STANDING RULES.
FOR THE
CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT
Newfoundland Church Society.

NAME.

1.—The Name of this Society shall be "THE NEW-
FOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

OBJECTS.

2.—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Licensed Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School Rooms, and in the purchase of land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply of Bibles, Prayer-Books, School-Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, (4) to assist in creating and sustaining a Special Fund for the endowment and support of the Theological College in St. John's, and (5) to create and maintain a separate Fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

MEMBERS.

3.—The Members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceding years the annual

sum of ten shillings for the objects of the Society; and (2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceding years with the Bishop's license.

4.—All Members shall have power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

OFFICERS.

5.—The Officers of this Society shall be (1) the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President; (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting; but in case of resignation of office, or removal, of either Secretary or Treasurer, during the interval between two Annual Meetings, the Committee shall appoint a person to act in either case, until the next Annual Meeting.

MANAGERS.

6.—The Committee of Management shall consist of the officers of the Society, and certain Lay-Members, elected as Representatives in each of the Deaneries; viz., four elected by members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Bonavista Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notre-Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7.—The election of Representatives shall be as follows:—On some day in Easter Week, in the year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a Meeting of the Members resident in each mission, shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the

Mission, on some Sunday in the previous month; at which Meeting the Clergyman or, in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the Members shall preside, and the Members present shall vote *seriatim* for the prescribed number of Representatives.

8.—When the voting which may be continued, if necessary six hours, but not longer) is completed, the presiding Officer in each Mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean, and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected Representatives; provided that every person to be a member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.

9.—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deanery to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.

10.—The new Representatives shall be convened by the Secretary at the Michaelmas Quarterly Meeting; until which time the former Representatives shall continue in office.

11.—As often as it shall become necessary, from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification, or refusal to serve, of any of the Representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the Members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence, the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese may in his discretion appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required Representative or Representatives shall in like manner be elected.

12.—The President or a Vice-President, and six other Members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.

13.—All Clergymen of the Diocese holding the Bishop's license, shall be *ex-officio* honorary Members of the Committee with the right of speaking, but not with the exception of the Officers, of voting at its Meetings.

TRUSTEE.

14.—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let or to take houses or lands, and to receive all rents and interest of monies as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

15.—An Annual General Meeting of the members and friends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's who shall publish it [with the Bishop's consent] in his Church on the previous Sunday.

16.—At the Annual General Meeting a report on the state of the Society, with the Treasurer's accounts duly audited shall be submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then and there determined by the members.

17.—A special general meeting may be convened at any time, [1] by the President; [2] by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee; or [3] by any twelve members of the Society whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.

18.—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

COLLECTIONS.

19.—It is expected that a Collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clergyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family and every adult member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his Church-wardens and other respectable members of his congregation.

20.—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary a list of the Contributors to the objects of the Society in his Mission, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one-fourth at least of his whole collections on or before the last day in every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N. B.—This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's, who shall send in the whole of their Collections to the Treasurer.

21.—All Clergymen who have collected as far as possible from every head of a family, and from every adult Member of the Church in their Missions, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole Collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own Mission; provided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate from, or independent of the general collections; and that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

GRANTS.

22.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.

23.—No clergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the con

tributors, and their payments, and a fourth part of his collection (as directed in Rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grants from the Society, for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society, in his Mission; provided that where a collection has been duly made, and the list with the fourth-part of the collections transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his annual collections, ask and receive for any of the objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.

24.--It shall be competent to the Committee to make grants in the usual manner to any Mission, in connection with the Society, which supports its own Clergyman; and any such Mission shall be held to be in connection with the Society whose Clergyman subscribes ten shillings, and makes a collection in his Mission, annually towards the general funds of the Society.

25.—If a Clergyman leave his Mission before the time for sending in his annual collection, the Committee shall have power, on the recommendation of the President, to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

26.—In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or, in his absence, the Senior Vice-President shall take the Chair at all meetings of the Committee or Members, and shall have a casting vote.

27.—The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appointed for auditing the same.

28.—No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order, specifying the

amount to be paid, and its object; which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence, by the Senior Officer of the Society in St. John's.

29.—The Committee shall meet for the despatch of business in St. John's, on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock, p. m.

