a fine Ring upon the Verge of the Sun's Disc.