30.—A special meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either (1) by the President, or (2) by two Vice-Presidents, or (3) by any five Members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting with its objects be given the day before to all the other members of the Committee in St. John's.

31.—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint two of their number to examine the Treasurer's Accounts up to that season, which accounts examined approved, and signed by the Auditors as correct, shall be submitted to the Committee to be by them incorporated in or appended to the next yearly Report and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.

32.—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secretary, and shall provide for all the contingent expenses of the Committee and the Society.

DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

33.—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and Members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the Annual Report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall conduct the correspondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

PRAYERS.

34.—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the purpose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

35.—These Rules may be altered, repealed or added to by the members assembled at any general meeting; provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing by any person intending to propose it to the Secretary at least a month before for the information of the President and Committee, and that assent has been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration; and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

NEW DEANERIES.

36.—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives; provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and Congregations.

SECURITIES.

37.—At each annual meeting there shall be appointed three members of this Society who shall be requested to examine all securities belonging to the general funds of this Society, or belonging, or appertaining to the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund, or to any other fund over which the Society has, or shall have, control, and to report in writing to the President, or, in his absence, to the Senior Vice-President in St. John's, their opinion upon the sufficiency or insufficiency of the same, and if necessary a special

meeting of the Committee shall be convened to consider such report, and to take such action upon it as shall be deemed requisite.

38.—All Title Deeds, Mortgages and other Securities belonging to the Society, or over which it has control, shall be deposited and preserved in a suitable muniment box to be provided by the President for the time being, at the expense of the Society, and to be always kept in his charge for the use of the Society.

NOTE.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

BYE-LAWS OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY RESPECTING GRANTS.

NEW BUILDINGS.

1.—No grant shall be made towards the erection of any Church, School, or Parsonage, or towards the purchase of any Land in any Mission or settlement, until the land has been secured in trust, for the Members of the Church of England resident in the said settlement forever.

2.—No grant shall be made towards the erection of any Church, School or Parsonage, until a plan with an estimate of the cost, and the means of meeting the cost, have been submitted to the Committee.

3.—No grant to any Church shall exceed one-third, and no grant to any School or Parsonage, shall exceed one-fourth of the estimated and probable cost; except under special circumstances, approved by the Committee.

4.—The first moiety of any grant towards the erection of any Church, School, or Parsonage, shall not be payable until the building is at least boarded all round and covered in; and the second moiety shall not be payable until the building is finished and ready for occupation and use.

N. B.—All the above rules shall apply in respect of the enlargement of any Church, School or Parsonage House.

REPAIRS.

5.—No grant shall be made towards the repair of any Church, School, or Parsonage House, until an estimate of the cost, and the means of meeting the cost, have been submitted to the Committee.

6.—No grant shall be made until after an interval of seven years from the last grant for a like purpose; and no grant towards the repair, including painting, of any Church shall exceed one-half, or of any School or Parsonage one-third of the probable and estimated cost; except under special circumstances, approved by the Committee.

7.—No grant towards the repair of any Church, School, or Parsonage House shall be payable until the work is fully completed, and the cost ascertained, and the whole amount, with the Society's grant provided for.

PROCEEDINGS.

At the Twenty-ninth Anniversary of the Newfoundland Church Society holden at St. John's in the Cathedral Sunday School Building on Thursday, June 30, 1870. The chair was taken at half-past seven o'clock, P. M., by the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop, President, who requested the Rev. G. M. Johnson to open the meeting with the usual prayers.

After prayer the business of the evening commenced with the reading of the Report and of the Treasurer's Accounts, after which the following Resolutions were proposed, seconded, and carried unanimously:

1st. Moved by Rev. T. Boone, seconded by W. V. Whiteway, Esq., Q. C. :—

That the Report now read be adopted, and printed with the Treasurer's accounts.

2nd. Moved by the Rev. Edward Botwood, seconded by the Rev. E. Colley :

That this meeting desires to record with humble and hearty gratitude its devout sense of the great goodness of Almighty God in prospering the efforts of the Church Society, during the past year.

3rd. Moved by the Rt. Rev. Lord Bishop, Coadjutor, seconded by W. H. Mare, Esq. :

That this meeting congratulates the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, and the Church in this Colony, on the success that has attended His Lordship's endeavours to raise a fund for the endowment of the Theological College in this Colony.

4th. Moved by the Rev. W. K. White, seconded by F. B. T. Carter, Esq., Q. C., M. H. A. :

That this meeting receives with lively feelings of thankfulness, the announcement made by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, of the munificence of the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel.

in Foreign Parts, in appropriating £2,000 *Sig*, towards the endowment of the Bishopric of Newfoundland; and pledges itself on behalf of the Church of England in this Colony, to use the utmost endeavors to fulfil the conditions attached to the final completion of the grant.

5th. Moved by Hon. A. W. Harvey, seconded by Rev. A. C. Wood, M. A.:

That the thanks of this meeting be given to the President, Officers and Committee of this Society, for their management of the business of this Society since the last annual meeting, and that W. H. Mare, Esq., be Treasurer, and the Rev. G. M. Johnson, Secretary, for the ensuing year. Also, that Ewen Stabb, Esq., H. LeMessurier, Esq., and W. V. Whiteway, Esq., Q. C., be appointed to perform the duties indicated by the 37th standing Rule.

6th. Moved by the Rev. B. Smith, seconded by the Rev. A. Bayly:

That the thanks of this meeting be respectfully tendered to the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of the Diocese for his kindness in presiding.

REPORT FOR 1869-70.

The Committee of the Newfoundland Church Society enter upon the duty of submitting their Twenty-ninth Annual Report with mingled satisfaction and regret.

The prospect of meeting a considerable number of the Clergy now assembled at the Ninth general visitation of the Bishop of the Diocese, gives rise to pleasure from thought of the special interest likely to be evoked by the presence of so many of the Clergy, while at the same time feelings of sorrow can scarce be absent from the minds of any from the recollection of the sad number of losses death has caused among the Clergy since last they were thus gathered together, and specially since the last Annual Meeting of this Society. Nor only will vacancies of the kind referred to be thought of on this occasion, but likewise sad remembrance, your Committee are assured, will rise in the minds of many who hear these words, at thought of the loss also of one within the last few months, who if not prominent or always even present at these meetings, was conspicuous and pre eminent among us from the day she first landed in the Colony, from the unceasing zeal with which she gave herself and her substance for the promotion of all works of piety and charity connected with our Church, spending and being spent with a spirit of self-denial which was only restrained by the limits of her temporal means and bodily strength, neither of which were ever withheld from any good work which seemed ne-

necessary to be accomplished, her death following as a consequence of her strength being exhausted prematurely from her ceaseless efforts for the good of all who came within reach of her benevolence, whatever the circumstances or wherever she might be. Nor will recollection of the good deeds of this Christian Lady, it is believed, cease save with the lives of among whom she lived, and for whom she labored and gave her life and wealth, while the benefit of many of the good works which she did will, it is hoped, remain for generations yet to come.

Truly of Mrs. Johnson it may be said "She hath done what she could," and truly also that she did it with her might. "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord, for they rest from their labors and their works do follow them."

Your Committee pass from these subjects thus suggested to them to matters for consideration of which this meeting is assembled, and of these the general financial condition of this Society is naturally the first.

At the time of the last meeting a balance was exhibited in the Treasurer's accounts of £242 5s. 3d. The sums received from the Clergy collections, all of which, with one or two exceptions, have been increased, have amounted to £931 11s. 7d., making the amount under the control of the Committee altogether £1,173 16s. 10d. The various payments that have been made under different votes of the Committee have amounted to the following sums:—

The Treasurer's balance has thus increased from £242 5s. 3d. to £404 3s. 5d., but it is right to state that besides several out-standing conditional votes, and a vote that has been made in aid of the Clergy visitation expenses, there is a sum of £75 0s. 0d. due for the purchase of a new Church at Upper Gul. lies, on the South Shore, which will be called for immediately, and which, together with the other votes spoken of will reduce the balance to about the same sum as that reported last year, so that the position of the Society is much as at the last annual meeting.

The different collections in St. John's, which are the most important of all, as of course they would be expected to be, have amounted for the two last years, set one against the other to the following sums:—

Upon the diminished amount against the Cathedral congregation it may be remarked that the loss of £40 may be accounted for by the removal of three individuals who have left the Colony during the year that has elapsed since the last return was made, besides whom upwards of thirty others have also emigrated within the same time, or have been removed by death from amongst us. On the other hand between forty and fifty have been added to the list, but inasmuch as only three of the new contributions exceed £1 they have not sufficed to make up for the large subscriptions above referred to which have this

year been lost from the Cathedral. It will be observed that the sealer's list now reported is much larger than that of last year, as that of last year was than that of the preceding year. The following were the contributions of the ships visited:—

It is hoped that the present improved and promising condition of the Colony will result, by the time another annual meeting occurs, in still larger increase in the Clergy collections, and that in the course of time the working balance of the Society will again reach the amount at which it stood a few years ago. The occasion may come when it may be desirable to make a grant in aid of some important object similar to those made for the foundation of the Clergy Widow's Fund, the Society for promoting Christian Knowledge Depot, or the Theological College Endowment Fund, and it would be a matter for regret should such a call come, (as for the endowment of the Bishopric,) and the Society be unable to meet the call. At present this would assuredly be the case since the balance declared is not more than enough for the Clergy standing votes and others which have been referred to of a conditional character already made, which may or will be required before the time comes when new collections will be due. The Committee commend this statement to the thoughtful consideration and remembrance of Clergy and Laity of our Church alike, as a matter of much concern to all. Wherever the spiritual welfare of the flock is careful-

ly tended by the appointed pastor, solicitude for the temporal welfare of the shepherd, will be the natural result, if his efforts be appreciated as they should be, that so he may continue to discharge his beneficial duty without distraction.

CLERGY WIDOW'S AND ORPHAN'S FUND.

Next in importance to the General funds of this Society is the special fund bearing the above name and title. No one who at all thinks upon the subject can fail to see how great its benefit must be felt to be among men, so situated that they cannot expect to be able like those in other callings to provide in any suitable degree, if in any way at all, for the wants of those whom they may leave behind as Widows and Orphans. For several years from the establishment of the fund, one only claim arose and its capital accumulated rapidly. At this time last year, though a third death among the Clergy was known to have occurred, but two widows were on the pension list; since that time it is the melancholy duty of your Committee to report the removal of the Rev. O. Rouse of Bay de Verde, by typhus fever, taken in the discharge of his duty of visiting the sick when fever was prevalent among his flock, after twenty-two years faithful and laborious duty at the same post without rest or change of any kind; of the Rev. W. W. LeGallais, drowned on the eve of S. S. Simon and Jude at Channel after twelve years arduous service in that mission, with two others who were conveying him home after a visit to a sick parishioner; a home he was most anxious to reach not only for the sake of a sick child, but for the services of the Church on the day following; of the Rev. A. M. Oakley, who died of consumption at Fogo, on All Saints day last; and lastly of the Rev. H. Lind, whose decease took place last month at St. George's Bay, after an illness of long standing, of a very painful

character, notwithstanding which he continued to labor for those among whom his lot had been many years cast in the Providence of God till the growth of his malady and increase of physical weakness, utterly disabled him and compelled him to desist. For the widows of all these Clergy provision has been made from time to time thus far. Hitherto a grant of £40 per annum has been made in all cases alike, but now that the claims amount at this rate to £280 per annum, out of a present yearly income of about £350, it becomes an anxious question with your Committee, whether they can continue to vote for the future an allowance of so large a sum. Opportunity will be given for discussing this question, when the resolution of which notice was given last year is considered. Your Committee do not wish to diminish, but rather would desire increase if possible on the average amount of pension to be in future given. Anxiety to deal wisely with the fund has led them to notice the evident disparity between the apparent needs of some of those already on the widows list, and they take this opportunity of throwing out the suggestion whether after voting all widows the guaranteed amount of £30 it may not be advisable to supplement this sum with any surplus which from year to year they may think themselves able to grant, with a vote of so much per head to children under the ages recognised by the 10th standing rule.

BOOK DEPOSITORY.

Since the last meeting the care of the book depot has been transferred from Mr. Burton to Mrs. Rouse. It is hoped that Mrs. Rouse may find its management beneficial to her, and that the change may be advantageous to the furtherance of the objects of the Church Society in the original establishment of the depository. A considerable number of books of all kinds have been supplied this year, very many of which have been already distributed by sale. The Depot Sub-Committee undertake to maintain the usual supplies of books, and to replenish them as often as required. The House in which the depository is now kept is No. 296 Water Street, somewhat higher up the town than formerly, and opposite Messrs. O' Dwyer & Co.'s. Any of the books in Stock may be obtained on application to Mrs. Rouse during the usual business hours. The value of books sold has increased during the past year, but promises to be much larger during the present year.

ENDOWMENT FUND.

This fund still continues flourish and increase. All the subscriptions promised in St. John's of which £70 or £80 were due at the time of the last annual meeting have since been paid, and some additional ones sent in. Besides the amount acknowledged from the United States and Canada, raised by the exertions of the Rev. Mr. Botwood, a further sum of £75 11 11 was contributed in reply to an appeal by the Rev. Mr. Caswall and remitted by him to the credit of the fund which now stands as follows:—

Subscriptions may still be paid towards this fund, through the hands of the Bishop or any of the Clergy.

Your Committee have learnt from the Bishop that his Lordship has received a letter from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, suggesting that the continuance of the Episcopate in this Colony, must depend on some provision being made for the endowment of the See, and recommending that the subject be brought under the consideration of members of the Church, and that an attempt be made to raise the necessary means for securing this object. It is believed that not less than £10,000 stg. will be required, and the venerable Society, with its usual munificence, has most generously voted towards this most important object the sum of £2,000 stg., subject to the condition that the remaining £8,000 be raised in five years, reckoning from January 1, 1871.

A visitation voyage was accomplished by the Coadjutor Bishop last year, in the new Church ship "Star," of nearly three months continuance. His Lordship visited White Bay on his way North, and then the missions on the Labrador Shore, and on his return all the missions South of Cape John as far as and including the North side of Trinity Bay. During the present spring he completed the visitation of the northern portion of the Diocese, ending with confirmations at Ferryland and the settlements dependent on the Clergyman stationed there. It is his Lordship's intention to sail again upon a voyage in the "Star," at the close of the visitation, in the course of which he hopes to visit the Labrador Shore and such other places on the coast of Newfoundland as the Clergy are least frequently able to reach.

In addition to the losses by death already recorded, since the last meeting of the Church Society, the Rev. Mr. Caswall has resigned the incumbency of the Cathedral Church, and the Rev. Mr. Wilson has left Bat-

the Harbor and gone to Bermuda. On the other hand, the number of the Clergy has been re-inforced by the return from England of Rev. G. S. Chamberlain, and by the arrivals from England of the Rev. H. Mather, M. A., of Trinity College, Cambridge, and Rev. T. A. Goode, of St Augustine's College, Canterbury, and by the ordination by the Coadjutor Bishop of Messrs. Christopher Meek, of the Theological College, and Frederic Hall, of St. Augustine's College, Canterbury. At an ordination held on Sunday last, in the Cathedral Church, the Reverends John Cragg of Pinchard's Island, Theophilus Netten of LaPoile, and John Lockward of Tilt Cove, were ordained Priests in the presence of a large number of the Clergy, and a numerous congregation.

Of these Clergymen Mr. Chamberlain has succeeded Mr. Rouse at Bay de Verde, Mr. Goode has gone to Channel to take the place of Mr. LeGallais; Mr. Meek has become the successor of Mr. Oakley, and, it is intended that Mr. Hall shall succeed Mr. Lind at St. George's Bay. Mr. Mather remains in St. John's. The Priests ordained on Sunday will return to their former Missions to benefit, it is hoped, their flocks, and find the comfort themselves of their increased powers of usefulness.

Your Committee desire to remark with satisfaction upon the results of the census lately taken, from which it appears that during the last twelve years the Church of England population has increased throughout the Island, including the French Shore, from 44,285 in 1857, when it was last taken, to 53,381 in 1869.

The Church of England population on the Labrador coast, which was not taken separately in 1857, amounted in 1869 to 1,803, making the whole Church of England numbers 55,184.

Your Committee desire to inform the meeting that on the arrival of Governor Hill in the Colony in July,

last, they waited upon His Excellency with an address, which he was pleased to receive very kindly, and that in reply to a request therein contained, the Governor at once consented to accept the office of Patron of this Society, a circumstance which it is believed, is likely to be of great benefit.

The Committee congratulate themselves and the meeting on the presence of the two Bishops of the Diocese, a pleasure which greatly enhances the satisfaction experienced at these periodical assemblages of the Clergy of the Diocese, at the appointed intervals.

Your Committee also congratulate the Bishop on his safe return from Bermuda, and heartily wish the Coadjutor Bishop God speed with reference to that voyage of visitation to the more remote parts of the diocese which he is about to undertake.

S T A N D I N G R U L E S
OF THE
Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

1.—THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY'S Special Fund, for assisting the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen of the Diocese of Newfoundland, shall consist of all monies paid to the Treasurer of the Society for that object.

2.—The Committee of the Church Society shall have the management of the Fund.

3.—Every Hundred Pounds of available surplus shall be invested by the Committee as opportunities occur. Smaller sums shall be deposited every quarter in the Savings' Bank.

4.—All Clergymen in the Diocese holding the Bishop's license may secure the benefit of this Fund by contributing within six months from the time of obtaining their License from the Bishop as follows:—
(1) Unmarried Clergymen and Widowers without a child, one pound (£1) per annum: (2) Married Clergymen (and such as shall afterwards become married,) and Widowers with a child, two pounds (£2) per annum.

5.—Annual subscriptions shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January in each year:—provided that Clergymen on entry shall for that year pay only

a rateable proportion of the annual subscription up to first day of January following. Thirty days grace shall be allowed, but every Clergyman, neglecting to make payment within that time, shall forfeit his claim upon the Fund to be recovered only upon payment of arrears, with ten per cent. thereon, before the following first day of January.

6.—Any Clergyman neglecting to subscribe according to Rule 4, or to pay his annual subscription within the time limited by Rule 5, may, if the Committee see fit to admit or re-admit him, secure the benefit of the Fund by the payment of two pounds ten shillings (£2 10) if married or a widower with a child; and one pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) if unmarried or a widower without a child, from the day on which the last annual subscription he paid was due, or from the date of his being licensed by the Bishop, and from the date of such admission, or re-admission, he shall come under the operation of Rule 4.

7.—Every Clergyman securing the benefit of this Fund will be required to make a yearly collection for the same in his Mission, and to forward the amount with his own annual subscription to the Treasurer.

8.—The Widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid his annual subscription, and forwarded an annual collection, till his death, or till incapacitated by mental or bodily infirmity, shall be entitled to receive a yearly Pension of thirty pounds (£30) currency, during widowhood.

9.—If the Fund should at any time permit, the Committee may increase the amount of Pension to any sum not exceeding £50; such an addition, however, being subject to be withdrawn wholly or in part, should the state of the Fund not warrant its continuance.

10.—If the Widow die or marry again, the Pension shall be paid to Trustees for the benefit of such Children of the deceased husband, as may be, if boys, under sixteen, if girls, under eighteen years of age.

11.—The Trustees named by a deceased Clergyman, in the event of the death or marriage of his Widow, shall be recognized by the Committee in paying the Pension for the benefit of the child or children; but if the Trustees so named are unwilling or unable to act, the Bishop of the Diocese shall act as Trustee in the application of the Pension.

12.—If the wife die before her husband, his child or children shall receive the Pension, so long as there is a claimant under Rule ten.

13.—The Pensions shall be paid half yearly by the Bishop's order on the Treasurer on the first of January and first of July. The first payment to be calculated for the interval from the husband's death to the day of payment.

14.—If a Clergyman, having joined the fund after the 24th June, 1863, removes from the Diocese after having served less than fourteen years, his connection with the fund shall cease, and he shall be entitled to receive back half the amount of the annual subscriptions he has paid. If he removes after having served fourteen years and less than twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of six pounds, or nine pounds if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back half his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. If he removes after having served twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of five pounds, or seven pounds ten shillings if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back three-fourths of his annual sub-

scriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. All Clergymen in connection with the Fund previous to the 24th June, 1863, to be governed by the original Rule 14 thereof.

15.—A yearly statement of the Treasurer's accounts with this Fund shall be published with the Society's Report.

16.—None of the above Rules shall be altered, or repealed, except at a general meeting of the Church Society, and after a full years notice to the members of the proposed change.

"The following is the original Rule 14, governing Clergymen in connection with the Fund before June 24, 1863.

14.—If a Clergyman removes, with the Bishop's consent, from the Diocese, after officiating in it not less than seven years, he shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund, on the payment of an annual subscription of three pounds (£3); or, if he desire it, may receive back half the amount he has paid; which repayment shall release the Fund from all his claims upon it."
